**NATIONAL** Wall Street is taking another hit amid investor worries about rising interest rates and the global economy. Caterpillar and Apple fueled losses for the Dow Jones Industrial Average, which was down more than 300 points.

**MICHIGAN** According to a new study, Michigan residents are at a higher risk than residents of other states for identity theft. Wallethub's new study examined ten key metrics to determine where in America had the highest amount of identity theft.

**LANSING** Passengers on Amtrak will not be able to buy tickets from a person at the station in East Lansing starting later this month. Effective Oct. 29, there will no longer be a staffed ticket window.

**NATIONAL** The search continues for more than 100 people who remain missing after the deadly Camp Fire in northern California. According to the Butte County Sheriff's office, there's no exact count because the figure is constantly changing.

**MICHIGAN** A former UAW official charged in a bribery conspiracy with Fiat-Chrysler officials has been sentenced. Virdell King was the first African-American woman ever elected to lead a local union chapter.

**LANSING** Lansing Police are looking for a woman who was reported missing from the Moores Park neighborhood. 45-year-old Shalyn Manson was last seen early Wednesday morning. She was wearing a long black coat, a hat, and boots.

**NATIONAL** A tornado is getting the blame for damaging about 50 buildings Tuesday in Port Orchard, Washington. Trees were uprooted and tossed into homes and roofs were ripped from their buildings.

**MICHIGAN** Michigan State Police have a man in custody who made threats to Selfridge Air National Guard Base. They were informed that someone threatened to shoot up the base and personnel there on Sunday.

**LANSING** The former Michigan State University President who pleaded not guilty on charges of lying to investigators about Larry Nassar was due in court Tuesday. Lou Anna Simon is free on bond after being arraigned on charges of lying to a peace officer.

**Huron Co:** During final planning commission comment, at the Huron County Planning Commission meeting Wednesday night county Building and Zoning Director Jeff Smith invited wind turbine noise complainant Robert Gaffke to sign a permission slip to conduct noise testing on his property, as part of the complaint resolution effort.

Sept. 25, the Huron County Board of Commissioners suspended action on hiring ABD Engineering & Design to test at three sites that were the sources of noise complaints.

**Huron Co:** The Huron Community Fair Board wants to be kept in the loop when it comes to the construction of a new Huron County Expo Center.

So does the Huron County Board of Commissioners.

**HARBOR BEACH** — The Harbor Beach City Council moved to help stop a potentially dangerous situation at the local school.

Action from the council came at the request of Harbor Beach Police Chief Todd Bucholtz after he received a letter from the school.

The letter requested to have signs prohibiting parking between 7:15 and 8 a.m. and 2:30 and 3:15 p.m. on school days.

During council's meeting, Harbor Beach Mayor Gary Booms told the audience that parents are supposed to unload children north of the bus loop in front of the old two story building.

**Huron Co** — County planners heard from a wind turbine representative this week regarding a recent blade failure.

During Wednesday's Huron County Planning Commission meeting, Blake Shroll, site manager of Big Turtle Wind Farm, told planners Big Turtle II experienced a failure on Tower 14 Nov. 28.

He said the company is also in the process of obtaining equipment and replacement parts to be mobilized to the site.

**HARBOR BEACH** — Numerous changes were approved to the Harbor Beach Farmers Market this week.

Some of the changes had been discussed at a former meeting, but they became official at Monday's meeting.

The 2019 farmers market dates of operation will be May 24 through Oct. 11. The market is scheduled to run each Friday from 2 to 6 p.m., and venders will be allowed to start their set-up as early as noon each Friday
