At last month's meeting of the Vincennes Urban Enterprise association, the board approved the pocket park to be done in four phases. The first two phases include installing restrooms and paving the area for the park which will be located next to the Pantheon Theatre on Main Street.

A program at the First Church of God in Monroe City is one of five non-profits to receive a grant from the Indianapolis Power and Light Company.

The IPL Power Grants have awarded 75,000 dollars to 23 different Indiana groups, five of which are from southern Indiana. The organizations were nominated by IPL employees. They're given for community enhancement, economic development, education and environment, and arts and culture.

The Lawrenceville-Bridgeport Water Feud is over. At Thursday's meeting of the Lawrenceville City Council, Mayor Don Wagner announced the two sides had reached a compromise.

In a recent meeting, the two city mayors and council members sat down and talked about the issue pertaining to who provides water to the department of corrections and whose pipes it goes through. The two sides had previously been at odds over the issue, however with the election of Wagner and the federal case pending against former Bridgeport Mayor Max Schauf, the two sides were able to come to an agreement.

(Backpack giveaway) (Monday 7/15/13 ... tlz 6a)

A national backpack giveaway is coming to Vincennes on August third. The Cellular Connection will join with Verizon to donate the backpacks, and school supplies, to kids in need. The supplies include pencils, paper, a pencil box, folders, glue, and more.

The Knox County Commissioners have approved a move to close to traffic parts of several rarely-used secondary roads. The roads to be closed include parts of Beaver Road, Cowpath Road, Deacon's Road, Dunkerly Road, Field Road, Gun Club Road, Township Line Road, Hazleton Road, Homestead Road, Lost Road, Oil Field Road, Palmyra Road, Patrick Road, and part of North Ninth Street Road near Monroe City.

(Skelton-- Medal of Freedom) (Tuesday 7/16/13 ... tlz 6a)

A committee is being formed to collect testimony to nominate Red Skelton for the Presidential Medal of Freedom. The R-S-M-P-F Committee is collecting testimonial letters as part of a year-long effort to get Skelton nominated for the nation's highest civilian honor. The effort is part of a local celebration of the 100th anniversary of Skelton's birth in Vincennes.

(Pool groundbreak set) (Monday 7/22/13 ... tlz 6a)

Groundbreaking for the Rainbow Beach Family Aquatic Center is set for Wednesday, July 31st at Rainbow Beach's location at Gregg Park. The long-awaited redevelopment of Rainbow Beach will be financed by over three-million dollars in bonds.

Sewer Superintendent Bruce Laslie told the council he'd located a blower for the aeration tanks at the plant and also an EPA mandated machine called a composite sampler that takes readings of the water at the plant.

Mayor Don Wagoner is asking city departments to tighten their belts and making suggestions on how they can do it. A memo sent between Wagner and Police Chief Mike Mefford with a list of suggestions was a sore spot at the meeting, however, Wagner was not going to discuss it at a public meeting.

(Planning Committee) (8-10-13...JT 6a.)

The Lawrenceville City Council Voted to allow the Lawrenceville Long Term Planning Committee to contract with an Indianapolis Company to come up with a long term economic growth plan for the city.

Committee Chair Roxanne Schultz came before the board to formally ask permission to hire Ratio Architects from Indianapolis to help come up with the plan. The committee has secured a 100 thousand dollar grant to pay for the process so no city money will be used to pay.

(Life After Meth) (8-15-13...Jt 6a.)

The Knox County Jail's Life After Meth program is looking to expand and The Knox County Council agreed to help.

Reverend Peter Haskins asked the Knox County Council for 35-thousand dollars to help establish a men's transition house and also to hire another LAM worker. Council member Nichole Like was outspoken in her support for the program. She said helping out is a no-brainer

(Pet Port On Call Hours) (Saturday 8-17-13...JT 6a.)

At the end of Thursday's budget hearings, the budget committee discussed on call procedure for the Pet Port.

Due to the Affordable Care Act, the city has to keep all part time employees at 29 hours or under. City Council member and Budget Committee Chair Scott Brown said even after only one occurrence of an overage, the city could be

During Vincennes City Budget hearings earlier this week, Vincennes Police Chief Dusty Luking asked for 70 thousand dollars for police cruiser upgrades. Not Included in that are the dash cameras that police cars are normally outfitted with.

Expanded Drug Testing at LHS (for 8 20 13)

There will be more random drug testing at Vincennes Lincoln High School this year. The school board approved the expanded testing within a new student handbook adoption. An outside firm will be used to randomize the students tested and to actually do the testing.

(Comm-- precinct change approval) (Tuesday 8/20/13 ... tlz 6a)
The Knox County Commissioners gave the final go-ahead for a proposed change of precincts in the City of Vincennes. The change will downsize the current 16 precincts in the City of Vincennes to twelve. It also moves the boundaries to represent population movement in Vincennes over the last 30 years.
Vincennes City Councilman T-J Brink was the man behind a re-districted twelve-precinct model for the City of Vincennes. He says the next step is informing everyone where they will vote, starting in May of 2014.

(NK - Budget) (8-21-13.JT 6a.)

A drop in funding is expected for the North Knox School Corporation's 2014 budget.

Superintendent Darrell Bobe explained that the corporation's total budget for next year will be around 8 million 784 thousand dollars. That number is 75-thousand dollars less than what the corporation got in 2013. Bobe says the drop in funding is difficult to deal with.

Bids were awarded for the construction of the new North Knox Auxiliary Gym last night, despite a hiccup with the low bidder's bid.

The new Rainbow Beach Family Aquatic Center will be constructed following complete demolition. Pool construction company RenoSys will start by tearing down the bath houses, and moving out from there. The demolition is expected to take around two weeks to complete.

(Three injured in accident) (Monday 8/26/13 ... tlz 6a)

Three people were injured-- and one seriously-- following a two-car accident yesterday in Vincennes at Main Street and Ramsey Road.

The accident happened when the vehicle driven by 31 year-old Taylor Martin collided with a vehicle driven by a 16 year-old girl. Officers have not released the girl's name at this time.

(Bicknell Festival -- honors) (Thursday 8/29/13 ... tlz 6a)
The Bicknell Kiwanis Club named the annual Bicknell Man and Woman of the Year
last night at North Knox Primary School in Bicknell. The naming was part of the
ceremonies around the annual Bicknell Heritage Labor Day Festival Queen contest.
Bicknell First Baptist Church pastor Seth Alexander was named Bicknell's Man of
the Year. A nomination letter spelled out his service-- not only to his church,
but to residents of Bicknell as a whole. The Woman of the Year is current
Bicknell Clerk-Treasurer Becky McGlone. Her nomination letter cited her

The Vincennes City Council gathered as a Committee of the Whole yesterday to review the 2014 City budget. Council reviewed the document with an eye toward saving money in the budget's final draft.

One issue Council discussed at length was a reduction of part-time hours in the City's Animal Control department. Department director Terri Barmes offered to extend her on-call hours, for an increased base salary equal to her actual pay last year.

Vincennes City Councilman Scott Brown heads the Council Budget and Finance Committee. He says the idea will keep Animal Control part-time employees below a 29 hour a week cap.

(Daviess drug arrests) (Thursday 9/5/13 ... tlz 6a)

Federal agents have arrested eight people-- including five Washington residents-- on federal drug and money-laundering charges. Daviess County Sheriff's officials started the investigation, and called in the Indiana State Police, and federal D-E-A agents to help in the investigation. The investigation turned up two pounds of crystal meth, and an unknown amount of marijuana and cash.

Three Washington residents-- 42 year-old Alan Marshall, 34 year-old Marcus Newson, and 43 year-old James Coy-- are charged with conspiracy to distribute over 500 grams of methamphetamine. Two others were also charged with the meth-dealing count-- 41 year-old Christopher Kimmons of Coldwater, Mississippi, and 26 year-old Antoin (AN-twan) Alston, of Long Beach, California. All five Authorities are seeking a sixth suspect-- 43 year-old David Merritt. Merritt's address is unknown.

Sheriff Morris made his request to the Knox County Council as part Council's annual budget hearings.

The Knox County Council spent last night finalizing the numbers for each department's budget for 2014. The final 2014 Knox County budget will total around eight million dollars.

Council president Steve Thais says as in recent years, the final budget will contain raises for each County department. For 2014, the raises will be a flat one-thousand dollar increase for full-time employees, and 500 dollars for part-timers.

He said all information he's had indicated higher scores for the school, especially when compared to the significant improvements the VCSC Elementary schools had. Parsley said something just wasn't right.

The Vincennes Parks Board heard an update last night on progress in the demolition of the old Rainbow Beach. The pool is being demolished in favor of a new Rainbow Beach Family Aquatic Center.
