Helton stepped down from Vincennes University following an eleven-year term as University president, from 2004 to 2015.

Governor Bruce Rauner is declaring 11 more Illinois counties state disaster areas.

Among them are Lawrence and Richland Counties.
They bring the total number of state disaster areas to 23.

The Vincennes City Police Department is hoping to bring a couple of new officers onto the force sometime early this year. Vincennes City Police Chief Dusty Luking says the Department needs a couple of officers to get back to full strength.

After a slow start, the Knox County Salvation Army reported a strong finish to exceed its goal in the kettle campaign. Knox County Salvation Army commander Curtis Lunnum credited a strong last two weeks before Christmas to reverse the slow beginning to the annual kettle campaign.

The Vincennes City Council approved two separate ordinances last night to correct three salary ordinance errors. Council members unanimously suspended the rules, and passed the corrections on all three readings last night.

The first ordinance adds the part of the salary paid to both the Vincennes Mayor and Clerk-Treasurer's salaries from the City's Utility Services Board. The second ordinance adds the U-S-B amount to the salary of the City Engineer.

The "One plus Three" program allows Early College students from Perry Meridian to graduate high school with a one-year general studies certificate from V-U. Those credits will give students a one-year head start toward a degree at the University of Indianapolis. The agreement was announced yesterday in a conference at Perry Meridian High School.

(GSH-- National Heart Month) (Monday 2/1/16 ... tlz 6a)

This is National Heart Month, and Good Samaritan Hospital is offering various services throughout the month.

The Hospital will provide free stroke and heart-related screenings. The next free stroke screening will happen tomorrow from nine a-m to three p-m in the Hospital's Eva Hill Auditorium.

(Coco-- contested May election) (Monday 2/1/16 ... tlz 6a)

At least one Knox County election will be contested in the May primary, as Mike Thompson has filed for another term for Knox County Council At-Large. Thompson joins fellow incumbent Council Democrats Tim Crowley and Brian Downen, and challenger Tom Peters, in contesting the Democrat nomination for the three seats available in the May primary.

(Three arrested on Countereit charges) (Friday 2/5/16 ... tlz 6a)

An investigation has led to the arrest of three people late yesterday afternoon on fraud charges.

The investigation started with a counterfeiting complant from a Bruceville business. A search warrant led authorities to a home in Bruceville, where they claim to have found evidence of counterfeiting. The arrest happened around five-30 yesterday afternoon.

(B'nell-- stormwater grant) (Tuesday 2/9/16 ... tlz 6a)

The Bicknell City Council has approved the use of 150-thousand dollars in match money for an 870-thousand dollar stormwater project. The project will allow a major stormwater drainage upgrade for the City of Bicknell. The grant is being administered by the Southern Indiana Development Corporation.

(Vectren-- gas line work) (Tuesday 2/9/16 ... tlz 6a)

Vectren gas crews have announced future plans to improve gas mains and service lines in several Vincennes locations. The projects will happen throughout the weeks and months to come.

Vectren officials will do the work on Main Street between Third and Sixth Streets; Old Wheatland Road from Sixth Street to Plumtree Drive; and Washington Avenue from the U-S 41 overpass to Forest Hills Drive. Also, work will happen on Bentley Road, Alexander Drive, and Pineview Drive. Finally, Vectren will replace the gas lines in an entire area bounded by Willow Street, Bayou Street, 13th Street, and 18th Street.

(CoCo-- Umbaugh long range plan) (Wednesday 2/10/16 .. tlz 6a)

The Knox County Council is considering a contract with Umbaugh and Associates to set up a long-range financial plan for Knox County. If

Council approves the contract, Umbaugh will determine spending trends, and set the county up with projections for the coming three years.

(China Buffet Fire Cause Ruled as Undetermined) (Wednesday, 2/10/16 ... tlz 6a)

Investigators have officially ruled the cause of a fire at the China Buffet on Sixth Street in Vincennes as undetermined. Indiana State Fire Marshal's office officials say the fire is still under investigation..

The fire started in a utility room of the restaurant. The utility room contained electric panels, a water heater, and various bulk food containers.

(Charlton murder-- official charges filed) (Wednesday, 2/10/16 ... tlz 6a)

Knox County Prosecutor Dirk Carnahan has filed a probable cause information on 39 year-old Candice Charlton. Charlton is charged with murder in the Friday night stabbing death of 30 year-old Gerald Sturgeon. Sturgeon was stabbed in the back in what is being called a domestic dispute; he was taken to Good Samaritan Hospital, where he died around an hour later.

(Sturgeon homicide -- Morris reax) (Friday 2/12/16 ... tlz 6a)

Knox County Sheriff's deputies continue to investigate the February fifth death of Gerald Sturgeon at a Short Street home in Wheatland. Sturgeon died from a stab wound to his back; 30 year-old Candice Charlton is accused of murder in his death.

(L'ville Citco-- Grant denial) (Monday 2/15/16 ... tlz 6a)

The City of Lawrenceville has been turned down for an infrastructure grant from the Illinois Department of Commerce. The City wanted the grant to repair old water lines on both Eighth Street and Tenth Street.

(ISP-- Dugger man arrested) (Tuesday 2/16/16 ... tlz 6a)

Indiana State Police arrested a rural Dugger man yesterday after serving a search warrant on a residence on Sullivan County Road 200 South.

State Police served the warrant on a home occupied by 38 year-old Benjamin Willey. State Police started investigating Willey following a request earlier this month from the Sullivan County Department of Child Services.

VCSC Building Plans Approved - for 2 23 16 - mrl

The Vincennes Community School Board has approved the renovation project for all four elementary schools. Bonds totaling up to \$40 Million will be sold in phases over the next three years. The first bids will be awarded this May. According to Superintendent Greg Parsley, taxes will not rise to pay for the project because other debt has been and will be repaid before the new bonds are all bought. The project will begin this summer with refurbishing at Riley Elementary and exterior work including improvements to traffic flow at all four buildings. Riley students and employees will be displaced for at least the first semester of next school year.

(KC Council -- preparing for future) (Thursday 2/25/16 ... tlz 6a)

The Knox County Council is looking at lowered revenues for the years to come. Property tax caps and other reductions in revenue have caused Council to seek a long-range financial plan to weather the difficulties.

(Ellspermann's last day) (Thursday 3/3/16 ... NI/tlz 6a)

Yesterday ended the three-year term of Sue Ellspermann as Indiana's Lieutenant Governor. Ellspermann's resignation of the position became effective late yesterday afternoon. Ellspermann and Governor Pence announced last month she'd step down to focus on her application to be Ivy Tech's next president.

(Grabbe-Utley Scholarship) (Thursday 3/3/16 ... tlz 6a)

North Knox High School senior Molly Earhart has been named as one of the winners of Vincennes University's Grabbe-Utley scholarships. Earhart received her scholarship award last night in a ceremony at North Knox High School. The Bicknell native Earhart will study nursing at Vincennes University.

Washington Police say a Washington man was stabbed multiple

times during a fight Friday afternoon in an alley across from the Hydrant Bar

and Grill on West Walnut Street.
21-year-old Jacob Bowling was taken to Good Samaritan

Hospital in Vincennes where he is in serious, but stable condition.

(Sheriff-- Vigo inmates) (Wednesday, 3/9/16 ... tlz 6a)

The Knox County Jail has become a busier place recently, with the transfer of 51 Vigo County inmates into the general population. The Vigo County inmates are being held in Knox County due to overcrowding in the Vigo County Jail. Knox County Sheriff Mike Morris says the inmates are being held at a rate of 35 dollars per day. The extra Vigo County offenders mean the Knox County Jail is bringing in just under 18-hundred dollars extra per day.

(CoCo-- Public Defender changes) (Wednesday 3/9/16 ... tlz 6a)

The Knox County Council is seeking ways to drastically reduce spending in the Knox County Public Defender program. The County's program has been flagged by the State of Indiana as one of the state's most inefficient.

The Public Defender program spent over a million dollars last year. Council president Bob Lechner says Council and the County's justice system has to reduce the cost of the County's public defender program.

UEA Board Meets - for 3 9 16 - mrl

The Vincennes Urban Enterprise Association Board approved one grant request, tabled one, and offered advice to a third person seeking help from the group. Judy Kratzner received One Thousand Dollars to help with repairs to the façade of her building at 418 Main. The money represents twenty percent of the cost of the project. John Chung (Chang) came before the board and asked for guidance about how to proceed toward getting an application ready to ask for the association's help with the former Morone's building at 2nd and Busseron.

(Bicknell meth arrest) (Friday 3/11/16 ... tlz 6a)

Bicknell City Police arrested a Bicknell woman this morning after following her to her residence on White River Avenue.

The proposal would raise water rates by 65 percent, and sewer rates by 42 percent. The proposed increase would raise the average water rate for Vincennes residents from \$14.52 per month to \$23.95 per month. The average sewer rate would increase from \$33.56 to \$47.61 per month. Under the new water and sewer proposal, the combined Vincennes water and sewer bill would total \$71.56 a month-- up from the current average cost of \$48.07.

The Vincennes Redevelopment Commission has approved up to 315-thousand dollars in funding for Vincennes' Four Lakes Park. City Parks Department superintendent Steve Beamon requested the funding for massive improvements to the park.

The Way of the Cross Walk is a devotional prayer remembering the 14 stations along Jesus' journey from Pilate's condemnation to His burial.

Blackhawk Mining Sells Freelandville Operations

Hallador Energy Company announced Tuesday its wholly owned subsidiary, Sunrise Coal, LLC, has completed the purchase of certain underground coal reserves and a coal sales agreement associated with Triad Mining, LLC's Freelandville, Indiana mining complex.

Triad is a wholly owned subsidiary of Blackhawk Mining, LLC based in Lexington, Kentucky.

Governor Pence Signs Road Funding Bill Into Law Jds 3-24-16

Governor Mike Pence signed a couple of bills Wednesday that will provide slightly more than \$800 million

in new road spending over the next two years.

Local governments receive \$576 million over two years and about \$100 million a year after that.

State roads and bridges receive about \$228 million in new funding over two years.

The measures - House Bill 1001 and Senate Bill 67 - also include \$42 million in funding for the governor's Regional Cities Initiative, \$10 million for scholarships for prospective educators and \$29 million to fund a 13th annual pension check for retired public employees.

(VPD-- Stolen auto chase) (Thursday 3/24/16 ... tlz 6a)

Knox County Sheriff's deputies arrested two people yesterday following a chase that ended near U-S 41 just south of Vincennes.

The chase began when Sheriff's officials tried to stop an orange Mustang reported stolen earlier in the day. The car's driver drove into a private field behind the Knox County Sheriff's Department, and got stuck on a fence near U-S 41.

(Lilly winners announced) (Friday 3/25/16 ... tlz 6a)

North Knox High School senior Bridget Brocksmith has been announced as the 2016 Lilly Scholarship award winner. Brocksmith is the daughter of William and Jo Anne Brocksmith of Oaktown.

Bridget plans to attend an un-named Indiana college to study agriculture and medicine. She plans to be agricultural economist and surgeon. Brocksmith was selected as the award winner from an original total of eleven Knox County Lilly Scholarship applications.

(Public hearing for rate increase) (Monday 3/28/16 ... tlz 6a)

An April Eleventh public hearing has been set for response to a proposed rate increase for Vincennes Utilities customers.

This evening, Vincennes City Council will hear a rate increase ordinance on first reading only. Council will NOT take public comments at this evening's session, but will hear from Vincennes Utilities general manager Kirk bouchie. Bouchie will lay out the reason behind the proposed increase, and answer questions from Council members.

VCSC Moves Forward on School Work - for 3 29 16 - mrl

No one from the public spoke for or against renovations planned for the four Vincennes Elementary Schools at a public hearing last night. The board then approved papers allowing the borrowing of up to \$38 Million dollars over the next few years to work on the four elementary sites. School superintendent Greg Parsley says the project is needed and will not increase taxes for property owners within the school district.

(Rate increase introduction) (Tuesday 3/29/16 ... tlz 6a)

Vincennes City Council passed a proposed water and sewer rate increase for Vincennes Utilities on first reading last night. The rate increase is needed for the purchase of over 19-million dollars in bonds for various water and sewer projects. Council also approved the water and sewer bond proposal last night on first reading.

(BPW-- Kimmel Title Sheet) (Wednesday 3/29/16 ... tlz 6a)

The Vincennes Board of Works has signed the title sheet for the Kimmel Road extension project. Vincennes City Engineer John Sprague expects project bids to be opened at the second City Board of Works session in April. The bids would be advertised for two weeks prior to the bid opening.

Some things will stay the same and some will change at Good Samaritan Hospital. CEO Rob McLin received a one year extension on his contract at last night's Board meeting and long time Board member Maridell Sargent announced her retirement from the Board at the end of this June.
