(City-- comprehensive plan) (Thursday 6/28/18 ... tlz 6a)

Concerned citizens and Vincennes officials gathered yesterday at City Hall for the first meeting toward a new Comprehensive Plan. Last night's session was s step toward the first update of the City of Vincennes' plan since 2012. (Issue: Public awareness and improvement)

Vincennes Bans Glass from Recycling Program jds 6-28-18 12n (updated 6/29)

The City of Vincennes says beginning July 2nd, the city's curbside recycling program will no longer pick up glass.

The city says the processor of the city's recycling material will no longer accept glass. (Issue: Community awareness and information)

(Knox County accreditation) (Friday 6/29/18 ... tlz 6a)

The Vincennes based Children and Family Services Corporation has received a Gold Seal of Approval for Behavioral Health Care Accredition. The honor was presented by the federal health care group the Joint Commission. (Issue: public awareness and interest)

(Citco-- Landscape Ordinance) (Tuesday 7/10/18 ... tlz 6a)

The Vincennes City Council approved updates to the City's Landscape ordinance at last night's session. Council's Recreation, Tourism, and Public Areas Committee brought the issue to the full Council. The vote for the changes was five-two, with Councilmen Tim

Salters and Brian Grove voting against it. (Issue: Public awareness and general public interest)



(SK-- Title One application) (Thursday 7/12/18 ... tlz 6a)

The South Knox School Board has approved the Corporation's application for South Knox Elementary's Title One program. The application covers a grant amount of nearly 84-thousand dollars.

The grant will cover the salary for a Title One teacher and most of the salary for an assistant. (Issue: Education and public interest)

Loogootee Police arrested a 71-year-old Loogootee man Friday for Possession of Child Pornography.
