About fifty people listened to Superintendent Greg Parsley explain options for improving elementary buildings. Almost all include repurposing Riley from an elementary to a specialized educational facility.

The Vincennes Board of Works has approved closing part of Main Street May 29th as part of a dual ribbon-cutting. That day will mark the grand opening of both the new Pioneer Oil headquarters, and the Vincennes Pocket Park.

The Vincennes City Police Department is asking for the public's help in investigating the death of Christopher Melton. The 55 year-old Melton was found dead Saturday morning at his residence at 810 North Sixth Street. City Police labeled the death as a homicide, after an autopsy found Melton died of a gunshot wound to his head.
