A total of 150 area coal miners will be affected by cut-backs at three Sunrise Coal-based mines in the area.

Sunrise Coal spokeswoman Susan Jaworski says the largest number -103 jobs- will be cut at the Oaktown Black Panther mine.

43 more jobs will be cut at Sunrise's Carlisle Mine, with four layoffs at Sunrise's Ace in the Hole mine in Clay City.

When the first nine weeks is finished at the Vincennes Community Schools, parents and students will see a big change in how grades are reported.




