(41 blocked for Presidential visit)(Thursday 10/2/14 ... tlz 4p)

Indiana State Police remind everyone part of U-S 41 will be blocked this afternoon, due to the Presidential visit to Princeton. The affected part of U-S 41 stretches from State Road 57 near Evansville to State Road 67 at Princeton.

(Pence to Talk Health with President)(Thursday 10/3/14 ... tlz 6a)

Governor Mike Pence has requested a meeting with President Barack Obama during his trip to Southwest Indiana. Pence wants to discuss the Healthy Indiana Plan 2.0 with the President, along with its pending application with the U-S Department of Health.

(Vincennes budget)(Friday 10/5/14 ... tlz 6a)

The City of Vincennes will wait until early next year for approval of its budget numbers from the Indiana Department of Local Government Fnance. The City of awaiting word on possible mandated cuts from the state's D-L-G-F.

Milling and resurfacing is taking place on Hart Street between Third and 15th Streets in Vincennes. Traffic will be reduced to one lane, and will be directed by flaggers.

The Vincennes Board of Works has approved levee time extensions for Banning Engineering. The time extensions are on two projects funded by an Indiana state grant.

(RDC-- Ribbon cutting)(Thursday 10/16/14... tlz 6a)

A public ceremony will be held this Tuesday to kick off work on the Second Street project. The project will improve Second Street from Main to Hart Streets in and near downtown Vincennes.

(Early Vote Rally)(Monday 10/20/14 ... tlz 6a)

The Indiana Republican statewide team hosted an early vote rally in Vincennes as part of their "Experience and Transparency" bus tour. Any registered voter wishing to vote early will be asked to present a valid photo ID issued by the State of Indiana.

The Bicknell City Council has joined the Vincennes City Council in passing the point one-five percent jail replacement tax. County Council members say at the end of the year, enough money will have been been collected to pay off the current Jail.

(Hampsch arrested)(Saturday 11/1/14 ... ah 6a)

A former Vincennes youth pastor already charged with felony sexual misconduct in Knox County has now been arrested on a Madison County warrant. 34 year-old Derrick "Duke" Hampsch has been charged with sexual misconduct with a minor in Anderson.

(Early voting recap)(Monday 11/4/18 ... tlz 6a)

Early voting has ended. The next voting to happen will be for tomorrow's Election Day. The deadline for early ballots ended at noon today.

(VU- NASA grant)(Monday 11/4/18 ... tlz 6a)

Vincennes University will receive grant funding from NASA. The funding is part of 17-million dollars given out by NASA's National Space Agency and Fellowship program.

(Election voting locations)(Tuesday 11/5/14 ... tlz 6a)

Vincennes voters are headed to the polls in the City's new 12-precinct configuration. This is the first election for the previous 16 Vincennes City precincts to be reduced to 12.

Two new judges have taken control of two Knox County courts. Gara Lee won the Knox Superior Court One judgeship with 53 percent of the vote over Bryan Jewel, and Ryan Johanningsmeier took the seat in Knox Superior Court Two, with 57 percent of the vote in a win over John Sievers.

Many Knox County schools made good marks in the A to F rankings from the Indiana Department of Education. Vincennes Schools were one short of all making A's on the state evaluation.

Vincennes City Councli ,members talked trash at City Hall-- including an ordinance to discontinue the City's trash collection altogether. A motion will be made to privatize the trash collection through Republic Services.
