Some Vincennes students got a fun fire education session ysterday from a retired Indianapolis fireman. Jeff Owens brought the KASEY program to both Vincennes Lincoln's Ader Auditorium, and Flaget Elementary, in separate sessions throughout the day.

Knox County Council and Commissioners Forum Jds/tl 10-7-16

A public forum will be held later this month for Knox County Council and Commissioner Candidates.

The forum will be held Tuesday, October 25th at the Knox County Public Library Fortnightly Building at 421 North 6th Street,

County Council candidates will speak at 6:30 PM followed by the County Commissioner candidates at 7:30.

(SK--SPARTA project update) (Tuesday 10/11/16 ... tlz 6a) (SPARTA story "A")

The South Knox School Board has approved various necessary steps to

start work toward funding the SPARTA renovation project. The 15-point-115 million dollar project is set for construction bids in February. The steps allow the oversight of a South Knox Building Corporation, sets up project financing, and allows for a lease agreement by the School Board with the Building Corporation.

The Vincennes City Council is scheduled to finalize re-zoning this evening on property occupied by an old grain elevator. The property is located on First Street between Busseron and Broadway.

The rezoning is needed for potential construction of a three-story mixed use structure. The re-zoning would move the affected area from I-1 Industrial zoning to C-2 commercial.

26-year-old Lance Z. Marley was originally charged with voluntary manslaughter. However, his charge was upgraded to murder during a court appearance yesterday in Gibson County.

The incident was reported on Sunday at a South Fourth Street home in Princeton. Court documents allege Marley had stabbed Fleck multiple times during the incident. Officials say Fleck died from massive blood loss; police report finding various knives allegedly used in the incident inside the home.

Two of the three Commissioners' positions will be up for election today in Knox County. The District One seat is held by incumbent Democrat Don Halter; he faces Republican Tim Ellerman. The other seat up for grabs is District Two, as incumbent Larry Holscher faces challenger Trent Hinkle.

Vincennes City and Knox County Police will increase patrols for the Thanksgiving season. The increased enforcement period will run from Veterans' Day on Friday through December fourth.

The increased enforcement will focus on both drinking and driving, and seat belt enforcement. The increased enforcement may include saturation patrols, checkpoints, and seat belt enforcement related patrols.

The extra patrolling is funded by a statewide grant provided by the Indiana Criminal Justice Institute.

(SK Board-- Edwards wins) (Wednesday 11/9/16 ... tlz 6a)

Michael Edwards was named to the South Knox School Board in an election day victory over Tony Mahan. Edwards picked up 61 percent of the vote in victory on Election Day.

Edwards believes in the end, the voters selected his vision for the South Knox School District over Mahan's.

(Comm-- Republicans sweep) (Wednesday 11/9/16 ... tlz 6a)

Both Knox County Republican challengers defeated Democrat incumbents in yesterday's Knox County Commissioners' races.

Former Knox County Council president Tim Ellerman defeated Don Halter for the Commissioners' District One seat by 49 votes. Halter was leading by ten votes with one precinct left, but Ellerman's home precinct of Harrison Township gave him the votes he needed to win.

The voters of Indiana have elected Lieutenant Governor Eric Holcomb to be the next Indiana Governor. Holcomb will replace Mike Pence-- who was elected Vice-President with yesterday's Presidential victory by Donald Trump.

Holcomb beat Democrat challenger JOhn Gregg, with 51 percent of the vote to Gregg's 45 percent. Libertarian Rex Bell received three percent of the vote.

The Vincennes Board of Works has approved a curb cut along Oliphant Drive for a new floodgate storage building. The building will hold floodgates that are normally put in place in case of high water on the nearby Wabash River. Vincennes University will oversee the architecture and construction of the structure for the use of the City of Vincennes.

(KC Lib Bd-- New spending limit) (Wednesday 11/16/16 ... tlz 6a)

The Knox County Library Board has approved an adjustment of spending for the Library's executive director between Board meetings from five-thousand to three-thousand dollars. The adjustment is part of an overall revision of the Library's Internal Controls policy. The policy has not been changed since 1998.

The three-thousand dollar amount was approved unanimously, but not until after two other motions were taken off the table.

Seventh Street will be closed starting tomorrow from Main to Buntin Streets. The closing will be the start of repair work on Seventh Street, as part of the Community Crossings grant program.

One of the projects is construction of a parking lot across from the New Moon Theater at Sixth and Main.

(RDC-- Main Street work) (Friday 11/18/16 ... tlz 6a)

The Vincennes Redevelopment Commission has approved over 430-thousand dollars for engineering part of the Main Street project. The spending is for Phase One of the Main Street project; the locally-funded phase is set for physical work in 2018. The engineering part of Phase One-- covered by the R-D-C funds-- will happen throughout 2017.

(Intersection closing re-set) (Tuesday 11/22/16 ... tlz 6a)

The intersection of Oliphant Drive and Red Skelton Boulevard has been re-set for closing starting tomorrow. The closing is weather-permitting; in case of rain, the closure would be moved to Monday, November 28th.

IMPD Officials have announced that one of two people killed in a double murder Thursday Night was from Vincennes.

Around 6 PM on Thursday, IMPD officers were called to a personal injury accident involving 21-year-old Jessica Downey. Downey was shot and was found slumped over the steering wheel when police officers arrived. Downey was taken to Methodist Hospital in Indianapolis where she was pronounced dead yesterday afternoon.

The Vincennes Board of Works has approved the use of City Street crews to place around a hundred bus stop signs across the City of Vincennes. Tim Salters, representing the Vincennes Community School Corporation, requested the signs for the safety of students across the city.

The Vincennes City Council has approved a 50-thousand dollar donation toward a matching grant obligation by the Indiana Military Museum. The Museum is seeking an Indiana Department of Tourism grant toward making part of their warehouse into added exhibit space. With Council's support, Museum officials have raised around 190-thousand dollars toward the 250-thousand dollar match. If the grant application is approved, the Indiana

PACE Community Action Agency is accepting applications now for its Energy Assistance campaign. The effort allows families meeting eligibility qualifications to have some of their heating bill paid through a state grant.

The Kimmel Road extension from Hart Street to Main Street will open to traffic on Wednesday at one p-m.
