James Kaplan may be best known for his definitive biographies of Frank Sinatra – *Frank: The Voice* and *Sinatra: The Chairman*, along with *Irving Berlin: New York Genius*. He's also written scores of essays, stories and reviews for The *New Yorker, New York Times Magazine, Vanity Fair* and others.

Kaplan recounted his first encounter with Miles Davis as a young writer for Vanity Fair and how that experience led to this exploration of the masterpiece album *Kind of Blue* more than three decades later. He talked about focusing on the three creative geniuses associated with the record, how their lives and music were shaped before, during and after the making of this seminal jazz recording.
