Description: This edition of "Inside Art" featured an opinionated survey of San Diego Theater during the year 2022. Longtime print and broadcast theatre critic Pat Launer shared her favorite productions in a year where she saw fewer plays and musicals due to personal issues and the linger effects of the COVID pandemic. She discussed some of the major developments in local theatre over the past year, particularly the sudden closure of San Diego Repertory Theatre after 43 years as one of area's most influential theatrical companies.

Launer explored numerous categories of productions throughout the year – from major regional theaters like the Old Globe and La Jolla Playhouse to smaller, fledgling theatre companies, community theatres and shows from national touring companies. Plus, the many ways theatre artists were continuing to do their work with an extraordinary sense of purpose and innovation as the industry largely returned to live performances after the pandemic.

Also surveyed were some of the memorable performances by individual actors on stages, as well as the best achievements in set design, costuming and direction. Pat observed many of the overall trends in local and national theater during the year and looked ahead to some of the promising plays and musicals that are planned for San Diego audiences in the year ahead, as well as looking back at her consequential 40-year tenure covering local theatre as she approaches retirement at the end of 2022.

Public Interest Issues: The traditional role of theatre in presenting stories reflecting contemporary societal issues. San Diego theatre company's response in 2022 to "White America, We See You," a nationwide challenge by artists of color to increase diversity and opportunity for theatrical artists of color.
