Dubbed the "Savoy King," Webb reigned at Harlem's world-famous Savoy Ballroom, helping launch the Swing Era of the 1930s and the careers of Ella Fitzgerald and Louis Jordan among others. *Rhythm Man: Chick Webb and the Beat that Changed America* published by Oxford University Press is the first comprehensive biography of Webb drawn from previously unpublished materials and years of archival research by Stephanie Stein Crease, whose previous music biographies include *Gil Evans: Out Of The Cool* and *Duke Ellington: His Life in Jazz*.

Stein Crease talked about her initial interest in researching Chic Webb, largely due to the lack of biographical information about the legendary drummer and his influence on jazz. She described Webb's upbringing in Baltimore, his physical challenges and diminished stature due to suffering from childhood polio and how he overcame those challenges to become one of the most celebrated musicians and bandleaders in jazz during his short lifetime.

Public Interest Issues: A story of human and artistic perseverance over physical disabilities. How one musician/bandleader became a best-selling popular artist and his legacy of contributions to medical research and treatment for disabled communities well beyond his life span.
