Speaking with figures like actor/director Robert Redford, comedian Chevy Chase and physicist Neil DeGrasse Tyson, she found an audience and a willing distributor for her program in NPR. Judy also shared the story of her own history in music growing up in Southern California and her continuing evolution as a jazz musician, including the addition of singing and composing to her repertoire.

Neselovskyi shared the themes of his solo album and his successful efforts to raise funds from his recent concerts to support relief efforts in Ukraine.

Description: This edition of "Inside Art" featured performance artist, comedian and playwright Kristina Wong, the first Asian-American Pulitzer Prize finalist for drama for her solo performance piece *Kristina Wong: Sweatshop Overlord.* This *New York Times* Critics' Pick running at La Jolla Playhouse is based on Kristina's pandemic experiences sewing masks out of old bedsheets and bra straps – and organizing the Auntie Sewing Squad, a nationwide work-from-home "sweatshop" of hundreds of volunteers to fix the U.S. public healthcare system while in quarantine. Wong talked about the making of the piece and the many real-life characters and events that are portrayed in her production.

In the second segment, Jazz Producer Dan Atkinson previewed the Athenaeum Music and Arts Library's Fall 2022 jazz season, featuring concerts by the Willie Jones III Quintet, the genre-bending group The Bad Plus and acclaimed Puerto Rican saxophonist Miguel Zenon and his Quartet. Atkinson discussed the music and history of each of the season's artists, how listeners could purchase tickets and shared information about the upcoming Athenaeum's Winter Jazz Series.
