The second segment featured Douglas Kvandal, one of San Diego's most dedicated practitioners of the jazz organ. Kvandal's extensive resume includes many years as a touring artist throughout the country. He's a founding member of Jazz West and the Live Jazz Quartet. Kvandal provided a comprehensive history of the Hammond organ and its unique role in jazz since the 1950s. He demonstrated some of the organ's unique sounds and capabilities and previewed his ongoing trio performances at Duck Foot Brewery and The Jazz Lounge.
