Issues Programs List Quarterly Issues Programs List for Stations KLUB, KIXS, KXTN & KQVT January 1- March 31, 2019

Through on-air announcements that air at various times of the day, KIXS/KLUB/KTXN/KQVT solicits input from Victoria and The Crossroads area in South Texas. Residents at members of our community tell us what concerns they have. From that feedback, we have identified the following as significant issues in our community:

A. Victoria Green Recycling: Updated information from Director of Environmental Services about how global economic factors are impacting Victoria's recycling program.

B. Homeowners Assistance Program: The Texas General Land Office (GLO), through its Community Development and Revitalization program (GLO-CDR) works to rebuild Victoria, Tx communities by putting Texans back in their homes, restoring critical infrastructure and mitigating future damage through resilient community planning.

C. Tips to Stop Car Burglaries: According to data from the police department, more than 400 vehicles were reported burglarized in Victoria from October 2017 to January 2019, and Lt. Eline Moya, of the Victoria Police Dept. said the increase the department has seen in stolen firearms is officials' biggest concern.

D. Victoria Tourism Industry: Victoria's tourism drives a majority of the economy of our region. The City of Victoria works hard to engage residents and tourists to participate in the many activities in our area.

E. Border Security: Information from Victoria County Sheriff's Deputy Zarak Alam about how the federal government gave Victoria County almost \$600,000 to do border security work.

F. Victoria Mayoral Race: Information from The City of Victoria about the four candidates running for election on May 4, 2019.

Section II. Responsive Programs

The stations have broadcast programming dealing with each of the above-referenced issues. Programming dealing with each issue is set out below.

A. Victoria Green Recycling: Broadcast on January 6, January 13, January 20 & January 27 on KLUB/KIXS/KQVT/KTXN

Segment duration (10 minutes) Aired 6:30am-6:40am: This segment featured a discussion with Director of Environmental Services, Darryl Lesek, about environmental services offered to Victoria residents. Services now include curbside recycling, garbage/yard waste collection, large item/tree collection, household hazardous waste collection, air quality research and environmental education.

B. Homeowners Assistance Program: Broadcast on January 6, January 13, January, 20 & January 27 on KLUB/KIXS/KQVT/KTXN

Segment duration (10 minutes) Aired 6:40am-6:50am: Karina Erickson, Press Secretary for the Texas General Land Office was on to discuss Texas Land Commissioner George P. Bush and his Amendment 3 to the \$5.676 billion State Action Plan for Hurricane Harvey for a federally required 30-day public comment period. The amendment details how \$652 million in additional funds, awarded by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development in Amendment 2, will be allocated for programs administered by the Texas General Land Office (GLO).

"Hurricane Harvey devastated the homes and lives of thousands along the Texas Coast. These federal funds are instrumental in the GLO being able to provide housing resources for Texas families recovering from Hurricane Harvey. We continue to work with our partners in communities across the region to leverage these resources efficiently and effectively to benefit Texans affected by Hurricane Harvey."

C. Tips to Stop Car Burglaries: Broadcast on January 6, January 13, January 20, January 27, February 3, February 10, February 17 & February 24 on KLUB/KIXS/KQVT/KTXN

Segment duration (10 minutes) Aired 6:30am-6:40am: This segment featured a discussion with LT John Turner and detective Jeff Parsons about investigating reports of motor vehicle theft and burglary reported to the police department between October 2017 and January 2019, and the successful recovery of stolen automobiles and property through investigation, detection and apprehension. The Auto Burglary and Theft Prevention task force also investigates false reports of motor vehicle theft which are usually a result of insurance fraud or persons losing their cars during drug deals (drug trades). It is estimated that 30% of all insurance claims involve some type of fraud, therefore false reporting of auto theft and insurance fraud is aggressively investigated and prosecuted. These Detectives also work to provide public awareness and education on auto theft and burglary prevention.

D. Victoria Tourism Industry: Broadcast February 3, February 10, February 17, February 24 on KLUB/KIXS/KTXN/KQVT

Segment duration (10 minutes) Aired 6:30am-6:40am: This segment featured a discussion with Joel Navosad with Explore Victoria to discuss all the fun, family-friendly activities happening in and around Victoria. Things like Color Victoria 5K Run, Mayor's Community Drop In, Emergency Preparedness Workshop, The Texas Mile, The Victoria Independent Film Festival and JAMFEST all make living and working in Victoria a delight for those in our community.

E. Border Security Broadcast February 3, February 10, February 17, February 24, March 3, March 10, March 17, March 24 & March 31 **on KLUB/KIXS/KTXN/KQVT**

Segment duration (10 minutes) Aired 6:30am-6:40am: This segment featured a discussion about how the federal government gave Victoria County almost \$600,000 to do border security work. In addition to coordinating with ICE on certain matters, Victoria County has continued to receive federal money to enhance border security work in the county, like helping to pay overtime and buy equipment for

deputies. The funding, which comes from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, is used by Victoria County deputies to patrol highways in search of crime. It's also used to buy standard equipment such as radios, specialty vehicles and cover miscellaneous vehicle operating costs.

F. Victoria Mayoral Race: Broadcast March 3, March 10, March 17, March 24 & March 31 on KLUB/KIXS/KQVT/KTXN

Segment duration (20 minutes) Aired 6:40am-7:00am: This segment featured information about the four candidates running for Mayor of Victoria on May 4, 2019. Candidates include Brent Carter, Vic Morgan, Rawley McCoy, and Steve Meacham. Each candidate has a passion for helping their hometown of Victoria, Tx, and are eager to replace Paul Polasek, the current mayor of Victoria.
