

Politics Corruption in Government	Capital Connection	Ken Lovett, Albany Bureau Chief and columnist for the <i>New York Daily News</i> , discussed another possible scandal in the making: someone on the governor's staff is part of the state Board of Election's investigative unit (which is supposed to independently monitor political campaigns).	10/05/14	7am	30 mins.
Corruption in Government Education Crime/Domestic Violence	Capital Connection	John Cahill, Republican candidate for New York State Attorney General, criticized the current person in that position for how the Moreland Commission was run (the group was created to clean up the corruption in Albany but caused a scandal itself), outlined why he supports charter schools, and advocated for more comprehensive programs to curb domestic violence and sexual abuse (including better training for judges on those issues).	10/12/14	7am	30 mins.
Drug Abuse Crime Corruption in Government	Capital Connection	New York State Attorney General Eric Schneiderman discussed his work with other attorneys general in northeast states to combat heroin drug rings, talked about ways to prevent prescription drug abuse, advocated using forfeiture laws to buy bullet-proof vests for police officers, and defended his actions concerning the Moreland Commission (the anti-corruption committee which was allegedly corrupt itself).	10/19/14	7am	30 mins.
Politics Women's Equality Act Economy Hydro-fracking	Capital Connection	Karen Scharff, co-chair of the Working Families Party, explained her party's endorsement of Gov. Andrew Cuomo, talked about the likelihood of getting a Democratic-controlled state Senate in this election and what that would mean to the advancement of the Working Families agenda (passage of the Women's Equality Act and raising the minimum wage), and discussed why she thinks the moratorium on hydro-fracking should be turned into a ban.	10/26/14	7am	30 mins.

Corruption in Government Politics Health & Wellness	Capital Connection	Ken Lovett, Albany Bureau Chief and columnist for the <i>New York Daily News</i> , provided an update on the investigation into the Moreland Act Commission (the anti-corruption committee which was allegedly corrupt itself), pointed out where candidates for statewide office were in the latest polling results, discussed where Gov. Andrew Cuomo and his rivals stand on the issues, and talked about how the governor has handled the Ebola protection issue.	11/2/14	7am	30 mins.
Politics	Capital Connection	Casey Seiler, State Editor and Capital Bureau Chief for the <i>Albany Times Union</i> , gave his analysis of the election results. He outlined how voter dissatisfaction and third parties affected the outcome of the governor's race, in which Gov. Andrew Cuomo won re-election, but by a lower percentage than anticipated, and the effect a Republican-controlled state senate will have on new legislation.	11/9/14	7am	30 mins.
Education	Capital Connection	Billy Easton, Executive Director for the Alliance for Quality Education, stressed that public schools are the key to people learning how to participate in our economy and in our democracy. He was critical of the political agenda to push charter schools, alleging that it was motivated by profit and not better education. He said that the Common Core curriculum was a good idea in theory, but he pointed out that more testing doesn't necessarily mean more learning.	11/16/14	7am	30 mins.

Politics Education	Capital Connection	<i>New York 1</i> Cable News reporter Zack Fink (covering politics in Albany and New York City), discussed the relationship between New York Governor Andrew Cuomo and New Jersey Governor Chris Christie, pointing out how each has helped the other overcome various political scandals. Fink also talked about the clash between Gov. Cuomo and New York City mayor Bill de Blasio over universal Pre-K and where the two stand on other issues, including rent control.	11/30/14	7am	30 mins.

Lovett also talked about a lawsuit brought against the state Assembly Speaker because he allegedly didn't do enough to stop sexual harassment of interns by an assembly member from Brooklyn.
