Government Crime	Capital Connection	New York Comptroller Thomas DiNapoli discussed the veto of a Port Authority reform bill by Governor Chris Christie of New Jersey and Governor Andrew Cuomo of New York, calling it a missed opportunity to address operation and spending concerns of the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey. He also reflected on the shootings of two New York City police officers in their patrol car, along with the tensions between police and residents in cities across the state and nation.	01/04/15	7am	30 mins.
Politics	Capital Connection	Host Alan Chartock reflected on the life and career of former three-term New York State Governor Mario Cuomo, who passed away on January 1, 2015. Highlighted were Cuomo's political philosophies, his humor, and his communication skills as exhibited in speeches and radio shows.	01/11/15	7am	30 mins.
Politics Corruption in Government Education	Capital Connection	Ken Lovett, Albany bureau chief and columnist for the <i>New York Daily News</i> , discussed the rocky relationship between Governor Andrew Cuomo and New York City mayor Bill de Blasio, the balance of power in the state legislature after a number of scandals have forced out various politicians, and why the teachers' union is opposed to the governor (over charter school support, teacher evaluations, and other issues).	01/18/15	7am	30 mins.
Corruption in Government	Capital Connection	Blair Horner, Legislative Director for the New York Public Interest Research Group (NYPIRG), talked about the circumstances leading up to New York State Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver being arrested on corruption charges by U.S. Attorney Preet Bhara, who alleged that Silver had traded his influence to amass millions of dollars in graft. A discussion followed on whether this would lead to true ethics reform in Albany.	01/25/15	7am	30 mins.
Education	Capital Connection	State University of New York (SUNY) Chancellor Nancy Zimpher discussed ways to get high school students ready for college so they actually complete the program and earn their degrees. She also talked about how education and economic development are coming together in the concept of <i>StartUp New York</i> , an incentive in which new businesses housed in a facility linked to or owned by a college or university would be given tax breaks.	02/01/15	7am	30 mins.

Corruption in Government	Capital Connection	State Assemblywoman Patricia Fahy, a Democrat from New York's 109th District, discussed the unfolding story of the arrest of Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver on alleged corruption charges, and the selection of a new person to succeed Silver as Speaker. Fahy also discussed proposed ethic reforms for the legislature to crackdown on abuses of finances and power.	02/08/15	7am	30 mins.
Corruption in Government	Capital Connection	New York State Senator and Democratic Conference Leader Andrea Stewart-Cousins discussed proposed ethics reforms affecting the state legislature which would make politicians more accountable, and whether the reforms would ever be implemented. She also talked about the specific proposal to restrict legislators' outside incomes to curb influence peddling.	02/15/15	7am	30 mins.
Corruption in Government	Capital Connection	Blair Horner, Legislative Director for the New York Public Interest Research Group (NYPIRG), reacted to the governor's proposal for a constitutional amendment which would forfeit politicians' pensions if they're convicted of criminal wrongdoing, pointing out that it's highly unlikely the state legislature would allow such a proposal to come up for a vote. He also discussed whether legislators should be allowed to have outside income.	02/22/15	7am	30 mins.
Environment Corruption in Government	Capital Connection	New York State Comptroller Thomas DiNapoli discussed the governor's proposed increase to the oil spill clean-up fund, and the proposed change to eliminate the comptroller's oversight of how monies are spent. He also discussed how the state budget will be impacted by a new Assembly Speaker (after the previous speaker was forced out because of allegations of corruption), in terms of timing and policy decisions.	03/01/15	7am	30 mins.
Education Corruption in Government	Capital Connection	Ken Lovett, Albany bureau chief for the <i>New York Daily News</i> , discussed why many teachers from around the state are upset with Gov. Cuomo's proposal to get rid of bad teachers and his push for more charter schools in contract to public schools. Lovett also pondered whether the "significant others" (spouses, girlfriends, or boyfriends) of legislators and the governor should be under the same financial disclosure guidelines as the actual politicians.	03/08/15	7am	30 mins.

Education	Capital Connection	New York State Republican Assemblyman Jim Tedisco discussed the proposed "Common Core Parental Refusal Act," which would tell parents what their rights are concerning Common Core school curriculum and testing. He said parents and students can refuse the tests without penalty. He also talked about a holistic approach to evaluate students and teachers as opposed to the primary focus being on standardized tests.	03/15/15	7am	30 mins.
Education Economy	Capital Connection	H. Carl McCall, former New York State senator, state comptroller, U.N. ambassador, and current chair of the SUNY Board of Trustees, advocated for the state legislature to invest more in the SUNY system to broaden the opportunities for students to attend public colleges and actually get a degree in four years. He explained how the Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) works to help those in poverty and those with limited means afford higher education. And he discussed Start-Up New York, a program designed to get new businesses to locate near colleges, get tax advantages, provide internships and jobs, and conduct research.	03/22/15	7am	30 mins.
Politics Education	Capital Connection	Yancey Roy, Albany Bureau Chief for <i>Newsday</i> , talked about the governor's relationship with leaders of the state Senate and Assembly, noting that some consider the governor to be a "bully." Roy discussed whether that's a fair assessment and whether that's a good technique for dealing with fellow politicians. Roy also discussed the battle between the governor and the state's teachers unions over changes to tenure policy and over support for charter schools.	03/29/15	7am	30 mins.
