

Politics Healthcare	Capital Connection	Dr. Lee Miringoff, Associate Professor of Political Science at Marist College in Poughkeepsie, NY, and Director of the Marist Institute for Public Opinion's Marist Poll, reflected on the changing political landscape in the era of President Trump and what is now considered acceptable dialogue. Miringoff highlighted Governor Andrew Cuomo's poll numbers and what they mean for any future plans (whether another gubernatorial term or a presidential run). And Miringoff pointed out the public opinion about health care, noting most people's preference for improving Obamacare instead of replacing it.	10/01/2017	7am	30 mins.
Gun Control Teen Suicide	Capital Connection	Gary Pudup, Western New York Regional Director for New Yorkers Against Gun Violence (who lives in Rochester), reflected on the mass-shooting in Los Vegas and the national debate over gun control. He maintained that gun violence has decreased in New York State because of the Safe Act and he outlined the provisions of the law. He talked about the Emergency Protection Act, which has been enacted in a few states and which temporarily takes guns away from people deemed a threat by those around them, thus curbing domestic violence and suicides. And he discussed teen suicide and ways to keep guns away from troubled youngsters.	10/08/2017	7am	30 mins.
NYS Constitutional Convention Politics	Capital Connection	Dr. Gerald Benjamin (SUNY Distinguished Professor of Political Science, Associate Vice President for Regional Engagement and Director of the Benjamin Center at SUNY New Paltz) discussed whether there should be a state constitutional convention, advocating the process as a means to reform state government. He explained the concept of "home rule" which is designed to restore autonomy to local municipalities and remove some state oversight. And he discussed ideas to curb the influence of "dark" money on politicians.	10/15/2017	7am	30 mins.
Healthcare Politics	Capital Connection	Ken Lovett, Albany Bureau Chief for the <i>New York Daily News</i> , discussed the proposed national health care changes which would allegedly cut funding to a health insurance program for children. He recapped Vice President Mike Pence's visit to Western New York in support of Congressman Chris Collins, who was the first congressman to endorse Donald Trump for President. Taxes Economy	Capital Connection	New York State Comptroller Thomas DiNapoli explained the possibility of state and local tax deductions being eliminated or curtailed under a proposed federal tax plan. He discussed whether a stock market "correction" is coming soon and what that would mean for the state pension system. He explained what investing in "real assets" means. She explained the need for incoming companies to understand and comply with local laws.
