

Economy Voter Reform	Capital Connection	Blair Horner, Executive Director for the New York Public Interest Research Group (NYPIRG), discussed the U.S. Attorney's investigation into the governor's economic development plan for Buffalo, NY, known as the "Buffalo Billion." The probe revolves around how the contracts were awarded and who got those contracts. Horner also advocated for same-day voter registration (allowing people to register to vote even on Election Day), suggesting that might increase voter turn-out.	10/04/15	7am	30 mins.
Economy	Capital Connection	Jimmy Vielkind, Albany Bureau Chief for <i>Politico New York</i> , an online news service, talked about the continuing feud between the governor of New York and the mayor of New York City and how that's impacting affording housing initiatives and economic development in both the Big Apple and around the state.	10/11/15	7am	30 mins.
State Government Reform	Capital Connection	Dr. Gerald Benjamin, Distinguished Professor of Political Science at SUNY New Paltz, advocated a constitutional convention to revise the state constitution as the only method for true government reform, although he admitted that the chances of the state legislature agreeing to such a thing are slim.	10/18/15	7am	30 mins.
Corruption in NYS Government Uber and NYS	Capital Connection	Ken Lovett, Albany Bureau Chief for the <i>New York Daily News</i> , discussed the upcoming trials of two New York State legislative leaders who have been accused of corruption. He also outlined the pros and cons of legalizing assisted suicide. And he talked about the effort to bring Uber, the ride-sharing program, to the state, noting public support for it and taxi drivers' opposition to it.	10/25/15	7am	30 mins.

Corruption in NYS Government Economy	Capital Connection	Casey Seiler, state editor and capital bureau chief of the <i>Albany Times Union</i> , discussed how political contributions affect state government, citing the example of a real estate developer who has given the governor lots of money and received many benefits in return for his contributions. Seiler also described the ten economic development councils around the state which give out grants and tax credits to businesses.	11/01/15	7am	30 mins.
Corruption in NYS Government	Capital Connection	Ken Lovett, Albany Bureau Chief for the <i>New York Daily News</i> , discussed the "corruption double header," which consists of the trial of the former state Assembly Speaker and the upcoming trial of the former state Senate Majority Leader.	11/08/15	7am	30 mins.
Economy Education Corruption in NYS Government	Capital Connection	Blair Horner, Executive Director of the New York Public Interest Research Group (NYPIRG), discussed the impact of the state's fiscal policies on the SUNY (State University of New York) system; namely, decreased state funding and increased tuition costs. He also talked about the ongoing trials of legislative leaders charged with corruption. In addition, he made an appeal for an easier and faster voter registration process.	11/15/15	7am	30 mins.
Immigration Politics	Capital Connection	Republican New York State Assembly Minority Leader Brian Kolb reacted to the terrorist attacks in Paris, France. He stated that there needs to be a balance between accepting Middle Eastern refugees and other immigrants into the state and protecting against terrorists entering America. He also discussed who would likely run for governor on the Republican ticket.	11/22/15	7am	30 mins.

Immigration Economy	Capital Connection	Ed Cox, head of the New York State Republican Party, reacted to several governors around the country not wanting Syrian refugees coming into their states because of fears that terrorists might be embedded in the wave of immigrants. Corruption in NYS Government  State Government Reform	Capital Connection	Blair Horner, Executive Director of the New York Public Interest Research Group (NYPIRG), pondered whether there will be any real government reform in the wake of former state Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver being convicted on corruption charges. Horner also discussed whether the state should hold a constitutional convention and whether that would make government better or just be a waste of time.	12/13/15	7am	30 mins.
Corruption in NYS Government	Capital Connection	Casey Seiler, State Editor for the <i>Albany Times Union</i> , observed that it was an historic year for New York State, in that the leaders of both the State Assembly and State Senate were found guilty on corruption charges. Economy Politics	Capital Connection	Matt Hamilton, capital bureau reporter for the <i>Albany Times Union</i> , discussed the loophole that allows a Limited Liability Corporation (LLC) to give large amounts of money to politicians in the state, and the degree to which those politicians are influenced by the contributions.
