Experts say several products from toys to electronics are experiencing shortages. Also, first class mail in most places will now take five days instead of three causing further delays.

The Downtown Seattle Association is meeting to discuss the results and find a way to bring retail foot traffic back to city and help local businesses thrive.

The company is looking to hire 150,000 workers which is 50% more than last year. Starting pay is \$18 an hour and duties include picking, packing, and shipping products.

The city is looking to hire more officers to increase patrols and reduce crime across Tacoma.

Officials say getting the vaccine is still the best way to prevent Covid.
