WKIP provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **Animal rescue:** Discussed Denna's background and how she started the Lucky Orphan Horse Rescue organization. Discussed the growth and success of how it's in it's 11th year. Talked about upcoming events for this summer and about sponsorship and volunteer opportunities.
- **Art:** David Henningsen, the guitar-strumming, story-telling, photographer talks about Gallery 330, a community arts space that is a venue for painting, sculpture, theatre performance and poetry. He speaks about the openness to and encouragement of people of different degrees of artistic experience.
- **Author:** Local author Dan Peck talks about his new book, "Thomas Cole's Refrain: The Paintings of Catskill Creek". Cole, the founder of the influential Hudson River School of Painting, created 10 works - over eighteen years- showing the Catskill Mountains high peaks from the valley below.
- **Community :** Nick Shannon, Executive Director of Chamber Foundation and Frank Castella Jr, President of the Dutchess Cty Regional Chamber of Commerce discussed Kid Ventures 2019. They spoke on the origination of the event, what it's all about, how the Chamber is involved. They also spoke on how the two organizations work together, joint fundraising events and opportunities to volunteer with these organizations.
- **Community Activist:** Arts Activist Jeff Aman, a painter and VP of the Poughkeepsie Public Arts Commission, talks about the relationship between the fortified arts community and economic development in Poughkeepsie. Fully cognizant of the plans for new construction, especially in the downtown area, Mr. Aman describes the plans to create more housing as a way of luring new businesses to the area.
- **Community Entertainment:** Christina Boryk, Executive Director of Rebuilding Together Dutchess County, talks about how she became involved with Rebuilding Together Dutchess County, what the organization does and the successes it has had. April is National Rebuilding month and April 27th is National Rebuilding Day. Christina also spoke about the eight projects currently going on the county, upcoming events, fundraisers and how sponsors and the public can get

involved and/or help.

- **Community Events:** Mark Figliozzi, Town of Pleasant Valley Supervisor spoke about the upcoming events in the Town of Pleasant Valley including Pleasant Valley Days on July 26, 27 and 28.
- **Community Services:** Christina Boryk, Executive Director of Rebuilding Together Dutchess County, talks about how she became involved with Rebuilding Together Dutchess County, what the organization does and the successes it has had. April is National Rebuilding month and April 27th is National Rebuilding Day. Christina also spoke about the eight projects currently going on the county, upcoming events, fundraisers and how sponsors and the public can get involved and/or help.
- **County Government:** Dutchess Cty Executive Marc Molinaro talks about the origin and execution of the Dutchess Cty philosophy, "Think Differently". He reveals his conception of himself as a teacher who fosters conversations on public issues that are moral in principle, practical in scope and respectful in tone. He also spoke about the emergence of the local arts community, the recent New York Times article on Poughkeepsie and the uplifting LGBTQ Pride Parade - the County's first.
- **Drug Rehabilitation:** Liz Cooke, Chairperson of the Chemical Dependency Sub-Committee of the Dutchess County Mental Health-Hygiene Board discusses the origin and current status of the opioid crisis, the rehabilitation process and what's available in Dutchess County. She also discussed the upcoming public forum, its purpose and how it will help and how the county and state governments are or aren't helping.
- **Education:** Lisa Kaul, the Director of the Office of Community Engaged Learning, explains the program, in which students earn college credits by working in community settings - and examining their experience in light of an academic discipline. Students from throughout DC and NYC choose a community placement and a faculty advisor who guides them. Locally, there are Vassar College students in the program, while they learn, at all levels of community life, including at Family Services Inc, R.E.A.L Skills Network, the Dutchess Cty Public Defenders office and Vassar Brother's Medical Center.
- **Government - Think Differently:** Toni Ciarfella, Dutchess County's first Deputy Commissioner for Special Needs spoke about her role in fostering a more hospitable, welcoming attitude throughout the County for people with special needs. She spoke about ways of enacting Dutchess County's motto of "Think DIFFERENTLY" and her responsibilities with the specific initiatives like "Think AHEAD", which is two year certificate program at DCC for students with special needs and "Think JOBS" an initiative for businesses to explore hiring people with special needs.
- **Health:** Mike Arteaga, owner of Mike Arteaga's Health & Fitness Centers spoke about the opportunities for greater health from two specific perspectives - freedom and equality. He believes that we all have the freedom to choose to improve our health. He also talks about his fascination with the latest health science, and his passion for improving people's health.

- **Health Care:** Discussion on the services of Hudson River Health Care, specializing in immigrant health care from prenatal screening to advanced care, including diabetes. The agency has over a dozen bilingual centers in the Hudson Valley and Ms. Garcia & Ms. Wisnieski work at the center in the Family Partnership Center in Poughkeepsie.
- **Legal:** (No issue/program description given.)
- **LGBTQ Center:** Karen Marder, Executive Director, and Dr. Adam Rubenstein, Board Member, of Dutchess Pride Center, a non-profit organization that is a safe place for LGBTQ youths and their families to feel safe and express themselves, discuss their success to date, ways to get involved, how to donate or volunteer . They also spoke about the upcoming GOPK Pride Parade on June 9th in the City of Poughkeepsie and several other events during June which is also Pride Month.
- **Local Government:** Mayor Rob Rolison spoke about the improvements in the City of Poughkeepsie. Central to the new initiatives is a bipartisan spirit that works for the public good, not just party advantage. He discussed the new plans in housing, increased public safety and stronger financial fundamentals.
- **Mental Health:** Dr. Ellen Marx, Chief Psychologist, and Anthony Kavarous, Event Chairman, of Dutchess Cty Mental Health discuss the state of mental health in the county and the nation. How people can get involved and the upcoming public forum on May 7th.
- **Military Support:** Brian Maher, Executive Director of Purple Heart Hall of Honor, Inc., spoke about the purpose and scope of the organization, his role and the new direction he has taken things. He also spoke about sponsorship and volunteer opportunities, the upcoming events that IHM will have a large role in and the schedule expansion and remodeling of their existing facility.
- **Newburgh Illuminated Festival:** Paul Pernenwein & Rich Fracasse spoke about the upcoming celebration in the City of Newburgh, Newburgh Illuminated Festival, which was started seven years ago by former City Mayor Walker.
