October 1, 2022	Showing Care and Support for Your Pastor and Church Staff (25-minute program)	<u>Host:</u> Jenny Burkhiser <u>Guest:</u> Brian Kluth, Spokesperson, Bless Your Pastor (Golden, CO). www.blessyourpastor.org <u>Description:</u> Those serving as pastors to care for the flock of Christ realize it is a high calling and one that comes with many demands: from church service preparations, to attending to the numerous spiritual needs of the congregation and special visits, to comforting those who have lost loved ones. In addition to this long list may be matters involving their own families! This reveals little wonder as to why many pastors are in crisis and need of our care. National research has revealed that many pastors face personal and financial challenges. An all-time high of 42% of pastors have seriously considered leaving fulltime ministry this past year and 90% of pastors are experiencing financial stress. Brian Kluth informed listeners that the <i>Bless Your Pastor</i> movement is for all churches across America, with information about where listeners can access free resources. He spoke about how the recent pandemic impacted the church and shared a story of how the Bless Your Pastor movement has encouraged pastors who would have otherwise left the pulpit.

Sadly, in today’s society, with low wages, high rents, joblessness, increasing inflation and other factors, homelessness is no longer what most people think of as an inner-city problem and can look different from one location to another. Candace Gregory talked about seeing people at the worst of times as they experience homelessness or go through the doors of a mission to get help, commenting that if you are having a bad day, just go to their website and read some of the heart-breaking stories of what some of those experiencing homelessness go through but also whose lives are transformed because of their mission center. Their days are filled with emptiness, anxiety, shame, sadness, and a never-ending search for something to relieve the immense burden of hopelessness. Paul Asay and his family know this all too well, as he and his son have experienced depression. Paul explained what depression is, sharing information about depression that many people may not be aware of as well as about the unique challenges the individual and the family must deal with during these times. He also talked about viewing depression and suffering as gifts one can learn and grow stronger from and how God can provide hope and beauty when everything seems so bleak and hopeless.</p>

Rachel Karman talked about her younger years, growing up in a Christian family and needing a good role model in her life to help her make wise decisions. She spoke about how the Bible gives us examples of how God can transform a young life, meeting the individual at one of the lowest times in their life and how individuals are able to turn their life around because someone has taken the time to show them the love of Jesus, giving them hope. Rachel also talked about her work and experience with Young Life One - in identifying, supporting and reaching out to vulnerable youth, whether they are homeless, incarcerated, or trafficked, gaining</p>

Edward Graham talked about how many of the elderly who are on fixed incomes, living in mobile homes, were affected by the hurricane. He talked about some of the big issues – getting water, power and housing – and how Samaritan’s Purse, along with volunteers, are trying to help the people in these communities. Jason Kimak had just returned from a second trip down to the response sites in Florida and gave listeners an update on the progress being made in that area and talked about the people who were impacted. He also shared practical ways listeners could join the efforts to assist with the relief, including ways for those who are unable to travel to Florida. Stories were told about the people too shocked to either come out of or go back to their homes and about how chaplains and volunteers are praying with these people, showing them there is hope through Jesus Christ.

Every year, around 135,000 children are adopted in the United States and there are around 437,000 children who are in foster care on any given day. The process to adoption can be lengthy and costly, but Herbie Newell noted the rewards are priceless. He shared some facts about adoption of which people may not be aware, some common struggles, and/or concerns families may have when considering adopting a child, as well as the joys and benefits of adoption. Herbie gave some practical ways churches and communities can help care for vulnerable children through adoption and foster care.
November 12, 2022	Establishing Boundaries for Healthy Relationships and Individuals Wellness (30-minute program)	<u>Host:</u> Jenny Burkhiser <u>Guests:</u> Lysa TerKeurst, Best-Selling Author and President, Proverbs 31 Ministries (Matthews, NC). www.proverbs31.org <u>Description:</u> Society sets boundaries for many different things – from stop signs to walls, traffic lanes and time to limits, to laws that keep us safe, just to name a few. Lysa TerKeurst talked about why it is also important to have relationship boundaries and how it relates to a person's emotional well-being and their general health and welfare. Lysa gave clarity to what is healthy and what is not healthy inside a personal relationship and how this extends out to other relationships, the community, city, and eventually to the nation. She helped listeners understand signs that individuals may need to implement boundaries in their own lives and what the potential consequences are of not setting boundaries in our lives and relationships. She also stated that she believes we are in the middle of a mental health crisis, as many people are not willing to accept the reality that some relationships need healthier boundaries, along with clear communication. Lysa talked about how we can love others without losing the best of who we are.

Even with high unemployment rates, growing inflation and economic woes, businesses are struggling to find enough people to hire, schools are desperately trying to fill vacant teaching positions, and restaurants are asking patrons to have patience because they are short-staffed. With millions of people in need of a job, many wonder why workers cannot be found to fill the empty positions. As of December 2021, the U.S. Department of Labor Statistics revealed there were 11 million job openings and almost 6.9 million unemployed. Rusty Chadwick shared a couple of the reasons why jobs are left unfilled, including a lack of purposeful work and fulfilling work environments. He mentioned people are looking for a place where there is a purpose for what they are doing, while being fulfilled in the process. These are some of the things that people are drawn to when looking for work. He talked about how God created people to work; the work, however, needs to be honoring to God. How we do our work is more significant than the actual work we are doing - which says a lot about our character. Healthy teams, as he shared, are when purposes are accomplished and people are fulfilled.

As a former addict who had been in over 70 treatment centers, Megan says it was the kindness of strangers on the street that inspired her to start the <i>Grace Project</i> ... a non-profit that gives back to struggling addicts. Every Thursday night, friends and family join her to distribute food, jackets, and toiletries in addition to sweeping the littered streets. Megan hopes that the project will evolve into a resource to support entire families who struggle with similar circumstances.
October 5, 2022	Bring Your Bible to School Day	Students across the nation are gearing up to share their faith and celebrate religious freedom this week during <i>Bring Your Bible to School Day</i> . The annual event, sponsored by Focus on the Family, encourages young students to boldly live out their faith. Last year, more than 500,000 students participated and were a part of shining God's light in their schools. Many parents even posted pictures of their children with their Bibles on social media using the hashtag #BringYourBible.
October 6, 2022	Mentorship	Now we all need a mentor to walk with us through life and mentorship can especially help young adults learn and grow as they transition into adulthood. One Florida non-profit is helping some of these teens who are serving time in juvenile detention centers. <i>Verb Kind</i> was inspired by a small group of volunteers who would spend time with the kids in the Orlando Juvenile Detention Center once a week. The program has now expanded across the state of Florida as they work with incarcerated youth to show them love, attention, and the possibility of breaking the cycle.

The <i>Sea Tow Foundation</i> provides boat safety tips, as well as free life jackets to boaters across the country. October 12, 2022	Sharing Musical Gifts with Seniors	An Illinois man has discovered his musical gifts carry a healing power beyond anything he could have imagined. For the last few months, Ryan Carney has carried his cello into numerous senior care facilities to play for the residents. It’s an act of kindness inspired by his late father who battled terminal brain cancer. Drawing on his musical background, he began playing at senior care homes in hopes that the music would also touch others with cognitive decline.
October 13, 2022	Buddy Benches	It can be difficult for young children to make friends at school, which may lead to loneliness and isolation. However, one Indiana third grader is making a difference for those feeling alone. While most kids are heading off to play with friends, “Zachary” got to work figuring out what he needed to do to get a buddy bench for his school. When kids sit on a buddy bench, it signals to their classmates and teacher they’re feeling alone or have no one with which to play. The company which creates the benches told Zach it needed 250 pounds of small plastic lids and tops to be melted down and made into the bench.
October 17, 2022	Free Lunch for Healthcare Heroes	He’s an office clerk by day, but during his lunch breaks, Patrick Rhodes is a hero who helps other heroes! Patrick created the <i>Lunch for Healthcare Heroes</i> campaign in April 2020 when he personally paid for and delivered more than 600 pizzas and sandwiches to hospitals in the Tampa, Florida, area. Last year, Pat partnered with the <i>Inspire Foundation</i> , breaking his own goal of delivering 2,021 more free meals to community heroes. He’s even expanded his operation to include free school supplies for teachers. And yes, this year he plans to top it all with more free meals!
October 19, 2022	Helping Incarcerated Youth	A North Carolina man is using his trade skills to give back to the community by helping people turn mistakes into opportunities. For the last 15 years, David Moore has been mentoring the incarcerated and at-risk youth in his auto body shop. He founded <i>Southside Rides Foundation</i> to help people, who because of their past, have few other options. Moore said, “Growth starts with being brave enough to try on your own...just go out there and see what you can do!” Local dealerships have hired over 200 people who went through his program and around 30 have opened their own businesses.
