2	Participate in events or program sponsored by educational institution relating career opportunities in broadcasting.	On April 17, 2018, News Anchor spoke to a Baylor Journalism class of approximately 25 students regarding her daily routine and careers in television broadcasting.
		On April 20, 2018, News Anchor spoke to the Lorena HS Newspaper and Yearbook class (approximately 30 students) regarding her daily routine and top tips for students looking to enter a media field.
		On May 15, 2018, the station co-hosted the 11 th Annual YES! Expo in Waco. KWTX is one of the Founding Partners of this event. KWTX EEO Officer attends monthly planning meetings for this event beginning in January and actively participate in hosting this event. More than 2000 students from 6 counties learned about career opportunities from booths set up at the Extraco Events Center. Over 125 exhibitors had booths and hands-on exhibits to demonstrate the many career opportunities available to young people in Central Texas.
		On June 1, 2018, twelve veterans from the Doris Miller VA came through for a tour and discussion about careers in television broadcasting.
		On June 13 & 14, 2018, sixteen teachers from Connally ISD attended a tour and training meeting at KWTX to learn about careers in television broadcasting. Three of the teachers then stayed (or came back the next day) for job shadowing in News, Sales, and Creative Services to learn more details relating to the subject whey they teach.
		On July 24, 2018, fourteen veterans from the Doris Miller VA came through for a tour and discussion about careers in television broadcasting.
		On August 13, 2018, twenty-five students with the Waco Chamber of Commerce Teen Leadership program came through for a station tour and discussion of careers in television broadcasting. They stayed to watch a live newscast.

		On October 3, 2018, news employee spoke as part of a panel about broadcast news to two Baylor University classes of fifteen students each.
		On October 4, 2018, News Reporter talked to the Baylor chapter of NABJ about being a reporter, tips on college, and internships.
		On October 5, 2018, News Anchor spoke to a group of Axtell high school and middle school students (50-75 in attendance) regarding her daily routine, reason she chose a television broadcasting career and answered questions regarding television broadcast careers.
		On October 23, 2018, news employee spoke to two Baylor University classes of about fifteen students each about broadcast news.
		On November 11, 2018, three staff members from Texas Tech Waco came through the station for a tour. They met with the General Manager and News Director to discuss ways to improve the Texas Tech journalism program so that they can offer quality applicants to KWTX.
		On January 24, 2019, high school students from various Waco High schools participating in the LEAD (Leadership, Education, and Development) Program with the Chamber of Commerce toured the KWTX studios. They were able to visit Creative Services, Production, Sales and News to learn about careers in the television broadcasting industry.
		On March 8, 2019, News Anchor attended a career day at Valley Mills High School and spoke with high school students (9 th – 12 th grade) about careers in broadcast news.

3	Participate in job fairs.	On September 27, 2018, EEO Officer attended the Baylor Liberal Arts Career Fair & Symposium held at the Cashion Academic Center on the Baylor campus. The Career Fair was open to Baylor students from 3-6pm. Open positions were featured, along with the KWTX Internship Program. Approximately 250 Baylor students and alumni attended. In addition, KWTX sent a news representative to participate in the "panel discussion" at the Symposium.
		On October 26, 2018, the KWTX EEO Officer attended the Find Your Waco Career Fair held at the Waco Convention Center Freedom Fountain. Open positions were featured, along with the KWTX Internship program. This career fair specifically targeted veterans and military personal from Fort Hood who are transitioning out of the Army, along with new residents of the Waco and Central Texas area. Several hundred people attended.
		On March 26, 2019, the KWTX EEO Officer attended the 2019 McLennan Career Fair at McLennan Community College in Waco, TX. Full-time positions at KWTX and KBTX, and internships were advertised to college students and alumni.
