The One World Medical Relief medical team travel to Tanzania at least twice a year to not only complete hundreds of surgeries a year, but to also work with the native surgeons to get them up-to-speed and into the 21st Century. Within the past five years, they've developed a formal surgical training program, and OWMR doctors assist with this.
