**Topic – Justice Department calls for "expanding early release" on "coronavirus in prison"**

CNN and the Associated Press reported on the 3rd that the U.S. has decided to expand early release by using the house arrest system as the new coronavirus infection (Corona 19) spread rapidly in some federal calibration facilities.

Attorney General William Barr ordered the Federal Office of Education (BOP) to increase house arrest in three federal prisons, where cases of coronavirus have soared, and to execute early release of prisoners at high risk of infection.

"Some facilities are suffering from a significant level of infection," he said in a memo to prison chiefs. "If appropriate, we need to take measures to remove vulnerable prisoners from correctional facilities with house arrest."

In particular, Barr ordered inmates at Oakdale, Louisiana, where five prisoners died of coronavirus and about 10 were hospitalized, to be put first.

Federal prison in Elkton, Ohio, where three inmates died, and Danbury, Connecticut, where 20 confirmed cases were reported, were also named by Minister Barr.

As of that day, a total of 91 inmates and 50 correctional workers were confirmed to be coronavirus-19 in prisons across the U.S.

Earlier, U.S. Congress and others have been pressuring the Justice Department to release prisoners in high-risk groups, saying that it is almost impossible to follow the six-foot distancing guidelines in prisons.

In response, the Ministry of Justice said it would expand house arrest from the 27th of last month, and some local prisons have taken drastic measures, such as early release of prisoners with low risk.

##### **Topic – Coronavirus lockdown reduces violent crime in many parts of the world.**

There have been reports that violent crimes have decreased significantly in some countries since the global pandemic of new coronavirus infections (Corona 19).

Analysts say that it is the effect of reduced external activities as blockades such as house evacuation and curfews have been imposed around the world to ease the spread of coronavirus 19.

According to the New York Times and the Associated Press on the 11th, this phenomenon is notable in South American countries where the security situation is relatively vulnerable and the murder rate is high.

In El Salvador, the number of murders in March fell to 65 in March to half that of 114 in February. It has been four days since there were no murders at all.

El Salvador blocked the border earlier than other South American countries, and since the 22nd of last month, it has been taking measures to send home evacuation to quarantine centers if they go out without permission.

Argentina, which issued a home evacuation order in mid-March, had an average daily robbery of 30, down nearly 90 percent from the previous 225. Local police told the New York Times that strong control is discouraging illegal activities.

Colombia also saw a sharp drop in criminal reports after the nationwide quarantine measures on the 20th of last month. March 20-25 reports of murders fell from 206 to 91 in the same period last year, while assault dropped from 2,46 to 283 and robbery from 5,45 to 486.

Peruvian crime fell 84 percent last month.

Some states in the United States have similar situations. In Chicago, one of the most violent cities, the number of drug-related arrests has plummeted 42 percent since the home evacuation order was issued. The number of crimes themselves has also decreased by 10 percent.

New York also saw a 12 percent decrease in major crimes such as murder and robbery last month.

In South Africa, the number of serious assaults dropped from 2,673 to 456 in the first week of the blockade and from 326 to 94.

However, there is also a difference between countries. Venezuela, which has been under lockdown for about a month, has seen fewer murders and other violent crimes, but there have been reports by monitoring groups that the number of murders committed by government security forces without judicial procedures.

Mexico, which voluntarily evacuated its home at the end of March, had the largest number of murders in March with 2,585.

Furthermore, there is a possibility that certain crimes will increase again as restrictions are taken longer.

In Mexico, in areas with high levels of poverty, there are concerns that if suppression measures continue after April, the social security program may not be implemented properly and crimes such as looting may increase.

In some parts of Brazil, where drug dealerships have been blocked by border closures, robberies of cash machines and transport armored vehicles have already increased.

Rodney Phillips, a former member of the Chicago gang and now a conflict mediator, said drug arrests have declined, but sales continue, adding that "people may be buying more online right now."

There are also voices worrying that domestic violence will increase around the world as the time spent at home increases.

Houston police chief said the number of assaults in the city has increased by 10 percent in the past three weeks, about half of which is domestic violence.

The Associated Press reported that officials are concerned about what would happen if the regulatory measures were lifted or continued for too long, along with a surge of unreported domestic violence.

#### **Topic – California plans to give \$500 to illegal immigrants.**

The state of California has announced plans to raise a total of \$125 million in disaster relief assistance funds for illegal immigrants who are excluded from the federal government's coronavirus relief cash package. California is the first country to provide disaster relief aid directly to unwritten immigrants.

Gavin Newsom, governor of California, said in a daily news briefing on Wednesday that 10 percent of the country's workforce is the most struggling people in the world of coronavirus, and plans to pay them \$500 in cash per person.

The payment is \$500 per adult on paper and cannot exceed \$1,000 per household. According to the Newsom Governor's Office, the fund will be distributed through local non-profit organizations that provide services to the underprivileged community.

The move is based on the suggestion of the Leather Grocery Association that shopping carts and recycling bags that customers bring to the market are concerned about the possibility of contact with Corona 19.

According to the Los Angeles Times on the 24th, the executive order of the governor of Newsom is not expected to apply to more than 100 cities and counties, including the city of Los Angeles, which has its own regulations on the use of single-use plastic bags.

##### **Topic – Irvine City Golf Course to reopen**

In a meeting on the 28th, Irvine City Council discussed the overall emergency administrative order implemented by coronavirus 19 and revised some measures, but decided to keep them as they are.

The revised ordinance by the Irvine City Council allows golf courses to be reopened in compliance with ▲ Orange County government guidelines and public health regulations required by the city, and ▲ Irvine Animal Protection Center will reopen today (May 1) but allow animal adoption on reservations only.

However, the city council has decided to keep the city's public facilities closed except Irvine Animal Shelter until further notice. In addition, only a few employees for online, telephone and video calls, which require essential services, have decided to go to work.

The city council will also postpone or change all community events sponsored by the city after coronavirus 19 until the end of June and announce them on its website (<https://www.cityofirvine.org/>). The measure will be discussed monthly in the city council.

In addition, the city council has decided to maintain the mandatory wearing of face shields for employees and shoppers working in retail stores until further notice. The city council also decided to deal with this issue every month.

In addition, the city council voted to keep administrative orders that prevent building owners and financial institutions from evicting, bankruptcy or raising rents to Irvine residents and owners whose income has been reduced due to the coronavirus 19 impact. The building permit and application were extended for an additional 180 days.

"Coronavirus 19 has completely changed our lives at work and at home," Mayor Christina Shervine said. "We must continue to revise executive orders for the health and well-being of the community."

**Topic – Buffett, "Corona 19 Shock, it's extensive, but nothing can stop America."**

Berkshire Hathaway Chairman Warren Buffett (89) acknowledged the economic shock caused by the novel coronavirus infection on the 2nd, but was optimistic that the U.S. economy would overcome it.

According to CNBC and Reuters, Buffett said at the annual shareholders' meeting in Omaha, Nebraska, that the potential impact of the coronavirus was very wide.

The general shareholders' meeting was held on video for the first time in the wake of the coronavirus. The shareholders' meeting was relayed to shareholders online.

In particular, the shareholders' meeting came amid a net loss of \$49.7 billion (about 60.584.3 trillion won) in the first quarter due to the coronavirus outbreak in Berkshire.

But Buffett said, "I'm sure nothing will stop the U.S. basically," stressing, "The miracle of the U.S., the magic of the U.S., has always won, and it will happen again."

"I was convinced of this during World War II, during the Cuban Missile Crisis, the September 11 attacks (2001), and during the global financial crisis," he said.

"If you choose when to be born and where to be born, would you choose 1720, 1820, and 1920?" Buffett said. "Today, you will choose the United States. "Since the founding of the United States, people have hoped to be here."

"You can bet on the U.S., but you have to be careful about how to bet," he said. "The market can do everything."

The shareholders' meeting was attended by Chairman Buffett and Vice Chairman Greg Abel of the non-insurance sector.

**Topic – IT Dinosaurs Start Normalizing...Apple opens stores in the U.S. and Google goes to work.**

IT Dinosaurs Start Normalizing...Apple opened a store in the U.S. and Google is also starting to normalize IT dinosaurs as U.S. governments resume their economic activities step by step.

iPhone manufacturer Apple has decided to open Apple stores in some states starting next week, according to economic media CNBC on the 8th.

It will be opened in parts of Idaho, South Carolina, Alabama and Alaska, and will limit the number of customers staying in the store along with a fever test.

Apple added that the stores will focus on repairing products and implement safety measures such as social distancing and wearing masks.

"Our team is constantly monitoring regional health data and government guidelines, and we will do so as soon as we can safely open our store," Apple said.

Apple has 510 stores worldwide, including 271 Apple stores in the United States.

Apple has closed all its stores around the world except China since March as the new coronavirus outbreak (Corona 19) has become prevalent worldwide.

The store was reopened in some countries, including Australia and Germany, starting with the reopening of Apple Store in Garosu-gil, Gangnam, South Korea on the 18th of last month.

CNBC pointed out that Apple Store, a hands-on store, is the key driving force behind Apple's demand for devices. "The reopening of the store is a sign that the company's business is slowly returning to normal."

Alphabet, the parent company of Google, the world's largest search engine company, is also expected to partially normalize office operations starting in June.

Alphabet CEO Sundar Pichai said in an e-mail to his employees on the night of the 7th that he plans to restart his office by allowing only 10 to 15 percent of employees to go to work as early as June.

CEO Pichai said, "I think I'm starting to get used to virtual meetings (such as video) now," adding, "But I miss the experience of many of our employees gathering at the same place."

CEO Pichai explained that employees who will go to work first will also have to come to the office due to the nature of their work, such as using special equipment.

However, the majority of employees who are able to work from home will be working longer at home, adding, "Maybe by the end of the year."

**Topic – FDA. Bill Gates Sponsored Coronavirus 19 Project Sudden Braking**

The New York Times reported on the 16th that the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) suddenly put a brake on a new coronavirus infection (Corona 19) diagnosis project sponsored by Microsoft founder Bill Gates.

According to the New York Times, the Seattle Coronavirus 19 Assessment Network (SCAN) was notified by the FDA on the 12th to suspend the coronavirus diagnosis program until a separate permission is given.

SCAN's diagnostic program funded by Gates is a project involving Seattle City, King County Health Authority, Washington State Medical School, and Seattle Children's Hospital.

The program, which began in March, was designed to send diagnostic kits to households in Seattle to collect results and track and monitor the spread of the virus.

Gates said, "We understand the coronavirus outbreak in Seattle, and the results will be valuable information for other communities around the world."

Through this program, SCAN tested thousands of samples and found cases of infection that local health authorities had not yet confirmed.

For this reason, the CDC also provided technical advice to the program, according to the New York Times.

However, the FDA said SCAN needs to obtain separate permission to notify patients of the results of the coronavirus 19 diagnosis, and "stop the diagnosis until further approval is obtained."

"There is no problem with the safety and accuracy of the diagnostic kit," SCAN posted on its website. "We will actively resolve FDA questions to resume diagnosis as soon as possible."

Eric Topol, a non-profit biomedical researcher at the Scripps Institute, told the New York Times that SCAN's diagnosis project was a leading role in responding to the coronavirus crisis.

##### **Topic – Southern California economy 'corona slump' until next year**

The Los Angeles Daily News reported on the 19th that the Southern California economy will not be able to escape from the recession until next year amid a continued decline in sales due to the sluggish economy.

Retail sales in six Southern California counties, including Los Angeles County, are expected to drop by 38 percent over the next two years, a total of \$264 billion, according to a survey released by the Southern California Government Association on the 14th.

Among retail industries, the restaurant industry has been hit directly by the coronavirus 19. It is expected that a sharp drop in sales will hit the restaurant industry by 65 percent over the next two years. Next, the clothing industry will record a 57% drop in sales, 48% in automobile-related industries, and 43% in home appliances, respectively, the newspaper said.

The decline in retail sales and the soaring unemployment rate accelerate the economic downturn.

According to SCAG data, the unemployment rate in Southern California is estimated to exceed double digits, 19.3 percent this year and 12.2 percent next year, respectively.

Local governments in each county are expected to see their tax revenues decline due to falling sales in the retail industry, while unemployment is expected to soar to the highest level since the Great Depression, which is expected to meet the trend of a recession triggered by the coronavirus 19.

"There is not a single place that has not been adversely affected by the Southern California business community due to Corona 19," said an official at SCAG. "The best way to minimize the economic crisis is to respond effectively in a short time."

'It's smaller and quieter, but like a festival...'

Protests continued in downtown Washington D.C. on the weekend on the 13th (local time), as protests across the U.S. began for the third week after police brutality killed black George Floyd on the 25th of last month.

The protests, which had intensified for some time, have turned peaceful in many areas, including Seattle, due to the crisis of Floyd's funeral, and are seeking institutional improvements in racial discrimination and police coercive law enforcement.

According to the Washington Post (WP), in Washington, where protests continued for 16 days, people gathered at Lafayette Square in front of the White House and Plaza on 16th Street in front of the new landmark.

As usual, many people kneeled down on one knee to protest Floyd's death, and a march took place.

However, there were many people who came out with their children as if they were on a family outing for the weekend, and many visitors came to see the scene, which became a hot spot, according to the WP. On Twitter, articles conveying the atmosphere of the day with "smaller demonstrations, festival atmosphere" were noticeable.

"In the early days of the protest, the crowd confronted police was replaced by visitors who came to take pictures of signs and murals covering the area, including the yellow "Black lives are precious" written in paint on the 16th Street road between Lafayette Square and K Street," WP said.

Merchants targeting "customers" who visit the site also appeared.

About 10 merchants set up stands along the 16th Street road and started selling T-shirts with the phrase "Black lives are precious," as well as posters and masks.

A merchant told the WP that children and their parents brought hundreds of T-shirts, saying they were looking for a lot of T-shirts for children.

"Although calm has returned to most parts of Washington, most of the city's buildings are still closed," the WP said. This is an indication that the owners of the building are wary of escalating tensions again, but most of the visitors found the venue in a peaceful atmosphere amid sunny weather.

Meanwhile, a number of disparate protesters emerged amid protests against black deaths and calls for police reform and system changes.

"Not all demonstrators in Washington, D.C. on Saturday voiced support for police reform and structural changes," the WP said. "About 20 demonstrators, mostly white, gathered in the National Mall area earlier in the day to support police roles and law enforcement.

The rally was "the first time I've seen it in the capital (Washington, D.C.)" amid more than two weeks of protests against Floyd's death in Washington, D.C., the WP said.

Malala, a native of Pakistan, has been shot in the head, neck and shoulder of a woman on her way home from school since she was 11 years old.

Malala and her family moved to Birmingham after recovering from a nearly fatal wound. Malala was the youngest person to win the Nobel Peace Prize in 2014 for her undaunted work for women and children's educational rights.

Malala, who went to Oxford University in 2017, took her last test and completed her bachelor's degree in political science, philosophy and economics.

Malala tweeted, "It is hard to express both joy and gratitude for finishing my degree."

"I don't know what path I'm going to take in the future," he said. "First of all, I'm going to watch Netflix, read books, and sleep."

Malala announced her graduation on Twitter, revealing photos of her celebrating her graduation in front of her family and graduation cake and "trashing" in which students finished their exams and buried pieces of food and confetti.

A poll of six key contenders in the U.S. presidential battleground showed that President Donald Trump was far behind former Vice President Joe Biden, a Democratic presidential candidate.

Traditionally, Republicans have been strong in the south-central region and Democrats on the west and east coast, and contention states are not dominated by certain parties, and winning votes here is often the key to winning or losing the election.

According to a poll released by the political website Real Clearpolitics on the 27th, Biden outpaced President Trump by more than 6 percentage points in four of the six contenders: Florida, Michigan, Wisconsin and Pennsylvania.

The Hill, a political media outlet, said Biden is widening the gap in the four locations.

In the other two, North Carolina and Arizona, Biden was dominant by 2.4 percentage points and 4.0 percentage points, respectively.

According to the national poll average of eight organizations, Biden recorded 49.5% of approval rating, far surpassing President Trump (40.1%) by 9.4% points.

The Hill said the Trump camp is spending money to defend Ohio and Iowa, which won big in the last presidential election.

But Biden did not invest much resources in the two regions, The Hill explained, but was on par with President Trump.

In this week's Quinniac University survey, Biden led Ohio by 1 percentage point, while Trump had a 1 percentage point advantage in a recent Iowa local newspaper survey.

The Trump camp also hopes to overturn Hillary's victory in Minnesota, New Mexico, and New Hampshire, but there is no evidence of competitiveness in these states, according to Duhill.

In Texas and Georgia, the two sides are on the up and down, according to The Hill.

In Texas, Biden led the recent Fox News survey and Trump led by 1 percentage point in the Queen P.A. survey. In Georgia, Biden had a 2 percentage point lead in the survey released this month.

The Hill said many things could change about four months before Election Day (November 3), but added, "Biden now has a wide path to the White House," adding, "In particular, competitionist polls are getting worse for Trump."
