I. AGRICULTURE AND COMMERCE

News on *Nightside* at 10 p.m. – April 6, 2006

Duration: 00:00:50

Scott Inman reported that a new study has found that brand name chicken products sold in America are widely contaminated with arsenic. The Institute of Agriculture and Trade Policy sampled 90 orders of fried chicken from most major fast-food restaurants and 151 packages of raw chicken from supermarkets in Minnesota and California. Nearly three-quarters of the chicken from conventional producers contained some arsenic, while one-third of chickens from premium or organic producers contained arsenic. Every sample from fast-food restaurants had at least some arsenic. However, none were deemed unsafe by the federal government. The institute says some producers intentionally put arsenic into chicken feed. Arkansas-based Tyson Foods, the United State's largest chicken producer, did not have arsenic in its chicken.

Scott Inman reported that a large construction project over the Mississippi River will reach a milestone next week. Workers will put the final section into the new U.S. 82 bridge, connecting Lake Village, Arkansas and Greenville, Mississippi. The new bridge is considered a modern marvel. The old bridge is still functioning, still bridging the gap between Arkansas and Mississippi, but its sixty-six years old, only has two lanes, and has become dangerous for river traffic. The key to economic development in Mississippi and Arkansas, an up-to-date bridge is essential. That is why officials are excited about this 325 million dollar project, just a half mile downstream from the old bridge. The new U.S. 82 bridge will have four lanes of traffic, and will have outside and inside shoulders, which is something the old bridge does not have. Officials are hoping this opens the door to new commerce and new industry for both states. The new bridge is also a spectacle. It is being touted as the longest cable-stayed bridge on the Mississippi River. "This new bridge will be one of the most modern bridges in the United States, just as it should be, and as we look to the future for growth and economic jobs, this bridge will be a part of that." Crews still have to extend the highway to the new bridge, which will require nearly 10,000 feet of new roadway in Mississippi and more than 8,000 feet on the Arkansas side. The U.S. 82 bridge is not expected to open to traffic until 2009.

Beth Hunt reported on a new multi-million dollar project that is slated to join the River Market next year. A representative with the Central Arkansas Library says these buildings, which are currently fenced off for construction, will soon house Arkansas' largest manuscript collection. The plan is to revitalize and add on to two buildings located at President Clinton and Ottenheimer Avenues. The 70,000 square foot building will house the Arkansas History Institute, which will include museums, art, and meeting spaces. The addition to the existing structures will be built on the current parking lot at the corner of President Clinton and Commerce Streets.

Beth Hunt reported on bio-diesel fuel. The future is today as far as a small southern bio-diesel producer is concerned. This past Tuesday, officials with Tennessee Bioenergy of Coffey County, Tennessee explained how bio-diesel fuel can be the fuel of tomorrow. Company officials, flanked by U.S. Department of Agriculture officials, gathered in Nashville to unveil fuel derived from soybean oil and recycled veggie oil collected from schools and restaurants. The company received a grant from Washington in 2005, which allowed them to construct its first production facility.

II. CONSUMER AND LABOR

News on *Nightside* at 10 p.m. – April 24, 2006

Rusty Jackson reported on an upcoming rate hike for North Little Rock Electric customers. Customers should expect to see their electric bills go up by about 40%, but they will not see the increase all at once. Monday, North Little Rock Electric customers asked the mayor and city council members to ease them into the rate increase. The City Council however will not make any decisions on when the rate increase will start until North Little Rock Electric signs up with a new power provider, which is expected to happen by the end of May. At present, the utility buys its electricity from Duke Power for about 40 million dollars a year. The new supplier will charge about 70 million a year, which translates into a 40% jump in rates for the everyday consumer, which is why the City Council will probably vote to spread out the increase over a year's time. North Little Rock Electric will start getting its power from the new supplier on April 1, 2007.

News at 6pm – April 26, 2006

Pamela Smith reported on a citizen complaint about possible food poisoning, which prompted a wide-ranging inspection and ultimately the closure of a local convenience store. According to city officials, a customer says he bought unsafe meat at the Quick Stop on Arch Street. A claim the owner denies saying, "The store isn't closed for unsafe food, the store being closed for electric lines being wet from the rain." The owner of the Quick Stop is right about code officials shutting down his store for alleged electrical violations, but claims of food poisoning triggered the inspection. "It was really bad, probably one of the worst I've seen since I've been with the city," said Inspector Givens, referring to conditions he says he and the Fire Marshal found inside the store, including a leaky roof, in addition to unsafe and illegal wiring. "We want to keep every legitimate business open, if we can. However, it is the consumer that we want to protect. That is our main goal." The owner, Mr. Bishara was served notice and warned to get necessary repairs or the city could pull the plug on him permanently. "Hopefully, we'll be able to call the city and pass inspection again and after that continue doing business." Due to the initial complaints, plus documented complaints about spoiled food and rodents, a Health Department inspection will also be necessary before the Quick Stop can reopen.

News at 6pm – June 7, 2006

Jason Pederson reported in KATV's *7 on Your Side* segment that two pieces of exercise equipment have been recalled. 154,000 Gazelle Freestyle Cross Trainer gliders from Fitness Quest has been recalled because the resistance pins on the glider can come off during exercise, which can cause the user to fall off the machine. These gliders were sold on the Home Shopping Network and the Shopping Channel beginning in January 2004 for between \$200 and \$250. In addition, 700 Endurance Treadmills, which sold at fitness stores for about \$2500, have been recalled because unexpected speed changes have been known to cause users to lose control and fall. Two other recalls to tell you about - Hewlett Packard is recalling 250,000 digital cameras. The Photosmart 707 cameras can cause certain non-rechargeable batteries to overheat. The cameras sold for between \$250 and \$400 dollars. Finally 420,000 Black & Decker Coffeemakers are being recalled because the units may not turn off as programmed, causing the coffee maker to overheat and melt. These machines sold for the past two years for about \$40 each. For more information on these and other

III. CRIME AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE

News on *Live at 5* – April 4, 2006

Kate Sullivan on the recent arrest of Kevin Jones in the Nona Dirksmeyer murder case. After five days, he has posted bond. Jones was arrested last Friday and charged with first-degree murder in the death of the 19-year old Russellville beauty queen, who was found slain in her apartment last December. Bond was set at \$250,000 and he was able to post what is called a 10/90 bond, which is contingent upon certain conditions. Surrounded by family, 20-year-old Kevin Jones had little to say while leaving the Pope County Detention Facility, however, his attorney did. "He's holding up pretty good. About as good as you can after being accused of murdering the girl you love." Jones was released contingent upon paying \$25,000 dollars cash to the county. In addition, he cannot leave the state and he must check in with the Sheriff's Department no later than 4:00 p.m. every Friday. He has also been prohibited from visiting the Ms. Dirksmeyer's parents. His attorney continued, "I believe the evidence is going to show clearly he's innocent. Kevin Jones has been a fine citizen his whole life." However, Prosecutor David Gibbons said, "Obviously we have a good case or we wouldn't be here." A trial date has been set for January 16, 2007. Gibbons predicts pre-trial hearings could begin as soon as July. "It gives us a chance to get our witnesses subpoenaed and it gives us priority with the crime lab and medical examiners office." Ms. Dirksmeyer's brother, Greg said the family feels the \$250,000 bond was not enough for a murder charge. The Jones family had little to say today but they are happy that Kevin was released.

News on *Live at 5* – May 11, 2006

Pam Smith reported on Little Rock's 26th homicide this year. Residents living near the crime scene are still in shock after a woman was found dead in her apartment yesterday. Police are remaining tight-lipped about the investigation, and just released the name of the 28-year-old victim today. She's identified as Shaneda Ricks, a young mother who was a Red Cross employee working on her nursing degree. The neighborhood where Shaneda Ricks lived for just a few months is quiet today, with the only visible sign of the horrible crime being the police tape on her apartment door. Police discovered the body of the young woman inside the apartment Wednesday evening. While they won't confirm the exact cause of death, they will say it was definitely homicide, and that she suffered some sort of trauma. "She was a real nice person who always spoke. She'd bring her children down to play with my grandkids everyday." As police search for a killer, neighbor's like Beverly are trying to cope with something they say doesn't happen in the now secure surroundings of Madison Heights. The complex replaced Highland Park, an area once reputed for crime. "It's very quiet here. All the neighbors are real friendly." Obviously overcome with grief, Ms. Rick's family declined to comment. At 6, we will hear from a woman who's working to stop the violence.

News on *Daybreak* – 7-9 a.m. – June 5, 2006

Beth Hunt reported that State Crime Lab says it is making great progress in reducing the backlog of cases by almost two-thirds in just four months. It's a story we first brought you back in 2003, when the State Crime Lab began seeing nearly double the amount of cases as before. Now, the lab says increased funding has reduced the wait time for autopsies by at least half, averaging results in about three months. The reduction of cases is down from 16,000 in December 2005 to 6,500 today.

IV. DEFENSE AND VETERAN AFFAIRS (Secretary of State)

News on *Daybreak* – May 31, 2006

Jessica Morkert reported that the family of a highly decorated Saline County veteran continued celebrating Memorial Day even after the holiday was over. Tuesday, Greg Bagley received the many medals his grandfather earned years ago. The day after Pearl Harbor, Hughland Bagley was drafted. It was December 8, 1941. Bagley was a medic and served from the African Campaign to Europe and was discharged after the capture of Berlin. “He wasn’t as worried about rank and profile as he was about taking care of his guys and that’s something he instilled in me - if you take care of somebody else they’ll care of you.” Anxious to get home, Bagley arrived in Oklahoma and hitchhiked to his native Saline County to be with his family, without awaiting the opportunity to receive four distinguished medals, ranging from good conduct to the World War II Victory Medal. Tuesday, with family members celebrating, Bagley received those medals. “He wasn’t one to jump up and down for personal glory. He was a very quiet person and we are very proud.”

News on *Live at 5* – June 1, 2006

Christina Muñoz reported that the 10,000-strong Arkansas National Guard will soon have a new leader. Adjutant General Don Morrow announced his retirement in April and now Governor Huckabee has announced his replacement. In the words of the governor, the mission of the Arkansas National Guard has changed over recent years - they’re not just called up when natural disasters strike - they’re asked to leave their families and head into the face of danger. “And, not simply to go out for a weekend, a month or a couple weeks during the summer, they are asked to make deployments of 18 months and to face combat. To literally dodge the bombs and bullets intended to kill.” That change encouraged the Governor to appoint Major General Ron Chastain as the Arkansas National Guard’s new Adjutant General. Huckabee said he wanted someone who had served in the field in the global War on Terrorism. Chastain is a 30-year military veteran and he commanded the 39th Brigade Combat Team during Operation Iraqi Freedom. “I pledge to continue to improve the readiness of the Arkansas National Guard units for both that state missions and that federal mission, and at the same time I’ve got to go also looking out after our airman, our soldiers, and all their families here in Arkansas.” A governor’s search committee recommended General Chastain. He’ll take over as Adjutant General on July 15.

V. EDUCATION AND YOUTH

News on *Daybreak* – April 12, 2006

Beth Hunt reported that Governor Huckabee has signed twenty-two education bills into law. The new legislation will give more than \$130 million additional dollars to Arkansas public schools, with \$50 million going toward facility improvements and \$13 million allocated for isolated and declining districts. The minimum teacher salary has also been raised, which is very good news for large schools districts, like the Little Rock School District, where teachers are already paid well above the state minimum. However, for smaller districts, like Heber Springs, the majority of their money must be used for teacher pay. Heber Springs will also not get any money for facility improvements because of their high dollar property value. “We’re one of eleven districts in the state that are considered wealthy and we will receive little or no facility funding at all.” Heber Springs did receive nearly \$400,000 new dollars in foundation funding, however.

News at 6pm – May 18, 2006

Anne Pressly reported that statistics show parolees with a job are far less likely to return to prison. Several hundred Arkansas inmates are one step closer to being able to get a job because today they earned their G.E.D. Since 1997, state law requires all inmates entering the prison system without proof of a diploma to at least attempt classes for the high school equivalency examination. “For one reason or another, these are inmates who did not make it in the regular school system. Many of them thought they couldn't learn, and they've proved to themselves, and everyone else, that they could.” Once the excitement of graduation day fades, the reality of eventually re-entering the work force sets in for an inmate. It Lloyd Blanton’s mission to make the transition from parolee to employee a little easier. “For me to be able to tell an employer that they've got they're G.E.D., it shows that they have an education and thus, the ability to learn.” One of Mr. Blanton’s success stories is Mark Peeler, who earned his G.E.D. while serving time at the Grimes Unit in Newport. “It was a relief. I quit school in 19th grade and it is nice to finally have my G.E.D.” Three weeks after being released, Peeler was able to secure a job driving feed for a company in White County. It is hard for ex-cons to get job, but with Mr. Blanton’s help, it is a lot easier. Prison officials say parolees with a job are 14% less likely to recidivate.

Scott Inman reported that today was a very special day for KATV’s *Partners in Education*, Jefferson Elementary School, with whom we have a long history. During today’s 5th Grade Commencement, KATV’s Pamela Smith presented George Elrod with top honors. Elrod received the KATV *Spirit Award* after being nominated by teachers for his outstanding achievement and character. Our congratulations to all of the Jefferson Elementary 5th Grade graduates.

VI. HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

News on *Saturday Daybreak* – April 1, 2006

Pam Smith reported on the *Arkansas Smoke-Free Challenge*. According to experts, children are especially vulnerable to the dangers of second hand smoke. That is why Arkansas health leaders have designated next week for the *Arkansas Smoke-Free Challenge*. The goal: to raise awareness about the need for smoke-free environments for children, and the damaging health effects from second-hand smoke. “We have an obligation to move Arkansas forward taking the smoke-free pledge as individuals, as families, as businesses, as municipalities, and hopefully as a state. It’s a choice we need to make to protect our future.” The *Arkansas Smoke-Free Challenge* runs April 2-8.

News on *Daybreak* – May 19, 2006

Beth Hunt reported that the number of reported mumps cases in the State of Arkansas has climbed to seven. Health officials said yesterday that two cases have been reported in White County. Clark, Drew, Little River, Lonoke and Pulaski counties have each reported one case as well. More than 1700 cases have been reported in Iowa. Mumps is spread by coughing and sneezing and the most common symptoms are fever, headache, and swollen glands near the jaw.

News on *Nightside* at 10 p.m. – June 8, 2006

Christian Muñoz reported on a potentially major advance in public health. The government has approved a vaccine that may save the lives of thousands of woman, who might otherwise be lost to cancer. In a landmark breakthrough, the F.D.A. has approved the first vaccine that has been proven to protect women from one of the most deadly forms of cancer. “We can now include the worst types of H.P.V. in the group of illnesses that no one need suffer or die from ever again.” Cervical cancer kills nearly 300,000 women around the world every year, including 3,700 American women. For example, it claimed Heather Martin’s life when she was only 28 years old. “The cancer progressed so rapidly and she got sick so fast. She did one round of chemo, one round of radiation. Unfortunately, it did not work.” Two-thirds of cervical cancer cases are caused by a common group of viruses called Human Papillomavirus Virus or H.P.V. “H.P.V. is the most common sexually transmitted infection. And, yes, most women will have an H.P.V. infection before they die.” The vaccine, called Gardasil, has been shown to be 100% effective in blocking the H.P.V. Viruses, which cause cervical cancer, as well as the viruses that cause genital warts. Medical experts say the vaccine would be best administered to young girls, before they become sexually active, even if they intend to be abstinent. However, there is debate about whether a drug that prevents a sexually transmitted disease virus, even one that also prevents cancer, should be mandatory. Doctors say not everyone with H.P.V. will develop cancer. In fact, the virus often goes away on its own, and there is no treatment that will eliminate H.P.V.

VII. POLITICS (Treasury, Housing, Urban Development)

Pam Smith reported on the Little Rock housing market. National experts say Little Rock is a city where you can get the most value for your money, ranking it among the top ten real estate leaders in the country. Little Rock has been forecasted by bankrate.com as one of 10 real estate markets that will remain strong. The prediction includes the housing, condominium and commercial properties. With an average price of \$145,000, housing here said to be 17% less than what it could be. “Little Rock has been a very stable market, consistent growth, job availability, good economy; many areas of Arkansas have almost reacted like they are inflation-proof, depression proof.” “We don’t want the bubble. We want that good steady, solid, consistent growth. I think that’s the direction we’ve been at and that’s still where we’re headed.” Little Rock ranked among elite company. News at 6pm – May 11, 2006

Anne Pressly reported that new statistics from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development show Arkansans' income has decreased from 2005 to 2006. Experts say the housing market is still strong for now, but fewer and fewer people are going to be able to qualify for mortgages as incomes continue to drop. The median annual income for Pulaski County residents was just over \$54,000 in 2005, but that number has dropped to \$51,500 this year. At the same time, the median cost for a house has gone up from last year, meaning fewer people will be able to buy into the American dream. Lenders say recent rate hikes by the federal government are also affecting loans.

Scott Inman reported that President Bush named a new Treasury Secretary this morning. If confirmed, Henry Paulson, Jr. will replace John Snow, who announced today that he is leaving office. Paulson has served as chairman of the Goldman Sachs Group, one of the country's premier financial firms, for eight years. Paulson will take a major pay cut - in 2004, he earned \$30-million, and if confirmed, he will leave the firm at a time when its stock is trading at historic highs.

VIII. SPIRIT AND LEISURE (Interior)

News at 6pm – April 19, 2006

Anne Pressly reported on the fun in Hot Springs during the Derby weekend. Whether they are winners or losers, officials tell me bigger purses are making for bigger business all over the “spa city.” The winners at Friday’s Fantasy and Saturday’s Derby Day will not be limited to the ponies at the track. McClard’s Barbeque says record numbers at Oaklawn Park are making for record profits at his restaurant and at the Arlington Hotel, the lobby is filled with people in town for the races. Longtime General Manager Horace Fisher says he has not seen the historical landmark this busy in years, and he says it is all thanks to racing season. Both Fisher and McClard say the money they make has been a direct reflection of performance at the track. 2006 is looking to be one of the best in Oaklawn’s 102-season history.

News on *Nightside* at 10 p.m. – May 19, 2006

Michelle Rupp reported on the “spirits” of Arkansas. The Natural State is known for its hunting, fishing and farming, but it is also making a name for itself for producing beer and wine. When it comes to brewing a nice cold one in Little Rock, two brewpubs and one brewery say they do it best. Vino’s claims to be Little Rock’s original brewpub, opening in the early 1990’s. Brew-master Bill Riffle has been perfecting his brew for the last 15 years. “I’ve worked on them, tweaked a bit to fit our system and I’ve experimented with a few types I haven’t done at home, so I do get a lot of freedom.” Seven of Riffle’s beers are on tap on a regular basis. A few blocks down, in the heart of the River Market is Little Rock’s second brewpub - Bosco’s. Known as the “restaurant for beer lovers,” it takes roughly two weeks from tanks to tap. “There are beers that take 13-14 days, beers that take 3-4 days longer. It really depends on the properties of what we put into each beer.” At Arkansas’ award winning brewery, Diamond Bear, the process starts with grain, which is sent to the mash where the grain is mixed with hot water, then to the sparge to get rid of any remaining sugars. This is where people think of the brewing process, in the brew kettle itself, but the whole process is brewing beer. The brew kettle is where we boil it and that’s where we add hops.” After the boil, the batches are stacked on top of each other. Ales will ferment for 14 days, lagers, 21. Then it is off to the bottling room. “Here at Diamond Bear, more than 50 bottles are filled with beer per minute. They are then packaged and shipped all across the state.” Besides restaurants and grocery stores, Diamond Bear, beer will be available in Southwest Missouri by Memorial Day. “Some people know about us but more and more are learning about us and they find out there’s a brewery here and it’s produced some of the top beers in the world and they’re pretty astonished about that.” “Good wine is made in the vineyard. If you goof up in the vineyard you’ve goofed the wine up.” In Franklin County, Highway 186 is lined with vineyards. Some belong to the Wiederkehr family, who settled here 126 years ago. Al Wiederkehr says these vines grow naturally in the wild, in this part of the state. “We’re the oldest winery in Mid-America with a bonded wine cellar. Ours is U.S. bonded Wine Cellar Number 8. Those in California are 4,700, which shows you how long we’ve been here.” Some wine is aged for years before being bottled and served. Another winery in Altus is Post Familie Vineyards. Paul Post says what sets their wines apart from the others is the fruity style, with Muscatine wine being their top seller. “This is something that’s a southern drink. Anybody that has been in the South will remember the smell of September, harvest and Muscadine. It is a big, juicy, wonderful native grape to the south.” Both Wiederkehr and Post Familie Wine’s are available throughout the state. For more information log onto website at katv.com.

Barry Brandt reported that one of the biggest state parks in Arkansas is just minutes from downtown Little Rock. Hiking, fishing, and even paddleboats are just a few of the activities for families at Pinnacle Mountain State Park. The park is a 2,000-acre nature preserve, with 40 miles of trails, including a hike up to the top of Pinnacle Mountain. In addition, the picnic area is one of the most popular areas. The park is also the largest environmental education park in the state and it offers visitors a rare glimpse at the flora and fauna native to Arkansas. “The exhibit area, where we have examples of alligators, mammals, even a live active beehive can be found there.” Children can explore nature through the park’s Summer Discovery Day Camps and there are seminars for adults too throughout the year. Pinnacle Mountain State Park is just west of Little Rock on the Arkansas River. There is no camping at the park, but campsites are available at nearby Maumelle Park.

IX. TRANSPORTATION AND ENERGY

News on *Live at 5 p.m.* – April 11, 2006

Scott Inman reported on increasing gasoline prices. To some it seems impossible, or at least improbable, but this summer, it may cost even more than last year to fill your gas tank. The Energy Department expects prices to rise between ten and fifteen cents per gallon in the coming weeks, peaking next month. Gasoline prices have started their seasonal climb – a bit early this year. Over the last two weeks the price of gasoline has climbed nearly 20 cents and in some areas even higher, and consumers want to know why. According to the Department of Energy, this summer regular gasoline is expected to cost an average of \$2.62 a gallon, which is twenty-five cents higher than last year. Department of Energy officials say higher demand, crude prices and the phasing out of the water polluting fuel additive mean shortages and higher prices. Most people agree that gas prices are a financial hardship and some want the government to do something about it.

Rusty Jackson reported that with gasoline costing \$3 a gallon, electric bills climbing and the cost of living getting out of hand, John Carroll, an organic grocery store manager, has found a solution to the rising prices. He bikes to and from work every day, and when he comes home, he makes bio-diesel gas for the car he says he only drives on the weekend. Carroll also installed solar panels on his roof and now he produces four times the amount of electricity he needs in his home. The local power company is actually paying him at the end of the month. Carroll also has a composting toilet, which he uses for his garden.

News at 6pm – May 10, 2006

Scott Inman reported that some of the first hard numbers were released today on how much impact the natural gas boom is having on the state. A University of Arkansas study estimates gas companies presence in the state had an economic impact of more than \$520 million last year, created more than 2,000, and will have brought in more than \$28 million in tax revenue. The predictions for the future are even bigger. The study estimates companies will spend \$3.8 billion by the end of 2008 leasing land, and drilling in the Fayetteville shale rock formation, which is now believed to house huge amounts of natural gas. “If you do some numbers, based on the area that we’ve now drilled in, we could see there is seven-trillion cubic feet of gas there. That’s a big number.” “Maybe seven-trillion cubic feet is enough gas to fuel a city of a million people for a hundred years.” The study was funded by Southwestern Energy Company.

Beth Hunt reported that keeping wounded soldiers in Iraq comfortable is the mission of one Arkansas Girl Scout Troop. The Jacksonville Air Base Girl Scouts and the Jacksonville Museum of Military History hosted “Operation Quiet Comfort” yesterday. The project makes denim quilts signed with get-well messages to hand out to wounded men and women in uniform. Arkansans were invited to express their gratitude on scraps of denim yesterday, which the Girl Scouts will sew into quilts. The project is ongoing, and the museum is collecting clean unwanted jeans to make more quilts.

News at 6pm – April 25, 2006

Christina Muñoz reported on Women’s Equal Pay Day. Every April working women across the country team up for a national day of action promoting fair pay. This morning members of Arkansas’ Business and Professional Women’s organization unveiled a popular primarily women’s art form that they have used to bring attention to the wage gap between working men and women. The group has designed a quilt with each block representing issues of equal pay. Organizers say the quilt is a work in progress, just like the efforts of women getting the same pay as men. “We’ve come a long way since 1919, but we still do not have an equal playing field and we still have a long way to go. Through the work of BPW, we will continue to improve the working rights and equity of women.”. 2032 is the projected year of when pay will be equal for working women in Arkansas. Organizers say the quilt will not be hemmed or bound until that time.

News on *Live at 5 p.m.* – May 15, 2006

Duration: 00:00:55

Jason Pederson reported in KATV’s *Seven on Your Side* report that when it comes to signing up for Medicare prescription drug coverage, the sand in the hourglass is about to run out. Penalties will kick in for anyone who tries to sign up for one of the many Medicare drug plans after midnight tonight. Since October 36 year-old Glen Johnson has helped thousands of older Americans pick the prescription drug plan that is best for them. Johnson is one of hundreds of young men and women who work at a Little Rock based call center. “Our call volume has gone from somewhere between 8-10,000 to 17-18,000 yesterday.” After a rocky start, recent polls suggest the Medicare sign up process has improved greatly, thanks in part to call centers like this one. Of those who have picked a plan, 65% are happy, 80% report no problems filling prescriptions, 42% have seen their drug costs drop, and 19% have seen an increase. Johnson says this weekend he helped his grandmother pick a plan. Johnson says helping seniors has been rewarding. “It’s a good feeling. Because, we imagine ourselves that way 30-40 years from now and we’ll have a lot of the same worries.” The Little Rock call center will close at seven but others around the country will be open for procrastinators. You can call 1-800-medicare if you need some last minute help picking a plan.

FCC Schedule for Closed-Captioning Requirements

The following phase-in schedule applies to the captioning and broadcast of all new programming. It is measured on a calendar-quarter basis and a 20-hour broadcast day, as programming between 2am and 6am does not have to be captioned.

- Between January 1, 2000, and December 31, 2001, program distributors must provide at least 450 hours of captioned programming per calendar quarter, which is approximately five hours per day. If the program distributor provides less than 450 hours of new programming, then 95 percent of its new programming must be captioned.
- Between January 1, 2002, and December 31, 2003, program distributors must provide at least 900 hours of captioned video programming per calendar quarter, or 10 hours per day. If the programming distributor provides less than 900 hours of new programming, then 95 percent of its new programming must be captioned.
- Between January 1, 2004, and December 31, 2005, program distributors must provide at least an average of 1,350 hours of captioned video programming per calendar quarter, or 15 hours per day. If the program distributor provides less than 1,350 hours of new programming, then 95 percent of its new programming must be captioned.
- **As of January 1, 2006, and thereafter, 100 percent of the program distributors' new programming must be captioned.**
