13. Consumer Matters / Insurance InfoTrak 12/29/19 8:37 Bob Rusbuldt, CEO of The Independent Insurance Agents & Brokers of America. A consumer survey commissioned by Mr. Rusbuldt's organization found that that many homeowners lack adequate insurance coverage, do not fully understand their homeowners policies and do not have enough savings to support their households in the event of a disaster. He discussed the most common misconceptions consumers have regarding homeowners insurance and what to do about it.
