At the start, the symptoms are often vague, a hand tremor or occasional stumbling. But as it progresses Parkinson's can become very debilitating. A great resource through the Michigan Parkinson Foundation is the Ann Arbor Parkinson Support Group, and something new in the fight against Parkinson's - boxing and the Rock Steady Boxing Program.

This is especially true when it comes to the most vulnerable among us, including persons with dementia and people who struggle with drug addiction. We will take a look at a new report on drug deaths in Washtenaw County, and then we learn about an effort to make the care for those with dementia safer. Both of these reports may surprise you, and it is hoped that by understanding what these vulnerable populations are facing we just might be able to help them live longer, healthier and more productive lives.

Individual Segments:

- Opioid and Overdose Deaths Escalate in Washtenaw County Kaitlin Schwarz, MPH, Epidemiologist, Washtenaw County Health Department -There has been a 33% increase in all drug overdose deaths from 2020 to 2022 in Washtenaw County. The proportion of local opioid deaths that involved fentanyl, non-opioid substances, stimulants like cocaine, and xylazine also continued to increase.
- Requiring Professional Guardians to Be Trained in Dementia Matt Phelan,
 Public Policy Manager, Alzheimer's Association Michigan Chapter Dementia training is not currently required in the state of Michigan for court appointed guardians. The Alzheimer's Association wants to change that.
