### Quarterly Issues Programs List for Stations WFRG-FM, WLZW-FM, WODZ-FM, WOUR-FM, and WIBX-AM

#### Section I. Issues.

The station has identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. Health and Wellness: Wendy Goetz, Executive Director of the Rescue Mission of Utica visited our stations and talked about the "Gourmet Guys" fundraiser to help fund programs for the homeless at the shelter. The event had nearly 300 people in attendance, and the Rescue Mission was able to raise nearly \$24,000 for Rescue Mission programs. Utica has been able to help decrease the homeless population by offering homes, and meals thanks to these donations. In 2019, the Rescue Mission was able to serve over 154,127 hot meals to homeless and underprivileged individuals here in Utica.
- B. Domestic Violence: Diane Stancato of the YWCA Mohawk Valley was interviewed on our stations and promoted October as Domestic Violence Awareness Month. We discussed special events happening during the month and services provided by the YWCA. YWCA Mohawk Valley is a certified provider of domestic and sexual violence crisis services by New York State. Gov. Andrew Cuomo signed a trio of bills expanding protections for domestic-abuse survivors. At the end of 2019, the YWCA will be expanding their services, thanks to a three-year, \$4.8 million grant through the New York State Office of Victim Services. The agency has already provided over 12,000 instances of service this year for local women and their families, many who are victims of domestic and sexual violence.
- C. Local Economy: Linda Winner of Cornell Cooperative Extension came on our stations to talk about the "Taste of Central New York" food show that promoted local food producers. The event highlighted many Central New York produced dairy products including Chobani Greek Yogurt and Herkimer Cheese. Chobani was founded locally, headquartered in Norwich, New York and is a major local employer. Herkimer Cheese has been in business in Central New York for over 65 years and is a third-generation family-owned business. Local food production is important to our local economy as our area is abundant with local Upstate farms.
- D. **Programs for the Homeless:** Wendy Goetz of the Rescue Mission of Utica was interviewed on our stations about the local issue of homelessness. She also promoted the 2019 Christmas dinner, and the need for warm winter clothing for homeless shelter habitants. Over 3,000 meals were delivered by the mission between the Thanksgiving and Christmas holiday season. Because of generous donations during the holiday season, they were able to complete a much needed expansion of their housing complexes in the city of Utica.
- E. **Finances**: Dave Kaveny of NBT bank stopped by and talked about the ever-changing banking industry in New York and informed our listeners about the community loan program. The Community Loan Program is offered to business in Central New York, and provides access to capital by pooling investments and donations from socially concerned individuals and organizations, and re-lending it to non-profit organizations for affordable housing and community services for our area. NBT offers free workshops, and education to Central New Yorkers to get this loan.
