Section I. Issues.

The station has identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. **State/National Politics:** The partial federal government shutdown and its effects on services in the Mohawk Valley were the subject of the 1/20 broadcast. Potential legalization of marijuana in New York State was featured on 2/10 and 2/17.
- B. **Budgets:** A review of the recently-passed budget in Oneida County was discussed on 3/17 with the county executive. On 3/24, the mayor of Utica joined the show for a conversation about the new city budget.
- C. **Infrastructure:** The process of snow removal and filling in associated potholes was talked about on 2/10. On 3/17, a closer look at developing infrastructure projects in Oneida County.
- D. **Weather Forecasting:** A discussion about how technology has changed weather forecasting, whether or not there's an overload of information with no context, and the role social media plays was featured on 1/27 and 2/3.
- E. **Community Appeal:** The United Way offers free tax programs, which was featured on 3/31.
- F. **Veterans Issues:** Veterans returning from overseas who are trying to assimilate back into civilian life, and related issues, was discussed on 1/13.
