Bullying Depression	Viewpoint	Jan 2	30 min	Tom Murphy, from Sweethearts and Heroes, was in studio to discuss the work of Sweethearts and Heroes. They travel around the country speaking at middle and high schools about bullying and how we can fight bullying and what we can do.
Policing	Viewpoint	Feb 6	30 min	John Murad, the acing Burlington Police Chief was on the show to talk about Policing issues in Burlington. He also discussed how the Burlington City Council rejected the mayor's proposal to make Murad the permanent Chief of Police.

COVID-19	Viewpoint	Feb 20	15 min	Governor Phil Scott was on the show to talk about the COVID-19 Pandemic and the state's response as numbers are dropping with the Omicron Variant.

Local Government Workforce Crisis	Viewpoint	Feb 27	15 min	Becca Balint, the Vermont Senate Pro Tempore, was on the show to talk about the challenges of running the senate on Zoom and the plans to return to in person. She also talked about the workforce crisis facing the state.
Local Policing	Viewpoint	Mar 6	15 min	Norma Hardy, Brattleboro Police Chief, is the first African American Police Chief in state. She was on the show to talk about some of the new initiatives she is implementing in her department.

Civic Engagement Voting	Viewpoint	Mar 6	15 min	Lt Governor Molly Gray was on the show to talk about some of the bills being taken up at the state. One of the bills would allow 16-year-old residents in Brattleboro to vote in local elections.
School Construction Infrastructure Planning	Viewpoint	Mar 13	15 min	Tom Flanagan, Burlington School District Superintendent, was on the show to discuss the plans moving forward to build a new High School and Tech Center. The former building was deemed unsafe due to high levels of PCBs.

With Omicron numbers dropping in the state, they are now winding down the state-run vaccination clinics and testing sites. He also talked the arrival of BA2 variant of Omicron in the state.
