FARMERS ACROSS ALABAMA ARE BEGINNING THEIR PLANTING SEASONS...BUT COVID-19 IS AFFECTING PRICES AND HOW MUCH MONEY FARMERS CAN MAKE FROM SELLING THEM. ABC 33-40'S LAUREN WALSH SPOKE WITH A FARMER IN TALLADEGA COUNTY WHO SAYS THE LOWER PRICES WILL MAKE IT HARD TO MAKE A PROFIT. COVER WITH JEREMY ON TRACTOR 6:14 WE'RE JUST OUT HERE TRYING TO MAKE A LIVING. CORN, COTTON AND SOYBEANS MAKE THAT LIVING FOR JEREMY WILSON. THIS PLANTING SEASON - IS TOUGHER THEN MOST. IT'S A LOT EASIER TO PUT A CROP IN WHEN YOU CAN SEE A PROFIT AT THE END OF THE YEAR AND RIGHT NOW IT MAKES IT DIFFICULT TO PUT A CROP IN BUT WE DON'T HAVE A CHOICE. IT'S WHAT WE DO. WILSON SAYS CROP PRICES WERE ALREADY HURT BY TARIFFS....AND THEY DROPPED MORE- DURING THIS COVID-19 PANDEMIC. IT MADE IT MUCH WORSE. WE WERE ALREADY VERY THIN ON OUR MARGINS, ON WHAT WE COULD MAKE. AND NOW WITH THE CORONAVIRUS, THAT HAS GONE THROUGH THE FLOOR....THE PRICE OF COTTON RIGHT NOW IS ABOUT 52 CENTS A POUND. AND BEFORE THE CORONAVIRUS, IT WAS TRADING AT 70 CENTS PER POUND. MAKING A PROFIT ISN'T ONLY IMPORTANT FOR HIS FAMILY...IF FARMERS ARE HURTING, THAT CAN CREATE A PROBLEM ON EVERYBODY'S END- WHEN THEY GO TO THE GROCERY STORE OR THEY GO BUY CLOTHES OR ANYTHING ELSE. HE'S FOCUSED ON SOCIAL DISTANCING...AND STAYING HEALTHY-- SO HE CAN PLANT MORE CROPS THIS YEAR. OUR HOPES ARE THAT WE GET BACK TO A NORMAL LIFESTYLE. I THINK IF WE CAN DO THAT, PRICES WILL COME BACK AND WE CAN SURVIVE AND FARM ANOTHER YEAR WHICH IS ALWAYS THE GOAL. CONTINUED OPTIMISM- FROM A 4TH GENERATION FARMER. A-B-C 33/40S ALEX DERENCZ WAS IN CHILTON COUNTY TODAY TO FIND OUT HOW THINGS ARE LOOKING THIS YEAR. IF ANYONE IS GLAD TO SEE THE 2020 CALENDAR PAGES TURN-IT'S THE FOLKS AT BOOZER FARMS-TAYLOR HATCHETT/BOOZER FARMS 10 SECONDS "FARMERS HAVE TO BE PRETTY FLEXIBLE AND ROLL WITH THE PUNCHES. 2020 HAS JUST GIVEN US EVEN MORE OF AN OPPORTUNITY TO SHOW WHAT THE FARMERS IN THE STATE OF ALABAMA ARE ABLE TO DO AND ABLE TO WORK WITH." AT ONE POINT-HATCHETT WAS CONCERNED-THAT HER WORKERS WHO COME OVER FROM MEXICO-WOULD NOT BE ABLE TO MAKE IT-POTENTIALLY LEADING A DECREASE IN QUANTITY FROM THE FARM-BUT SHE AND OTHER FARMS HAVE NOT HAD ANY LABOR ISSUES-AND THIS WAS ON TOP OF-LOWER CHILL HOURS-HEAVY RAIN AND ALREADY STRESSED TREES-WHEN IT COMES TO THE COUNTY'S FAMOUS PEACHES "ALL IN ALL, I WOULD SAY IT IS GOING TO BE A GOOD YEAR FOR PEACH GROWERS. AS MORE PROCESSING PLANTS CLOSE NATIONWIDE -- ALABAMA FARMERS EXPECT EVEN MORE LOSSES. "THE UNCERTAINTY IS WE DON'T KNOW WHERE WE'RE GOING TO BE TWO MONTHS FROM NOW - WHEN THEY KEEP TELLING US IT'S PROBABLY GOING TO GET WORSE," MARK KAISER'S FAMILY HAS BEEN WORKING THE LAND HERE IN BALDWIN COUNTY FOR NEARLY A CENTURY...TONIGHT - THEY CONTINUE TO RAISE CATTLE AT THEIR ELSANOR FARM - AND SHIP THEM ACROSS THE COUNTRY...BUT HE SAYS THE VALUE IS CRASHING - AS COVID 19 KEEPS CLOSING FOOD PROCESSING PLANTS NATIONWIDE. KAISER "THE FEEDLOTS ARE FINDING THEY DON'T HAVE A MARKET FOR THEIR CATTLE - SO THEY'RE PAYING LESS FOR OUR CATTLE. RIGHT NOW, IF I WAS TO MARKET OUR CATTLE, THEY'D BRING IN ABOUT 200 DOLLARS LESS A PIECE," AND KAISER SAYS IT COULD NOT ONLY IMPACT THE MEAT SECTION OF YOUR SUPERMARKET - BUT WHAT YOUR FAMILY WILL PAY...KAISER "THE PRICES FOR ANIMAL PROTEINS ARE GOING TO GO UP - AND THE PRICES I RECEIVE FOR MY CATTLE WILL GO DOWN. SO IT'LL BE DEVASTATING FOR THE PRODUCER AND NOT GOOD FOR THE CONSUMER," THE CORONAVIRUS SHUTDOWN IS ALSO IMPACTING LOCAL PRODUCE FARMERS...GREG BURRIS SAYS HE'S LUCKY TO HAVE LOCAL SUPPORT THROUGH HIS STOREFRONT - BUT THE LOSS OF TOURISM IS A BIG BLOW. GREG BURRIS, BURRIS FARM MARKET "IT'S OUR SECOND YEAR BEING BACK IN BUSINESS AND WE WERE DOING GOOD

AND THEN THIS HIT. WE HAVEN'T EVEN LOOKED TO SEE WHAT OUR SALES WERE IN APRIL," MEANWHILE - KAISER SAYS THERE'S A 30% DECREASE IN THE AMOUNT OF CATTLE BEING PROCESSED - COMPARED TO LAST MONTH...KAISER "IT CAN KEEP YOU UP AT NIGHT - WORRYING ABOUT IT. SO YOU TRY NOT TO. YOU JUST KEEP GOING DAY TO DAY AND HOPE FOR THE BEST" THAT WAS CORY PIPPIN REPORTING. FARMERS ALL ACROSS THE COUNTRY SAY THEY ARE DEALING WITH THIS PROBLEM. AS FOR MARK KAISER -- HE SAYS HE IS ALWAYS LOOKING TO CUT COSTS, BUT HE HAS CUT AS MUCH AS HE CAN.

II. CRIME AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE

AS WE'VE SEEN WITH COVID-19...RULES AND REGULATIONS AROUND ANY DRUG TESTING REQUIRE HUMAN TRIALS TO MEET ETHICAL GUIDELINES, HOWEVER, FULL MEASURE'S SHARYL ATKISSON REPORTS THOSE GUIDELINES ARE NOT ALWAYS FOLLOWED. THIS IS THE STORY OF PRISON INMATES AND A DRUG THAT TREATS ADDICTION. SHARYL: ALVIN DUTRUCH WAS 24-YEARS OLD BACK IN 2004, WHEN HE BROKE HIS BACK IN A CAR ACCIDENT. HIS DOCTOR PRESCRIBED AN OPIOID MEDICINE. ALVIN DUTRUCH: WHAT HAD HAPPENED IS THAT I BECAME COMPLETELY DEPENDENT ON THAT PAIN MEDICATION. I ENDED UP STEALING A PRESCRIPTION PAD FROM ONE OF THE PHYSICIANS THAT I WAS SEEING AT THE TIME. AND I STARTED WRITING MY OWN PRESCRIPTIONS, AND THAT'S WHAT LANDED ME IN JAIL. LAST MAY, WHILE DOING TIME AT LOUISIANA STATE PENITENTIARY, A PRISON EDUCATION PROGRAM OFFERED HIM THE CHANCE TO TRY A FREE MEDICAL IMPLANT TO CURE HIS ADDICTION. HE TOOK IT. THE IMPLANT, SURGICALLY INSERTED INTO SKIN ON HIS ABDOMEN, SLOWLY RELEASED A MEDICINE CALLED NALTREXONE TO REDUCE OPIOID CRAVINGS. DUTRUCH: I GOT THE IMPLANT ONE WEEK BEFORE MY RELEASE, AND WITHIN JUST HOURS UPON HAVING THE IMPLANT, I COULD AUTOMATICALLY TELL THAT THERE WAS A DIFFERENCE IN THE WAY I VIEWED THINGS. THAT METAPHORICAL MONKEY THAT WAS ON MY BACK, THAT WAS GONE. THAT MIGHT BE THE END OF A POSITIVE STORY IF IT WEREN'T FOR ONE DETAIL. THE IMPLANT IS NOT APPROVED BY THE FOOD AND DRUG ADMINISTRATION. DR. MICHAEL CAROME OF THE WATCHDOG PUBLIC CITIZEN SAYS THE MAKER OF NALTREXONE, BIOCORRX, SIDESTEPED STRICT FEDERAL RULES, USING DUTRUCH AS A HUMAN GUINEA PIG IN AN UNAPPROVED STUDY. DR. MICHAEL CAROME: THE PLAN WAS TO TEST IT IN PRISONERS TO SEE IF IT IS EFFECTIVE FOR TREATING OPIOID AND ALCOHOL ADDICTION, AND THAT WAS DONE WITHOUT COMPLYING WITH THE FEDERAL RULES, THE FDA REGULATIONS FOR OVERSIGHT OF HUMAN RESEARCH AND FOR PROTECTING HUMAN SUBJECTS. BIOCORRX, MAKERS OF THE NALTREXONE SAY THEIR PROGRAM WITH THE LOUISIANA DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS DID NOT QUALIFY AS A "STUDY" AND COUNTLESS DOCTORS HAVE USED NALTREXONE IMPLANTS ON PATIENTS FOR OVER TWENTY YEARS FROM LICENSED COMPOUNDING PHARMACIES, LONG BEFORE THE EXISTENCE OF BIOCORRX. THE FDA HAS NOT SAID WHETHER IT WILL INVESTIGATE BUT CAROME SAYS THE HARD TRUTH IS, EVEN IF IT FOUND ISSUES, NOT MUCH WOULD LIKELY HAPPEN IN TODAY'S CLIMATE. DR. CAROME: UNFORTUNATELY, THE VIOLATIONS OF THE FEDERAL REGULATIONS DON'T CARRY WITH THEM ANY PENALTIES. YOU CAN'T BE FINED, YOU CAN'T BE PUT IN JAIL. DR. CAROME SAYS ANY COMPANIES OR RESEARCHERS FOUND TO HAVE VIOLATED HUMAN ETHICS RULES SHOULD BE CALLED OUT AND PROHIBITED FROM GETTING FEDERAL MONEY FOR FUTURE STUDIES. FOR FULL MEASURE, I'M SHARYL ATKISSON.

RESTRICTIONS PUT IN PLACE TO BATTLE THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC HAVE CHANGED PRACTICALLY EVERYONE'S LIFE. PEOPLE ARE WORKING FROM HOME NON ESSENTIAL BUSINESSES ARE CLOSED. WE WANTED TO KNOW IF ANY OF THAT HAS HAD AN IMPACT ON CRIME. THE I-TEAM'S BRIAN PIA LOOKED AT SOME EARLY NUMBERS ACROSS THE METRO AREA. THIS IS DOWNTOWN BESSEMER. IT'S QUIET—JUST LIKE MANY CITIES ACROSS ALABAMA. BUT SINCE THE BEGINNING OF THE YEAR, THERE HAVE BEEN NINE HOMICIDES—SEVEN HAVE OCCURRED SINCE MARCH 21. THAT'S HIGHER THAN NORMAL. LT. CHRISTIAN CLEMONS WITH THE BESSEMER POLICE DEPARTMENT SAYS COVID-19 IS NOT HAVING AN IMPACT WHEN IT COMES TO THE MOST VIOLENT OF CRIMES. LT. CHRISTIAN CLEMONS/BESSEMER POLICE DEPARTMENT "EACH HOMICIDE WE'VE WORKED SO FAR, THERE IS AN UNDERLYING ISSUE THAT'S ALREADY THERE. IT'S NOT SOMETHING WE CAN DIRECTLY LINK TO COVID." CLEMMONS SAYS POLICE ARE KEEPING A CLOSE EYE ON TEMPORARILY CLOSED BUSINESSES, SO THEY DON'T BECOME SITTING DUCKS FOR CROOKS. THERE HAS BEEN A DECLINE IN BUSINESS BURGLARIES. CLEMONS SAYS HOME BURGLARIES HAVE DECLINED RECENTLY SINCE MORE PEOPLE ARE STAYING HOME AND CROOKS DON'T WANT TO HAVE A CONFRONTATION WITH HOMEOWNERS. LT. CHRISTIAN CLEMONS/BESSEMER POLICE DEPARTMENT "MOST OF THE TIME, PEOPLE WILL TRY TO GET AWAY WITH WHAT THEY CAN GET AWAY WITH. THEY CERTAINLY DON'T WANT TO BE DETECTED. IN HOOVER, POLICE SAY CALL VOLUME IS DOWN. BUT IT REMAINS TO BE SEEN HOW COVID-19 WILL AFFECT THE CITY'S CRIME STATS IN THE LONG TERM. IN BIRMINGHAM, THE CITY IS MOVING AT A MUCH SLOWER PACE DUE TO COVID-19

RESTRICTIONS. VIOLENT AND PROPERTY CRIMES ARE DOWN OVER THE PAST 12 MONTHS—BUT IT'S TOO EARLY TO SAY IF THE COVID-19 RESTRICTIONS WILL KEEP CRIME AT BAY. BRIAN PIA ABC 33/40 NEWS. BESSEMER POLICE LT. CLEMONS SAYS AS PEOPLE COME TOGETHER DURING THIS TIME OF CRISIS, HE HOPES THAT WILL LOWER THE CRIME RATE DOWN. BY COMPARISON...THE CITY OF LOS ANGELES REPORTS A 23 PERCENT DROP IN CRIME SINCE THE PANDEMIC BEGAN.

WHY IS IT SO IMPORTANT TO BE TOGETHER WITH CLASSMATES? ACCORDING TO THE ACADEMY'S REPORT...LONG TIMES AWAY FROM SCHOOL-CAN NOT ONLY LEAD TO EDUCATIONAL AND SOCIAL IMPACTS-BUT PHYSICAL IMPACTS AS WELL SOT DR. DAVID KIMBERLIN/PROFESSOR OF PEDIATRICS UAB 'THESE LAST SEVERAL MONTHS HAVE TAUGHT US JUST HOW IMPORTANT SCHOOL IS. PARENTS HAVE DONE A SUPERB JOB OF TRYING TO DO THE HOME LEARNING AND BEING OF ASSISTANCE THERE AND HAVE REALLY DONE A GOOD JOB, BUT THAT SAID, WE ARE SEEING THE IMPACT OF CHILDREN NOT BEING IN THEIR SCHOOLS AT THE END OF THIS SCHOOL YEAR AND THAT IMPACT, DEPENDING ON THE AGE OF THE CHILD, THAT IMPACT MIGHT BE LASTING." IT TAKES A COMMUNITY-TO MAKE THIS YEAR GO SMOOTHLY-ALEX DERENCZ A-B-C 33/40 NEWS KIMBERLIN ADDS PARENTS NEED TO WATCH THEIR CHILD'S HEALTH EVEN MORE CLOSELY THIS SCHOOL YEAR. IF A CHILD HAS ANY SYMPTOMS THAT COULD BE COVID-19...DO NOT SEND THE CHILD TO SCHOOL.
