Lubbock has numerous facilities targeting this demographic and while the problem is still growing, there is much being done to help. Sadly, there is an urgent need for foster parents in Lubbock.

- **4. Medical Care.** Organizations in Lubbock that provide healthcare and that help families of children from out of town are featured.
