A. *EDUCATION*

Title: CHILD CARE ORDINANCE

Broadcast Date: 7-16

Duration: 2:04

Description: A Pocatello advisory committee has recommended additional guidelines for city day care operations. The effort began after a child was injured at a home day care and taken to the emergency room. It would modify requirements for licenses, all aimed at protecting children. Modifications also include transportation, overnight care, and penalties for violations.

Title: STUDENT SLEEP

Broadcast Date: 8-11

Duration: 2:31

Description: Research indicates most teenagers are not getting enough sleep. It can lead to major health risks. Energy drinks and electronics are keeping kids too distracted. While teens need about nine hours of sleep per night, heavy work loads and distractions make it difficult. But, the stakes are high....including heart attacks, strokes, high blood pressure, diabetes, 20

different types of cancer, etc. Bonneville High School tried a late start, but found little academic gain.

Title: D93 AFTER SCHOOL

Broadcast Date: 9-3

Duration: 2:00

Description: The Bonneville School District has initiated a new program to provide daycare for parents at their children's elementary school. The "right club" provides activities and supervision provided primarily by BYU Idaho education students. In addition to the early and late-hour convenience, studies have shown such services also improve test scores, fitness, health and nutrition.

B. HEALTH/ENVIRONMENT

Title: BONNEVILLE HYDRO PROJECT

Broadcast Date: 7-6

Duration: 2:22

Description: Two irrigation districts are proposing to construct hydro-electric facilities along the Snake River north of Idaho Falls. Supporters said it would generate 2.3 megawatts of electricity with little environmental effect. Neighbors, however, say that while that might be true when water supply is high during the summer, the impact would be more severe during the winter and have significant impact on waterfowl and fish.

Title: WEST NILE VIRUS

Broadcast Date: 7-16

Duration: 1:35

Description: Mosquitoes known to bear the West Nile Virus have been found in traps in Bingham County. Vector Disease Control is stepping up surveillance efforts and preparing to spray larvae in marshy areas. They are also encouraging the public to do all it can to eliminate standing water around their homes. Vector will increase fog treatments in areas where the actual virus was found.

Title: The PLAGUE

Broadcast Date: 8-26

Duration: 2:09

Description: The Centers for Disease Control has issued a warning that eleven cases of the plague have been reported in the USA since April. Three people have died. It has spread to six states and officials believe it may soon affect Idaho. The death-rate of the disease is high, but antibiotics are available to fight it. Prevention entails avoiding creatures that carry fleas.

Title: SAGE GROUSE ANNOUNCEMENT

Broadcast Date: 9-22

Duration: 2:18

Description: The US Department of Interior announced that it will not recommend endangered

species act protection for sage grouse. 100 land-use plans were approved across the western states. Environmental groups have mixed response. Some say the decision won't work, while others said it represented a good cooperative approach to a sensitive problem.

Title: EIRMC TRAUMA

Broadcast Date: 9-23

Duration: 1:47

Description: The Eastern Idaho Regional Medical Center recorded a 24 percent increase in its number of trauma cases this year. The center's protocol includes a determination on whether ambulance or helicopter is needed to provide immediate care, then ensuring that conditions for transportation are safe. As a "Level II" Center the hospital maintains a crew 24 hours per day that includes physicians, nurses, specialists, and family support professionals.

Title: SWAN VALLEY EMT

Broadcast Date: 7-7

Duration: 2:39

Description: The Idaho Falls Fire Department is proposing to take over contracts for emergency medical service in Swan Valley. The fire chief argues that the additional funding would allow his agency to provide an ambulance to Swan Valley and use a redundant vehicle there to bolster service for the rest of the county. Swan Valley residents contend they would lose local control and service.

Title: IDAHO FALLS MAYOR/COUNCIL WAGES

Broadcast Date: 8-10

Duration: 1:27

Description: For the first time in many years, the Idaho Falls city council is considering a measure that would give city councilmen and the Mayor a pay raise. The council's wage would increase to over \$10,000 per year. The mayor said that would encourage a competent and socially diverse city council. The mayor's pay would also increase to \$84,000. Supporters said that would recognize the mayor's administrative role over public services.

Title: PAUL FOR PRESIDENT

Broadcast Date: 8-27

Duration: 1:50

Description: Republican presidential contender Rand Paul campaigned in eastern Idaho. The Kentucky Senator spoke to the GOP Summer Barbecue in Idaho Falls. He hopes his proposal for a 14.5 percent flat tax would be supported by Idaho conservatives. He is also pressing for immigration reform and reiterated his criticism of proposals from fellow GOP candidate Donald Trump.

Title: CHAMBER ALLIANCE

Broadcast Date: 9-15

Description: Regional chambers of commerce met with regional legislators to discuss significant legislative issues for the year ahead. The key issues identified included transportation, education, taxes, energy and water. A pending "career ladder" is expected to top educational issues this year. Lawmakers are working on a compromise between primary surface water rights and deep pump irrigators and cities who need additional water supply.

He was convicted of firing five point-blank gun-shots at an Idaho Falls Police officer. Policemen felt they had been sold-out by the city councilwoman, who said she had a personal, family relationship with the convict.

Title: REXBURG BUDGET

Broadcast Date: 7-8

Description: The city of Rexburg will increase its budget by 22 percent next year to complete several new infrastructure projects. The city's most pressing needs include upgrades to its water and sewer systems. Downtown infrastructure has not been upgraded since the 1970's. Utility rates will also increase about 1.3 percent or \$1.18 per month for the average customer.

Description: The Mayor of Rigby is working to attract new business and industry to the community. The strategy is to get the word out on the advantages of expanding in the city. Description: Skywest announced it will add a third flight at the Pocatello Regional Airport on a temporary basis beginning in August. Skywest dropped the third flight in January when it switched out its jet fleet. Airport officials said that meant the huge loss of 43 percent of its connection times. The key to keeping the flights operating will be filling 75 to 80 percent of available seats on the third flight.

Title: GREAT WESTERN

Description: Great Western Malting company broke ground for a \$74 million expansion. According to Pocatello officials, the plant will add another 10 to 15 local employees, but impact hundreds of jobs throughout eastern Idaho. The expansion is expected to be completed by summer of 2017. It will double malt production by 220,000 tons per year.

The search focused on a remote trail-head on the Bridger Teton National Forest, where two outfitters spotted someone moving. A helicopter ultimately found the three within 15 minutes.

Description: Lemhi County Search and Rescue has expanded the search for a missing two-year-old boy, but is focusing on a man-made lake near the campground where he turned up missing last weekend. The cause was still under investigation, but firefighters were convinced smoke detectors preventing anyone from being hurt or killed.
