Girls Viewing Pornography

Description: Research indicates that 57% of females ages 14 - 18 have viewed pornography. Pornhub states that over one-third of their global viewership was female in 2022, which is an increase of fifty-one percent since 2014. A survey conducted by the she recovery.com pornography support site for women offers up some sobering statistics on age of first exposure. Over eleven percent of the female respondents said they were first exposed to pornography at seven years old or younger, and forty-seven percent said their first exposure was between eight to twelve years old. By the time they were seventeen, over three-quarters had viewed pornography. Parents need to teach their kids to avoid this pitfall.

Description: ChatGPT is an artificial intelligence assistant that is powerful, intelligent, and interactive. A user simply types in a question and ChatGPT sifts through billions of online data sources to answer complex questions, solve math problems, write essays, and much more, all in a matter of seconds. Launched just over a year ago, we've been concerned that ChatGPT could be used by students to even write complete papers and assignments, which in effect would be cheating. Parents need to teach their kids not to use ChatGPT to do their work for them.
