The Branch County Sheriff says the current building was originally built as a home for seniors in the late 1940's and was never designed to be a jail. Cement block walls are deteriorating along with leaks and plumbing problems. The sheriff says the new jail will improve safety.

He first suggested hunters shot her then he told police his *dad shot her but Police reports show he was at work at the time. The boy is charged with open murder and a felony weapons charge. Under state law, he is presumed incompetent to stand trial for any crime because he's under 10 years old. But records show prosecutors want him treated with the goal of making him competent.</p>
