- 10/25 An informational meeting is coming up on a \$45 million renovation of the LaCrosse Center.
- Adding on the Center toward Riverside Park appears to be the favored option for the 37-year-old civic center.
- 11/9 The city council might have to commit more money than previously planned. The price tag has come down from \$75 million to \$42 million, but that's less than they want.
- 12/4 The return on investment of a higher price tag would be much higher, according to Gensler Company as high as 11% if the city will spend \$47 million.
