Tornado warnings are popping up as well in many locations. In SC, an 8pm curfew has been issued for Charleston tonight and more cities likely to join that. Power is out to thousands - expect that to take some time to restore. Authorities are warning if at all possible to stay sheltered where you are until it's confirmed safe to return - many "after" threats include things like downed power lines and debris -wind gusts even after the storm are taking trees down because of the soaked ground from all the rain. Interstate 95 is impassable and authorities have issued a statement urging everyone to stay off the roads, especially in eastern South Carolina. Tornadoes are possible in parts of southeast Georgia and coastal South Carolina so keep an eye out for tornado warnings. Tornado warnings were just issued for North Carolina. The storm has still not technically made landfall but it is pushing tropical storm force winds inland capable of knocking down trees and powerlines. Stay safe. More than 1.2 million coastal residents have lost power and four people have lost their lives. Matthew is the most powerful storm to affect the Atlantic in more than a decade. Reports of Heavy rain, flooding, storm surges and damaging winds are all still coming in, officials expect Matthew to make landfall in the next few hours. Clearly the area hardest hit from hurricane Matthew has been Haiti...where the storm has devastated the island...taking more than 800 lives...and leaving tens of thousands homeless. Outbreaks of cholera are already taking more lives.</p>

The governor says the state faces "major destruction" from Matthew with 7 storm fatalities here out of 16 total lives lost and many still unaccounted for. The effects after the storm are what authorities are dealing with now. Double-digit rainfall - some say the worst they've ever seen - has resulted in cresting rivers and creeks causing massive flooding - the Lumberton River among those. Almost 900 water rescues were made yesterday and overnight last night in NC and many people are still missing or unreachable. Power lines in the water are an added element of risk that is hampering rescue efforts in spots. Travel advisories are still in place due to flooded roads, power lines and debris. Portions of I-95 still closed along with many other roadways...bridges are washed out. Authorities are saying stay in inside - don't attempt to go out sightseeing or trying to get back into evacuated areas yet.
