### **Q3-2023 QUARTERLY REPORT: Locally Produced Programs**

#### ***“Great Day” Monday-Friday 5:00am – 10:00am***

A morning newscast that brings you up to the minute news, traffic and road conditions, weather and all the overnight news that you may have missed to make that morning commute and planning your day a little easier.

#### ***“Midday” Monday-Friday 11:30am – 12:00pm***

A mid-day newscast that brings you up to the minute news, traffic and road conditions, weather and all the news that you may have missed in the morning.

#### ***“10 O’clock News” Monday-Friday 10:00pm – 11:00pm***

#### ***Saturday-Sunday 10:00pm – 11:00pm***

A newscast consisting of local and regional news, plus consumer and health reports, as well as your weather and sports updates from throughout the day to bring you up to date.

#### ***“Town Hall” Periodic, as issues arise.***

A panel of community leaders, specialists in the subject, and other interested parties discuss local issues, to improve the general understanding and help focus the popular consensus toward broad-based solutions.

### **Q3-2023 QUARTERLY REPORT: Syndicated Produced Programs**

#### ***“Full Measure with Sharyl Attkisson”***

Full Measure is a broadcast focusing on investigative, original and accountability reporting. The host is Sharyl Attkisson. The show format includes a major investigative piece each week on topics ranging from immigration issues at home and abroad, government waste, national security concerns and vulnerabilities, whistleblower reports on government abuse and misdeeds. Full Measure is produced by and airs nationally on stations of the Sinclair Broadcast Group. This show airs Sunday 7:00AM (Preempted for kids E/I on several occasions).

#### ***“Armstrong Williams”***

Armstrong Williams is a weekly half-hour political and current events interview program. This program has timely interviews with important government, political and community leaders. This show airs Sundays at 5:00am and occasionally in other time periods.

### **Q3-2023 QUARTERLY REPORT: Significant Local News Issues**

There follows a listing of some of the significant issues responded to by this station, along with the most significant programming treatment of those issues for the period of July 1, 2023 – September 30, 2023. This list is by no means exhaustive. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any priority or significance.

#### **CONSUMER AWARENESS**

Great Day, Aug 29, 2023, 07:06 AM, 01:04, Local: The deadline to apply for FEMA assistance from this year's severe storms is Friday. It covers damage caused by wind, flooding, landslides, and mudslides. Fourteen counties qualify, including Kern, Madera, Mariposa, and Tulare counties. FEMA can help with home repairs, rental assistance, replace private property, disaster-related medical or dental care, and childcare. Small businesses must apply through the Small Business Administration to qualify, if referred. This highlights the need for long-term recovery efforts and preparation for future storms.

10 O'clock, Sep 14, 2023, 10:03 PM, 02:43, Local: This story highlights the prevalence of online scams and serves as a cautionary tale for individuals to exercise vigilance when engaging in online financial transactions. It emphasizes the importance of safeguarding hard-earned money from potential scams. The story is relevant because it raises awareness about potential scams that can occur within online platforms, prompting individuals to be more vigilant in their interactions. The story also serves as a reminder to the viewers and the public to be cautious when engaging in online transactions and to exercise due diligence in verifying the authenticity of offers or requests for money.

Great Day, Sep 22, 2023, 07:02 AM, 00:20, Local: California's insurance commissioner is now planning to reform the industry a week after lawmakers failed to do so. Under the plan, insurers will be required to cover a share of homeowners in high-risk wildfire areas. In exchange, companies can charge higher premiums. The commissioner is also considering using forward-looking models to predict costs instead of historical risk. This is important because a watchdog group warns depending on modeling could double or triple rates, which happened in Florida.

Great Day, Sep 26, 2023, 06:07 AM, 00:23, Local: A deal is struck to end the writers' strike. A vote is expected to be held today. If the vote is approved, the guild's 11 thousand members will then need to vote to ratify the new labor contract. Timing of that vote is unclear.

## CRIME

10 O'clock, Jul 17, 2022, 10:07PM, 02:07, Local: A woman now back home after getting kidnapped in Mexico. This is important story because the woman was missing for 8 months and was taken in Mexico and being that our viewers go to Mexico and have family from there it's important regional story, as it could happen to anyone.

10 O'clock, Jul 2, 2023, 10:04PM, 00:48, Local: New information arises in a deputy involved shooting as the suspect was identified. This is important to our viewers because we are updating them on the story. It's followed up with more information and lets viewers know what happened that day.

10 O'clock, Jul 6, 2023, 10:01PM, 00:24, Local: Reedley police say they have found their missing K9 officer. We reported it when the dog was last seen on Monday. Detectives tell us the dog was hit by a car and crawled to a nearby vineyard. This report ends a large search for the K9 officer. This is important to our viewers because we ran a package reporting when the dog was originally reported missing. This story provides an update. Also, we can tell people to stop looking for the dog, because it was unfortunately found dead.

10 O'clock, Jul 7, 2023, 10:03PM, 02:00, Local: A good Samaritan gets his car stolen by a hitchhiker. This is an important story because the journey of the driver and hitchhiker began in Fresno before moving down south. It also raises concern about who you can and cannot trust. It is a story you do not hear about often and has a lot of shocking moments. But it's relevant to our market being that it happened in our hometown and across the state.

Great Day, Jul 11, 2023, 05:01 AM, :56, Local: A Visalia woman is now voicing concerns over potential Medicare fraud after she was billed for several Covid-19 test kits that she says she never ordered. She called Medicare to report it as a mistake and asked them not to pay for them. If you think you were impacted by fraud, reach out to your local provider's office. They can break down the charges and determine if it was a billing error, or fraud. This is important because people might not know who to turn to if they are dealing with Medicare fraud.

10 O'clock, Jul 18, 2023, 10:05PM, 00:32, Local: Lemoore police are now looking for a person who they say shot 2 people, killing 1. Officers tell us they do not know what led to the shooting and have not identified anyone involved. Detectives say this is the first homicide in the small town in 2 years. This story is important to our viewers because it is a deadly shooting in a community that rarely sees such violence. Our coverage lets people know a killer is still loose.

10 O'clock, Jul 20, 2023, 10:01PM, 00:35, Local: Fresno police are looking for a man who they say threatened employees with an axe at a local store while trying to leave with items he did not pay for. Officers tell us no one was hurt during the robbery. The robber has not been identified or caught. This story is important to our viewers because now they know someone is still on the loose who will threaten others with violence when confronted for breaking the law.

Great Day, Jul 21, 2023, 07:06 AM, :35, Local: The city council is now taking measures to beef up safety for street vendors in the Tower District. They are implementing a new 90-day pilot program to create a designated vending zone. Vendors will only be able to sell on Thursdays through Sundays between the hours of 5 p.m. to 1:30 AM They cannot sell in front of restaurants while open or outside neighborhoods. This is important because fourteen violent incidents happened in the Tower District over the last year.

10 O'clock, Jul 21, 2023, 10:03PM, 00:45, Local: Three people were arrested following a chase with deputies. Law enforcement tells us they tried to stop the car in central Fresno. Instead of pulling over, we were told they led deputies on a chase through Fresno and Clovis. The pursuit ended when the car crashed in a fire station. We are told three of the four people in the car were arrested. This story is important to our viewers because now they know a wanted man is on the loose.

Great Day, Jul 26, 2023, 07:07 AM, 01:50, Local: A new scam is making the rounds on Facebook right now. A Clovis woman says she nearly lost her life's savings because she clicked on a fake pop-up. She says the pop-up looked legit and asked for two-factor authentication. After failing to log in, she was directed to call a fake customer service line and spoke with a scammer who convinced her to share her personal information. This is important because people may not be aware of how sophisticated these scams can be.

Great Day, Jul 27, 2023, 07:04 AM, :41, Local: A biological lab in Reedley has now been shut down by the Fresno Co. public health department. A Las Vegas-based company, 'Prestige Biotech,' ran the operation from October to sometime this spring. The lab itself is not illegal, but the city called on the public health department to investigate. This is important because the department reports there was a complete absence of control at the warehouse, which could pose a public health hazard.

Great Day, Jul 31, 2023, 07:04 AM, :48, Local: A teenager is in the hospital following an officer-involved shooting in Northwest Fresno. It happened yesterday morning near Warner and Effie. A person went up to an officer and told him about a teenage boy with a gun riding around on a scooter. The officer found the teen riding around on a scooter with a ski mask. Police say the officer ordered the teen to get on his knees, but the teen did not follow orders and looked like he was about to pull out a gun. The officer shot the teen. The gun was a BB gun that looked like a handgun. The teen is in critical condition but is expected to recover.

10 O'clock, Jul 31, 2023, 10:01PM, 01:03, Local: 1 person is dead, and 4 others are now in the hospital after Fresno police responded to 3 separate scenes in a nearby area of Northwest Fresno. Officers tell us they first went to reports of a fight. On their way there, they were called to a nearby shooting outside a Walmart. There, they found the victim. As detectives investigated the scene, they were called to a crash, just blocks away. There, police learned two cars collided, killing a female passenger. We're told 3 people from the crash were hospitalized. At least 1 person was seen running from the crash. The status of the shooting and crash victims is unknown.

10 O'clock, Aug 2, 2023, 10:06PM, 01:09, Local: Madera Sheriff's Office releasing bodycam footage of a deadly deputy involved shooting. This is a follow up to the story that highlights what happen the day of shooting. This is important as police brutality is still a hot topic across the nations any time officers or deputies draw their guns and kill someone, the public wants to see it what happened themselves. It is relevant as it happened in the central valley and is home to many of our viewers.

10 O'clock, Aug 3, 2023, 10:01PM, 03:07, Local: House Speaker Kevin McCarthy is now weighing in on an illegal lab found in Reedley. The lab was found to have toxic chemicals stored in dangerous, and potentially even, illegal, ways. Representative McCarthy now says he wants to address the lab in front of a house select committee focusing on China. There is no telling how dangerous this lab could be. It is possible it could harm people in our community. Our coverage lets people know we are holding the owners accountable, while also letting them know they could be at risk of being exposed to toxic chemicals.

10 O'clock, Aug 5, 2023, 10:01PM, 00:22, Local: A theft is caught on camera at the Fashion Fair Mall. This is important because it is one of the main malls in the central valley that our viewers go to, it is a family place, so any crimes that happen there are often a big deal because it takes away that safe factor while you're out with your family. It is also important because our viewers may know the person and can the police track down the two suspects.

10 O'clock, Aug 6, 2023, 10:01PM, 00:51, Local: A man sends officers on a police chase throughout Fresno and Clovis. This is important because it disrupted several people's commute, and they are going to look to the news to find out what happened. It is relevant because it happened in our area.

Great Day, Aug 7, 2023, 06:05 AM, :19, Local: In the south valley... The search is on this morning for the person responsible for a stabbing in Porterville. It happened early yesterday morning near 'date' and 'park'. Deputies tell us a person was stabbed several times... And then rushed to a hospital. If you know anything about this stabbing, please call the Tulare County sheriff's office.

Great Day, Aug 9, 2023, 07:05 AM, :35, Local: A thief is making life miserable for a farmer in Fresno County. His truck, tractor and trailer were stolen from his front yard. He grows melons and vegetables on sixteen acres of land near Kerman, and losing his equipment puts him in a serious bind. It is harvesting time, and he cannot wait for a settlement. More equipment was also taken from a storage area used by the Black Farmers Association of CA, near Kearney Park. This is important because the farmer sells his produce to buyers back East.

10 O'clock, Aug 10, 2023, 10:01PM, 03:25, Local: FOX26 News requested document from Fresno County, specifically emails. These show, The State Department of Health asked the county to keep some key details from the public, even as people were growing suspicious over what was going on. This story has been updated to reflect that FOX26 offered interviews to The State Department of Public Health and the governor's office, however we have yet to hear back. County officials say that they are now drafting ordinances when it comes to private laboratories so something like this does not happen again. We can take this story and bring awareness to valley residents. This is relevant because it is a story that our viewers know about and are going to be looking to news outlets for more information.

Great Day, Aug 11, 2023, 07:04 AM, 01:11, Local: Police in Hanford are now trying to track down those responsible for leaving racist flyers in baggies at several homes in Northeast Hanford. One homeowner says she is disgusted after one was thrown on her driveway. Police say the flyers are not criminal, but it is disturbing and warned that any group who targets others will not be tolerated. This is important because police say this happened in other communities around the valley as well.

Great Day, Aug 11, 2023, 08:03 AM, :20, Local: A Visalia man is now facing charges after police say he threatened to shoot up a hotel. Investigators say they received reports of an active shooter at the 'Visalia Wyndham' yesterday morning. Officers tell us a 22-year-old was making terrorist threats and causing a disturbance. We are told there is no evidence of a shooting, and no weapons were found at the hotel.

Great Day, Aug 15, 2023, 08:08 AM, :22, Local: Four women and a teenager are now facing charges, accused of trying to steal hundreds of dollars' worth of items from a Kohl's in Clovis. Police say the group started a fire as a distraction inside the store. It happened around two Monday afternoon near Sierra Vista Mall. Officers tell us the group took off in a car with five hundred dollars worth of items.

10 O'clock, Aug 16, 2023, 10:01PM, 03:02, Local: Merced County District Attorney's Office has filed charges, including Assault by a Public Officer, against 42-year-old Dustin Witt, a former Sergeant with the Merced Sheriff's Office. This is important to our viewers because of how deputies and officers manage their suspects and crime is important. The sheriff's office spoke out and said they will investigate how their department manages things and investigate better training. This is relevant to our market has those are officers and deputies that deal with our viewers.

Great Day, Aug 17, 2023, 06:05 AM, :28, Local: Police in Visalia are now trying to track down a pair of women who stole packages off a porch. It happened last week in 'Elwin' near 'Linwood'. Chances are... They did not expect a camera to catch them in the act. If you know who they are or where they could be... Please call the Visalia police department.

Great Day, Aug 17, 2023, 07:01 AM, 01:00, Local: A man in Mendota is dead, shot and killed by police officers while he was attacking his girlfriend. A woman called 911 around 7:20 Wednesday night, telling dispatchers her boyfriend was threatening to kill her. Police say they found the man trying to stab her with a knife - and shot him. He died on the way to the hospital. This serves as a reminder of the importance of reaching out for help in domestic violence situations - before it is too late.

10 O'clock, Aug 26, 2023, 10:13 PM, 02:31, Local: This is a story about the traumatic events that unfolded during the Cook's Corner shooting, offering the public firsthand insights into the chaos and heroism of that night. It underscores the importance of being aware of incidents like these, as they shed light on the need for community preparedness, gun violence prevention, and the resilience of individuals caught in such terrifying situations. Hearing these accounts from survivors and witnesses highlights the courage and compassion displayed amidst tragedy, will remind viewers of the significance of unity and safety in communities.

10 O'clock, Aug 27, 2023, 10:15 PM, 01:45, Local: Tragedy struck Jacksonville on Saturday when a 21-year-old shooter, identified as Ryan Christopher Palmeter, conducted a racially motivated attack at a local Dollar General store. The assailant targeted Black individuals, leaving three innocent people dead. This shocking incident, which occurred on the 60th anniversary of the March in Washington, has sent shockwaves through the community. It is crucial for the public to be aware of this tragic event because it underscores the persistent issue of hate and racially motivated violence in our communities.



Great Day, Aug 28, 2023, 05:10 AM, 00:46, Local: A central Fresno business owner is furious that teens keep stealing from her. She is now turning to posting surveillance videos on social media in hopes that it will reach the teens' parents. She says she called the police several times, but they never show up. She says most of the thieves cannot be older than 5. This is important because it highlights the importance of proper parental supervision and guidance.

Great Day, Aug 30, 2023, 05:03 AM, 01:10, Local: Thieves and vandals are causing headaches for people who own Kias in west Fresno. A man parked his car on Dewey and Torres over the weekend and says people in a white car drove by his home, got out and smashed his windows. It is all connected to a TikTok trend called 'Kia Boys,' which encourages teens to break into cars and steal them for joyrides. Kias are more susceptible because they lack an anti-theft feature called an immobilizer. This highlights the importance of not leaving your car parked outside - or leaving valuables inside in plain view - if you know it could be vulnerable to theft.

10 O'clock, Sep 6, 2023, 10:01PM, 02:01, Local: Several students injured at a bus stop after a teenager crashed into them after school. This is important because viewers are going to want to know what happened today, since students were impacted, and so was traffic. This is relevant to our market because it was a local story, and happened near a local school.

Great Day, Sep 8, 2023, 08:03 AM, 00:20, Local: Owner of a pickup truck is now in need of help after his truck was stolen while he was at work. All caught on camera, it happened near Clinton and Brawley. His work Equipment was inside the truck.

10 O'clock, Sep 12, 2023, 10:01PM, 02:33, Local: Victim's hit looking to identify driver who hit them. This is important to our viewers because they can help the victims in locating the suspect. It's relevant because it happened in this area, and a viewer could be the answer the victims and officers need on getting a lead.

Great Day, Sep 13, 2023, 07:09 AM, 01:00, Local: A Fresno couple is now turning to the community for help identifying the driver who damaged two of their cars in a hit and run. It was all caught on camera, which the husband says he installed recently. Police are having a tough time tracking down the driver and passenger because the car could be stolen. Both jumped out and left the key in the ignition. This illustrates the importance of having security cameras to present to police.

Great Day, Sep 15, 2023, 07:00 AM, 00:45, Local: A Fresno man lost his money to a Facebook guessing game is sounding the alarm on the scam. He came across a post on a Facebook group's page, looking to bless a family with money. So, he took part and chanced his money. A woman reached out to him, asking him to cover a transfer fee in exchange for \$1500. He turned it down, but she insisted. Once he asked for a refund, she blocked him. This is an important example of always trusting your instincts - if something seems too good to be true, it is.

10 O'clock, Sep 16, 2023, 10:06 PM, 02:01, Local: This is a story that highlights the alarming smash and grab robbery that occurred at Jewelers On Time in Newport Beach, emphasizing the need for heightened security measures for businesses, particularly those dealing with valuable items. It also sheds light on the psychological impact on employees who were directly affected by the incident. With store robberies on the rise this story can help viewers and local business owners create security measures to make sure they don't fall victim to these robberies

Great Day, Sep 19, 2023, 07:02 AM, 01:30, Local: A man is dead following a shooting in Central Fresno. It happened just a block away from McLane High School while students were getting out of class for the day. The police chief says this is the 27th murder this year, and while they are thankful no students are hurt, someone still lost their life.

Great Day, Sep 20, 2023, 08:02 AM, 00:15, Local: Fresno police are trying to track down an accused thief this morning. The 34 yr. old is wanted for attempted burglary. Investigators say he is known to ride a black beach cruiser in the Mayfair district.

Great Day, Sep 25, 2023, 08:04 AM, 00:16, Local: Merced County Sheriff's deputies are still searching for a man who disappeared while fishing last week. This man was last seen along highway 152 and vista point around seven on Thursday night. He was wearing dark clothing and a burgundy backpack. He is 5'6 and wears glasses.

10 O'clock, Sep 25, 2023, 10:01PM, 03:46, Local: Yokuts Valley Church asking for the public's help after someone stole the Tabernacle at St. Rita Indian Mission Catholic Church. This is important to our viewers because we have a decent size native American population in the valley as well as viewers who are catholic. With the recent uptick in thieves it's another thing for people to be on the look out for. It's relevant as it's our viewers that can help catch or spot the thief and help the church out.

Great Day, Sep 26, 2023, 05:01 AM, 00:38, Local: The Catholic Diocese of Fresno is holding out hope that a thief who stole a tabernacle from a Yokuts Valley church will have the heart to return it. The thief also took a covered cup which contained 20 pieces of the Eucharist, and dampened Sunday morning mass. The diocese says the stolen items can be dropped off at any area Catholic church, no questions asked.

Great Day, Sep 27, 2023, 06:03 AM, 00:14, Local: Man faces child molestation charges in Tulare County. Deputies tracked down a 23-year-old in Pixley. He was wanted in Southern California. He was arrested and released to the custody of Glendora Police Department.

10 O'clock, Sep 27, 2023, 10:02 PM, 02:53, Local: The FBI, in collaboration with the Yolo County District Attorney's office, is investigating in Fresno County regarding a cold case involving multiple homicides. This case is linked to Paul Perez, who was arrested in 2020 for the murder of his five infant children. The infants, born between 1992 and 2001, were all under six months old at the time of their deaths. Perez has been charged with at least five felony murders and various criminal enhancements. The nature of the crime is described as heartbreaking and deeply troubling, particularly due to its involvement of children. This story is important to our viewers because it sheds light on an ongoing investigation with deeply disturbing details. It raises awareness about the tragic case and highlights the commitment of law enforcement to seek justice for the victims. The story is relevant because it also serves as a reminder of the significance of timely tips from the public in solving cold cases.

Great Day, Sep 28, 2023, 08:05 AM, 00:28, Local: Two Visalia men are now facing charges of conspiracy to commit grand theft. Last week, Police said a man stole more than \$2,500 worth of items stolen from Lowe's off South Mooney BLVD. The two men were both arrested.

Great Day, Sep 29, 2023, 06:05 AM, 00:25, Local: Police are searching for the person responsible for a shooting and killing in East Fresno. A 62-year-old was shot in his car more than a week ago. He was taken to the hospital and died yesterday.

10 O'clock, Oct 22, 2023, 10:01 AM, 02:13, Local: Thieves steal gas and disable four trucks to the Kings County Commission. This story is important as the trucks that are disabled were used to deliver meals to seniors and shut ins. This is relevant to our story because it impacts a lot of people and if the community knows what's going on they are more willing to help.

Great Day, Sep 14, 2023, 07:01 AM, 00:32, Local: The Fresno Police Department is sharing new video of an arson-murder that killed a little boy in Central Fresno. Detectives hope the video, along with a \$12k reward, will lead to an arrest. 7-year-old Isaac Vallejo lost his life last summer after he was trapped on the second floor of the house where he lived with his family. Investigators say an accelerant was used to start the fire. Anyone with information is urged to call Valley Crime Stoppers.

Great Day, Jul 20, 2023, 07:06 AM, :29, Local: A man is now recovering at CRMC following a stabbing in Southeast Fresno. It happened at an apartment complex near Tulare and Rogers around 1:30 this morning. Police say they are combing the area for clues. No witnesses are cooperating with the investigation.

Great Day, Sep 25, 2023, 07:04 AM, 01:02, Local: A Fresno County sheriff's deputy is facing a misdemeanor battery charge over what the sheriff's office calls workplace violence. It happened in February and was turned over to the Tulare County sheriff's office to avoid a potential conflict of interest. This is important as it sets a standard for law enforcement to hold themselves to and take accountability for, if he is found guilty.

## ECONOMY

10 O'clock, Aug 11, 2023, 10:36PM, 00:38, Local: A secretive company buying up land around a key air force bases in northern California is raising red flags among law makers. This story is important is the public is suspicious of the company and whether these investments pose a national security risk. This story is relevant because it's a story that our viewers want to know more about and are going to be looking to news outlets for more information

10 O'clock, Aug 13, 2023, 10:02PM, 02:40, Local: A restaurant in pismo has another business in Maui that burnt down. The business is collecting donations of blankets, water, and other items to be shipped out. It's relevant to our viewers because it's a popular restaurant that many people in the valley know. It's a follow up of what's happening in Maui, and how we can help.

10 O'clock, Aug 25, 2023, 10:16PM, 01:35, Local: The Black Cat Jazz Supper Club, known for its music and atmosphere, is confronting significant challenges due to rampant drug use, homelessness, and crime in the Tenderloin neighborhood. Operations Director Jason Moore revealed the club's struggles, including incidents of assault, theft, and vandalism. He emphasized that the situation worsens at night, posing a significant issue for a nightclub that relies on evening patrons. Ultimately, this story highlights the broader challenges faced by businesses in urban areas and the importance of addressing these issues for the well-being of both residents and local establishments.

This is important because Tule elk are a species that is only found in California.

The chairman of the coronavirus pandemic subcommittee says both agencies failed to produce requested information on the lab and believes both agencies are holding on to information that sheds more light on the lab. It was shut down earlier this summer after being found to be operating without a license. This is important because the lab was found to be harboring vials of potentially infectious diseases, which could impact our community's health and safety.

10 O'clock, Sep 15, 2023, 10:01 PM, 02:43, Local: This story sheds light on the challenges faced by a dedicated travel nurse, Sean Michael Maness, who was hospitalized for a severe illness, and then later passed away. 10 O'clock, Jul 4, 2023, 10:05PM, 01:40, Local: Today is the fourth of July. We had a reporter go live from downtown Fresno. There, she showed viewers images from our drone. She also provided tips, to make sure people are staying safe this holiday. This story is relevant because many people use illegal fireworks, putting themselves, and others, in harm's way. Our coverage acknowledges this fact, and tries to lessen the damage from people breaking the law.

10 O'clock, Jul 5, 2023, 10:05PM, 03:05, Local: Several pets are missing following the 4th of July holiday. This is important to our viewers because it informs them on what to do if they see a missing animal, or if their animal is missing where could they go to find their fur baby. It's important that these animals get to go back home as our animal shelters are already impacted. This is important to our viewers because this is happening across the valley, and this way community members and help each other out.

10 O'clock, Jul 9, 2023, 10:01PM, 01:50, Local: A murder suspect on the run after fleeing from Placer County Sheriff's. Deputies are currently looking for him. This is important to our viewers because it's in the Sacramento area and that's not too far from the central valley. Being that a lot of our viewers travel throughout the state, or that the suspect can easily come to the valley it's important that they know who to be on the lookout for. This is relevant to our market because it has to do with the safety of our viewers.

10 O'clock, Jul 10, 2023, 10:01PM, 00:30, Local: A fire in Reedley burned two homes. Firefighters tell us the blaze displaces two families. We are told the fire started in a garage before spreading to other parts of the home. By the time crews had put out the flames, we're told the fire had damaged parts of two houses. Thankfully, no one was hurt. It's unknown what caused this fire. This story is important to our viewers because it reminds them that fires are common this time of year, and that they need to take extra caution in order to prevent their homes from burning.

10 O'clock, Jul 11, 2023, 10:01PM, 00:25, Local: The body of backpacker last seen in Yosemite a few weeks ago has been found. The man's sister says her brother's body was located, and then recovered 24 hours later. The backpacker was from California. The sister suspect's the man drowned. This story highlights why swimming in unsupervised areas can be dangerous. Many people in our region visit Yosemite, so anything related to the park gets a lot of attention.

10 O'clock, Jul 14, 2023, 10:01PM, 00:32, Local: A man drowned at Lake Millerton and is in critical condition. This is important to our viewers because people often head to the lake to beat the heat and safety is important to keep in mind as people die all the time for not taking extra precautions. This guy may get a second chance at life but not everyone does so it continues to raise awareness on the importance of safety in lakes which is why it's relevant to our viewers as there are several lakes and rivers are viewers go to.

10 O'clock, Jul 16, 2023, 10:01PM, 02:20, Local: The national weather service issuing a heat warning for the week - so we take a look at how to avoid heat exhaustion. This is important to our viewers because heat strokes can happen, as well as being dehydrated, it's nice to know the resources and what to look out for to stay safe. This is relevant because the heat advisory affects our area.

10 O'clock, Jul 16, 2023, 10:01PM, 02:03, Local: An aunt passes out free life jackets at Millerton Lake in honor of her nephew that drowned. This is important to our viewers because it helps raise awareness on the importance of water safety, as there's always multiple drownings that happen yearly, and often times those drownings could have been prevented with an extra step of precaution, like wearing a life jacket. This is relevant to our market because we have covered several different drowning stories already, and the most recent one was at Millerton Lake where the free life jackets were handed out.

Great Day, Jul 17, 2023, 07:09 AM, :59, Local: A family in the San Joaquin Valley is urging others to be safe and give their children life jackets. They handed out more than 100 life jackets at Millerton Lake in honor of their late nephew who drowned. This is important because the CDC reports more children between the ages of one and four die from drowning than any other cause of death in the U.S.

10 O'clock, Jul 22, 2023, 10:01PM, 00:24, Local: Five people rescued from the San Joaquin River. This is important because water ways are still at a high stream and all authorities are reminding people to stay clear of water ways and to wear life jackets. This has been an ongoing issue as people continue not to listen and rescues continue to take place. In this incident the people flipped their boat, so it is a safety reminder to our viewers to also be safe while on any water way.

10 O'clock, Jul 23, 2023, 10:01PM, 01:18, Local: A large fight broke out at the Fashion Fair mall. This is important to our viewers because the mall is visited by most of the valley as the two main malls in the central valley are Fresno's Fashion Fair and the mall in Visalia. So, people from all over the valley go to Fashion Fair, and it's important our viewers know what is going on especially as many families go there with their kids. It is informing them of their safety and surroundings.

Great Day, Jul 24, 2023, 07:08 AM, :20, Local: Five boaters are now safe and on dry land this morning after their boat tipped over in the San Joaquin River over the weekend. The Fresno County sheriff's office reports they were rescued near Friant and Fork roads. We are told the boaters waited on an island until the water rescue team was able to reach them. This is important because the water could still be flowing fast due to record snowmelt from the Sierra.

10 O'clock, Jul 27, 2023, 10:01PM, 00:46, Local: A man's body was recovered more than a month after he was last seen swept away into the Kern River. Law enforcement told us the week the kayaker was lost that they had found the body but were unable to get access to the remains due to the location and the strength of the river's current. Today, dive teams recovered it. Deputies tell us this should serve as a reminder that our region's waterways remain dangerous, and that people should take caution when traversing them or using them for recreational purposes.

Great Day, Jul 28, 2023, 07:01 AM, :39, Local: Two drivers are hurt following a crash on Highway 41 in south Fresno County. The CHP says the driver of a semi-truck was going south on the 41 when a pickup going west ran a red light and hit the big rig. The drivers of both trucks were taken to CRMC, with the pickup truck driver badly hurt. The driver of the big rig was taken with minor injuries. It impacted traffic on the 41 for about two hours. This serves as a reminder to always pay attention when driving.

10 O'clock, Jul 30, 2023, 10:05PM, 03:48, Local: Following up on the sea otter in Santa Cruz that almost bit surfers. This is important to our viewers as the story has caused controversy, being that some are trying to capture the otter while others are starting a petition to keep it free. We're providing an update the story has drawn attention nationwide and is happening in our own backyard, and our viewers visit and swim in the ocean in Santa Cruz too. It lets them know the safety concerns experts are providing as well.

Great Day, Aug 7, 2023, 05:10 AM, :42, Local: Madera Unified is welcoming students and faculty back to school this morning for the new school year. The district wants to remind families that the morning drop-off sets the tone for the rest of the day. They are asking parents to follow posted signs in drop-off zones. This is important because there have been several traffic-related deaths in school zones across the valley earlier this year.

Great Day, Aug 9, 2023, 08:03 AM, :22, Local: A woman is now in a hospital this morning after she was pulled from a northwest Fresno canal overnight. A witness reported someone floating downstream near 'Hughes' and 'Emerson' last night. She was rushed to a hospital after Fresno fire's water rescue team pulled her from the canal. Her condition is not known this morning. Rescuers tell us they do not know how - or why - she ended up in canal.

Great Day, Aug 9, 2023, 08:06 AM, :22, Local: A man is now facing charges after police say he crashed into a Visalia home. It happened on Tuesday night around 11-30 off 'Houston' avenue and 'Cain' street. Fire crews say a car crashed into a home and hit a gas meter, causing a gas leak. We are told three people were inside the car - and ran from the scene. Police say they caught the driver and took him to a hospital to be treated.

Great Day, Aug 14, 2023, 07:05 AM, :50, Local: The search is now underway for a man who disappeared while hiking in Sequoia National Forest. Park rangers say 76-year-old Bill Roberts was dropped off at the Cottonwood Trail in Inyo National Forest. He was supposed to meet up with his family at Bullfrog Lake on Saturday, but he never arrived. The last update from the man's tracker shows he was near the west end of the Caltech Peak Ridgeline, but rangers have yet to find him. This is important because many people might not let their families know where they are before going on hikes.

10 O'clock, Aug 14, 2023, 10:06 PM, 01:35, Local: This story highlights the critical role technology can play in aiding officers on patrol and ensuring a rapid response. Additionally, it serves as a reminder to the community that law enforcement is dedicated to maintaining safety and security, with the message that criminal activities will be met with quick and decisive action. This is important because she says this cancer is underfunded.

Great Day, Aug 18, 2023, 07:00 AM, :30, Local: CAL-OSHA is investigating whether a crane that crushed a truck - and almost hit a construction worker - on Thursday morning was properly operating. The nephew of the man whose truck was destroyed says the crane was being used to lift wood when they heard a big crash - and employees scrambled to safety. The man says his uncle's truck had almost \$7k worth of tools inside. This is important because it shines a light on safety at construction sites around our state.

10 O'clock, Aug 18, 2023, 10:01PM, 03:11, Local: We take look at how areas across California are preparing for Hurricane Hilary. This is important to our viewer because it's impacting our state, and it could affect their plans this weekend as rain is coming in sooner. This is relevant to our market as it is impacting the safety of our viewers.

10 O'clock, Aug 19, 2023, 10:01PM, 03:17, Local: We take look at how areas across California are preparing for Hurricane Hilary, as Governor Gavin Newsom declares a state of an emergency. This is important to our viewers because the central valley is already seeing impacts from the storm, with power outages and downed trees. Our viewers also know people all over California and they are going to want to check how other areas are doing as well. This is relevant to our marker because the storm also affects our viewers.

10 O'clock, Aug 20, 2023, 10:01PM, 07:54, Local: We take look at how areas across California have been impacted by Tropical Storm Hilary. This is important to our viewers because the central valley is seeing impacts from the storm. Our viewers also know people all over California and they are going to want to check how other areas are doing as well. This is relevant to our market because the storm also affects our viewers.

Great Day, Aug 21, 2023, 08:02 AM, :37, Local: More than 700 households woke up without power this morning... it happened near highway 99 and Herndon. It happened just before 3 this morning, crews say a fire could be the reason for the outage.

Great Day, Aug 22, 2023, 07:01 AM, :18, Local: Two lanes of southbound Highway 99 near Manning Ave. shut down Tuesday morning after a big rig carrying romaine lettuce caught on fire. Crews tell us the plastic bins carrying the produce melted together, making it tough to move. This is important because it impacted traffic for hundreds, if not thousands commuting to work and school this morning.

Great Day, Aug 24, 2023, 07:05 AM, 00:34, Local: A man is dead and another is facing vehicular manslaughter charges after hitting and killing his colleague while at work. It happened in Reedley near Englehart Ave on Tuesday morning. A 40-year-old got into a car owned by the company without permission and drove around the property, hitting a 25-year-old employee. The driver took off. This is important as it highlights a higher need for safety protocols to prevent employees from using company-issued items or cars without permission.

Great Day, Aug 24, 2023, 08:04 AM, 00:20, Local: A three-thousand-dollar reward is now offered for any information leading to an arrest. Officers say this man was driving south on Highway 99 near 'olive' avenue last year when he was shot and killed. If you have any information on this shooting... Please call crime stoppers.

Great Day, Aug 31, 2023, 07:33 AM, 00:29, Local: Runners in Kings County are lacing up their shoes in honor of fallen K9 officers for National Police K9 Day. K9s United is hosting the fourth annual virtual Fallen K-9 Memorial Run. You can sign up to support K-9 units with several law enforcement agencies. Registering for the run and donating to any of the runs raises money for resources for the K-9 units. This is important because these units are often under-resourced.

Great Day, Sep 1, 2023, 07:10 AM, 01:09, Local: The Forest Service wants people to keep a few things in mind if they plan to head up to Sequoia National Forest. Keep an eye on the weather and recognize the signs of a storm. Pack plenty of water and don't waste water that's already in the forest. If you are hiking or backpacking, leave your campsite cleaner than when you found it. And campfire restrictions are in effect. You can get a campfire permit online. This is important because it's still wildfire season, and so parts of the park could be vulnerable despite this relatively wet year.

Great Day, Sep 6, 2023, 07:05 AM, 00:27, Local: Fresno County is honoring the life of Gavin Gladding, a vice principal who died in a hit and run five years ago while jogging on Friant Road. The county is putting up a blue along Friant, honoring his contributions to education and the environment. This is important as it raises awareness on the dangers of driving in Fresno, and watching out for pedestrians, especially in this area.

Great Day, Sep 6, 2023, 08:03 AM, 00:17, Local: A bicyclist is in bad shape this morning after getting hit by a train in central Fresno. It happened off 'Olive' avenue last night. Police tell us they think that person thought bicycling over the tracks could be done quickly enough to beat the train. The bicyclist was taken to a hospital in critical condition.

10 O'clock, Sep 7, 2023, 10:01 PM, 02:26, Local: In this story, the owner of horses suspected of neglect, asserts that they are receiving adequate care, including food, water, and medicine, in hopes of their recovery. The Fresno County Sheriff's Office conducted a welfare check and found no evidence of criminal activity or neglect. The County of Fresno has confirmed that Fresno Humane Animal Services is actively investigating the case. This story raises awareness about the need for vigilant monitoring of animal welfare and underscores the challenges faced in advocacy efforts. Knowing this story encourages viewers and the public to report suspected cases of animal neglect or abuse and reinforces the importance of collective responsibility for animal welfare.

Great Day, Sep 8, 2023, 07:08 AM, 01:25, Local: A woman in Sanger is concerned about a potential case of animal neglect. She says she reported and confronted a neighbor who owns horses with their ribs poking out and looking malnourished. The owner says he is disheartened, and he loves animals. He says he is rehabilitating the animals and giving them a chance at survival. The Fresno County Sheriff's office conducted a welfare check and says there is no sign of neglect or criminal activity.

10 O'clock, Sep 8, 2023, 10:01 PM, 02:52, Local: In this story, Yesenia Renteria received a distressing call from her daughter, informing her of a terrifying incident. Renteria's 16-year-old son lost control of his truck, careening into a group of students waiting for a city bus near Cedar and Tulare, across from Roosevelt High School. The collision resulted in injuries to 11 students, who were promptly transported to nearby hospitals with varying degrees of harm. Renteria's son remains in custody at the Fresno County Juvenile Justice Center and is currently undergoing therapy, although he has yet to speak about the accident. This story describes the emotional turmoil experienced by families involved in accidents, shedding light on the tough decisions they may face in the aftermath. This incident prompts a broader conversation among our viewers and the public about student safety and the role of schools in supporting students affected by traumatic events.

10 O'clock, Sep 9, 2023, 10:01 PM, 01:28, Local: A Forest Service spokesperson confirmed that an aircraft, engaged in battling the "Tea Fire" in the High Sierra District near the "Teakettle Experimental Forest," experienced a crash. According to CAL FIRE, only the pilot was on board at the time of the incident. The helicopter crash is currently under investigation, with the National Transportation Safety Board being notified. CAL FIRE has announced that additional information will not be released at this time due to the ongoing investigation. This story brings attention to viewers the risks and challenges faced by firefighting personnel in their efforts to combat wildfires. It underscores the importance of prompt and accurate communication to address concerns and prevent misinformation. This story is relevant because knowing about the incident provides transparency and reassurance, allowing viewers to stay informed about ongoing firefighting efforts in the area.

Great Day, Sep 20, 2023, 07:02 AM, 00:52, Local: More police will be patrolling shopping centers in Fresno thanks to a multi-million-dollar state grant. Police chief Paco Balderrama says the city will spend \$15 million to fight retail theft by creating a new organized theft task force. This is important because the grant will benefit businesses citywide, not just in one part of town - and boost public safety.

Great Day, Sep 22, 2023, 08:09 AM, 00:24, Local: \$25K worth of illegal tobacco is now in the hands of the Clovis police department. Police seized illegal flavored vape and tobacco products from the vape in clovis.

10 O'clock, Sep 26, 2023, 10:30PM, 03:00, Local: Governor Gavin Newsom signed a law that limits where and who can carry a gun in public. This is important to our viewers because guns are such a hot topic and between the 2nd amendment and the dangers guns face when they are in the wrong hands. This is relevant to our viewers as the new bill impacts California.

Great Day, Sep 27, 2023, 07:04 AM, 01:10, Local: Governor Newsom signed SB 2, which strengthens concealed carry laws. The law restricts places where someone with a CCW can carry a gun in public - as well as who can carry it. Restricted places include schools, courthouses, hospitals, parks, and bars. It is causing backlash from gun rights groups as well as from law enforcement, who say the restrictions will punish "good, law-abiding citizens." This is important as several recent mass shootings in California happened in public places like bars or dancehalls.

Great Day, Sep 29, 2023, 07:04 AM, 02:38, Local: A Fresno State professor's class requirement is now believed to be the reason why someone threatened to bomb the dorms. The professor required students to report their pronouns for a class assignment, or else risk losing full points on the assignment. An attorney says this violates university policy and goes against diversity/inclusion principles. This is important because there are more instances of issues of what is considered free or protected speech on college campuses.

Great Day, Aug 2, 2023, 05:06 AM, :46, Local: The Kings River is now back open to recreational use in Fresno, Kings, and Tulare counties. People at an RV resort along the river were the first in line to jump in the water. However, the Tulare County Sheriff's office warns that there are still a lot of downed trees which are impacting water patterns. This is important because it could be dangerous - even for experienced boaters and swimmers.

Great Day, Aug 14, 2023, 08:09 AM, :37, Local: A woman is now dead, and a police officer is hurt after two early morning crashes. These happened near 'clovis' and 'shields' avenue. Police say a man going south on 'clovis' hit a woman who was in the road. She was rushed to CRMC... but she did not survive. That driver is cooperating with the investigation. While police blocked off traffic, Investigators tell us a driver going south on clovis near 'garland' hit a police car. The officer in the police car was hurt and taken to CRMC with moderate injuries. We are told the driver of the car that hit the police officer was arrested and faces charges of driving under the influence.

Great Day, Sep 28, 2023, 07:02 AM, 00:15, Local: A strawberry stand went up in flames in Clovis. It happened around 3:30 AM on the corner of Shaw and Locan. Firefighters were able to put out the fire, and no one is hurt. This is important as there are a lot of strawberry stands in Fresno County, and farming is a major driver of the region's economy. It is unclear if this one was still in business.
