This list is by no means exhaustive. The order in which the issues appear does not reflect any priority or significance.

CONSUMER AWARENESS

Great Day, Jun 16, 2023, 7:06 a.m., 01:14, Local: A recent survey on the historic Tulare Lake is offering surrounding communities' new insight into the future of water infrastructure in Kings County. The sheriff's office reports the water will eventually dry up again, but the water is being used now to refill water aquifers used for farming and irrigation. The county recently issued an emergency health order urging people to stay out of the lake because it could be contaminated with chemicals.

Ten O'clock News, Jun 27, 2023, 10:06 p.m., 00:33, Local: Yosemite Nation Park is opening Glacier Point road July first. The road has been closed since 2021. The road gives access to one of the most beloved and visited sections of the park. Its closure has left many disappointed and could have possibly cost surrounding communities tourism money. Now that the road is reopening, more visitors are expected to make their way to the park, potentially bringing in money to towns close to the park. Our coverage lets people know the road is reopening.

Great Day, May 31, 2023, 7:17 a.m., 00:18, Local: The deadline to apply for federal assistance for flood recovery is quickly approaching. The last day to sign up is on June 5th. Aid is available for people in Madera, Mariposa, Tulare and Kern counties. Families and business owners are encouraged to visit disasterassistance.gov, download the FEMA app or reach out to FEMA's help line to apply.

CRIME

Great Day, Apr 3, 2023, 7:04 a.m., 00:27, Local: A man is now facing charges of resisting arrest after a chase in Visalia. Police say they tried to arrest a man wanted on several felony warrants. He took off on a bike to Highway 198. A CHP helicopter on patrol tracked him down and found him hiding in the highway median. He tried to get away on his bike again but was hit by a car.

Great Day, Apr 3, 2023, 8:04 a.m., 00:29, Local: Officials are now searching for a driver who hit a woman early this morning. She was found lying on the street in Visalia. She was rushed to Kaweah Health Medical Center in critical condition. An investigation is now underway, if you have any information called the Visalia P.D.

Ten O'clock News, Apr 4, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 00:30, Local: Our photojournalist went to reports of a shooting in central Fresno. There, he spoke with neighbors who told him they reported hearing gunshots. Our same employee also told us he saw two people taken to the hospital in an ambulance and that police continued to surround the area for hours. This coverage lets people know to avoid the impacted area for their safety.

Great Day, Apr 5, 2023, 6:07 a.m., 00:20, Local: Shooter is on the loose after sending a man to the hospital in Cutler. Officials found the man near avenue 406 and road 127 around five p.m. He is expected to recover.

Great Day, Apr 5, 2023, 7:07 a.m., 0;30, Local: Two men are now in a hospital after an officer-involved shooting in Central Fresno. It happened near a home on First and Brown before eight last night. Witnesses told officers about an argument between members of a family. Investigators say they searched an alley near the home and found a man who was shot. Another man carrying a gun was shot by officers. Both men were taken to the hospital in critical condition. We're told this is Fresno's 3rd officer-involved shooting this year.

Ten O'clock News, Apr 6, 2023, 10:02 p.m., 00:45, Local: We learned more about an officer involved shooting from Tuesday night. Officers say they shot a man who was holding a gun. That man is still in hospital but is facing charges once he recovers. We learned his identity and the charges he will face. Our coverage shows viewers that we follow up on stories.

Ten O'clock News, Apr 7, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 00:40, Local: Two people are now in the hospital after being shot during a drive-by. The two victims were found by police in a nearby mall parking lot. We're told the victims were taken to the hospital where they are expected to recover. No one has been arrested. Police tell us they are looking for a white seen leaving the area after shots were fired. Our coverage lets people know to be on the lookout for a white car.

Ten O'clock News, Apr 9, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 00:50, Local: A man arrested in for deadly shooting in Visalia. This is important to our viewers because it keeps them up to date with what's happening in their area. This is relevant because it's something that just happened, and a viewer could possibly have more information that officers could use.

Great Day, Apr 10, 2023, 7:03 a.m., 00:25, Local: A man is now behind bars in connection to a deadly shooting in Visalia. Police say they found a man who was shot several times near Third and Grape before 9:30 Saturday night. He was rushed to a hospital but died. Investigators tell us they found the accused shooter not far away and learned the man's mother was involved in a disturbance with the man who was shot and killed.

Great Day, Apr 10, 2023, 8:04 a.m., 00:20, Local: A man is now facing manslaughter charges accused of hitting and killing a woman in Hanford. The woman's body was found in the road near tenth avenue and tenth street.

Midday, Apr 11, 2023, 11:30 a.m., 00:24, Local: A man is facing felony charges, accused of vandalizing a bank in southeast Fresno. Police say the man smashed windows at the Chase bank between Kings Canyon and Winery with bolt cutters. Officers say they used bean bags to try and subdue him, but he ran across several parking lots to a Planet Fitness. That is where officers used bean bags again and took the man into custody.

Ten O'clock News, Apr 12, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 02:45, Local: Fresno Police say a tow truck driver ran a red light and t-boned a 22-year-old woman in her car. This is a follow up story as a homeowner in the area has cameras facing that intersection. Police say it's one of the top intersections that see accidents often. It's important that the viewers are aware of the dangers of the intersection as this isn't the first time a life has been lost or an accident happened in that intersection. It also draws attention to the idea if authorities are going to do something to change the intersection especially knowing the dangers the cross streets are facing.

Great Day, Apr 12, 2023, 6:01 a.m., 00:38, Local: Police searching for a shooter after one man is in the hospital. It happened last night near Grant and Effie around 10:45 p.m. He is expected to recover. Investigators believe it was a targeted attack and the public isn't at threat.

Great Day, Apr 13, 2023, 6:03 a.m., 00:16, Local: The search is on for a burglar in north Fresno. He broke into the shanghai Chinese cuisine near Blackstone and Griffith. it happened last month around midnight.

Ten O'clock News, Apr 14, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 00:23, Local: A high school student is now in custody after police say he brought a gun to school. Officers tell us when they were alerted to the threat, the surrounded the campus and zeroed in on a suspect. Once finding their person of interest, they caught and arrested him. Fortunately, no one was hurt. Our coverage lets parents know about a potentially dangerous situation at a local school.

Great Day, Apr 14, 2023, 7:03 a.m., 00:33, Local: A Selma man is now warning others about a social media gift card scam. He says a man claiming to be from "The Company" connected with him and told him if he invested in gift cards, he would get as much as \$16,000 delivered to his door. He says the person he interacted with said they were from Fresno County.

Ten O'clock News, Apr 16, 2023, 10:02 p.m., 00:17, Local: A man found dead outside in Mendota. This is important because officers are investigating and need more information as they believe it to be a homicide. This is relevant to our market because it happened in our area.

Ten O'clock News, Apr 17, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 03:05, Local: A little boy is dead after his family says he was beaten at a trampoline park. The family tells us their child was at a park when he dunked on a fellow patron. Following that encounter, we're told that another patron began beating on the child leaving him severely injured. Police say the boy was taken to the hospital where he died. The family is now asking for justice following the child's death. Our coverage lets people know to take extra caution, especially on where they let their children play without supervision.

Great Day, Apr 17, 2023, 6:01 a.m., 00:26, Local: A man is dead after a shooting in southwest Fresno. It happened near MLK Blvd. and California Ave. He died and witnesses saw a white car leaving the area. two people were detained.

Great Day, Apr 20, 2023, 7:00 a.m., :43, Local: The Fresno city council is now weighing an ordinance to crack down on spectators at sideshows and street races. Councilmembers Annalisa Perea and Garry Bredefeld believe bystanders should face consequences. Police chief Paco Balderrama says he is in support of the measure. Anyone who is cited could face a \$1,000 fine and serve six months in jail.

Ten O'clock News, Apr 21, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 00:39, Local: The CHP is investigating a rollover crash in Fresno county. Officers tell us the driver lost control of the car, was ejected, and was hit and killed by the rolling car. Two passengers were also injured and taken to the hospital. There's no word on what caused the crash. This story reminds drivers to slow down when using the road where the crash happened. We will update viewers on the status of the passengers' conditions when that information is released.

Midday, Apr 21, 2023, 11:31 a.m., 00:30, Local: A Visalia Unified employee is now facing charges, accused of molesting a student. Officers say they were called to Mount Whitney High School Wednesday night for reports of an employee having an inappropriate relationship with a student. Investigators say 37-year-old Dejaun Jones, who works as a campus supervisor, exchanged nude photos and videos with a 15-year-old girl. Investigators also say Jones touched the girl inappropriately. He was arrested during a traffic stop yesterday morning. Jones is now on administrative leave.

Great Day, Apr 21, 2023, 7:06 a.m., :34, Local: A man is now behind bars, accused of robbing a gas station in Sanger. Officers say a man went to an A.M. P.M. near Academy and Fifth and tried to buy alcohol around two Wednesday morning. We're told the clerk refused to sell to him, so he pulled a gun, grabbed alcohol and then took off. Police identified and later arrested him at his home. Investigators say he is a known gang member who was out on bail.

Midday, Apr 24, 2023, 11:32 a.m., 00:35, Local: A teenager is facing charges in connection to a shooting threat at a Visalia school. Police say a 16-year-old made threats on social media about a potential shooting at Redwood High School intended for today. Investigators served a search warrant at the teen's home and arrested him. Police say there is no threat to students or staff.

Great Day, Apr 24, 2023, 7:02 a.m., 00:41, Local: A 16-year-old is now facing charges in connection to a school shooting threat in Visalia. Police say the teenager made threats on social media about a shooting at Redwood High School intended for today. Investigators tell us they searched the teen's home and arrested him yesterday. We're told there is no threat to students or staff, but there will be beefed-up law enforcement presence at all Visalia Unified campuses this week.

Ten O'clock News, Apr 27, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 03:43, Local: A man is now back in jail after police say he cut an officer. We're told police encountered the man following several burglaries they say he committed. Detectives tell us the man has a long criminal history, being arrested numerous times. Our coverage lets people know that people are going in and out of jail without facing many serious consequences. This story shows there is a criminal justice problem that needs to be addressed.

Great Day, Apr 27, 2023, 7:01 a.m., 00:30, Local: Firefighters now say thieves are responsible for a fire that badly damaged an apartment in Southeast Fresno along Kings Canyon and Willow yesterday. Crews say they were able to put out the flames before they spread to surrounding units. The apartment was abandoned. Fire investigators say it caught fire when thieves tried to use chicken wire to steal electricity.

Ten O'clock News, May 1, 2023, 10:04 p.m., 00:37, Local: The county coroner told us today that a person hit by a car last week has died. This person's identity was also released. The person was hospitalized after police say a wanted woman crashed into her and another woman who were sleeping in a tent. We covered the other victim's death and vigil. This story garnered a lot of attention due to the tragedy, and the unlikelihood of the events that led up to it. This update shows we follow through on closely watched stories, providing updates whenever they become available.

Midday, May 2, 2023, 11:30 a.m., 00:30, Local: Two people are under arrest and both of their cars are impounded after Fresno police say they caught them street racing. An officer saw the two cars weaving through traffic at over 100 miles per hour. Both drivers were taken into custody. During a search of the cars, an officer discovered a loaded gun. That driver is also facing felony gun possession charges.

Great Day, May 2, 2023, 7:01 a.m., 01:12, Local: A family is now demanding heavier charges against the distracted driver who killed their loved one, a mother of five. It happened in 2021 on Highway 41 between North and Central in Fresno. The accused distracted driver is only looking at six months of community service. The Fresno County District Attorney's office says it is working closely with the family and reports state lawmakers are responsible for determining penalties and have the power to make laws tougher.

Midday, May 3, 2023, 11:33 a.m., 00:30, Local: A man is now dead, and his body found following a house fire in Madera. The Madera county sheriff's office says a man ran into a home at avenue 16 and Kennedy street, set the home on fire, and didn't come out. The power had to be shut off for a large area around the house. Power is now restored.

Great Day, May 4, 2023, 7:05 a.m., 00:33, Local: A man is now behind bars, accused of threatening to shoot and woman in North Hanford. Detectives say he went to a home near Chianti and Muscat around noon on Tuesday and pointed a loaded assault rifle at a woman. We're told she went into another room with a newborn and locked the door before she escaped through a window. Police say they surrounded the home and arrested the man.

Ten O'clock News, May 5, 2023, 10:04 p.m., 00:35, Local: A man is now in custody after police say he held a woman captive inside his home for over an hour. Officers tell us the man let the woman go, and eventually surrendered. The suspect is now in jail. Police had to barricade themselves behind homes and other everyday items during this standoff. Our coverage lets people know why the area was shut down for an extended period.

Ten O'clock News, May 7, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 03:16, Local: 8 people dead and 7 people injured in a mall shooting in Texas. This is important to our viewers because it draws more attention to gun safety and gun violence, and it's something that could happen anywhere. It's relevant to our station because it's a situation that people are going to hear about and most people want to go to the mall, and they want to be able to feel safe in doing so. So, it continues to draw attention to gun violence and what law makers are going to do to minimize gun violence.

Midday, May 8, 2023, 11:30 a.m., 00:25, Local: The Fresno fire department is now investigating the cause of an early morning fire at a vacant church in the tower district. Firefighters say the roof of the church was already engulfed in flames by the time they arrived. Investigators say the church was vacant and boarded up. No one is hurt.

Great Day, May 8, 2023, 6:02 a.m., 00:17, Local: A man is now dead after a crash in south Fresno County. The CHP says a driver going south on Cherry Avenue veered to the right and slammed into a parked semi-truck trailer. He was badly hurt and later died. It's not yet known if drugs or alcohol played a role in the crash.

Ten O'clock News, May 9, 2023, 10:03 p.m., 00:27, Local: A man is now in the hospital recovering from stab wounds. Police say the victim was attacked by a woman with a knife following a fight. The suspect has not been caught. This stabbing happened in the middle of the city, yet the perpetrator has not been caught. Our coverage lets people know that an accused stabber is still on the loose. Unfortunately, this investigation joins a long list of violent crime cases where someone has been hospitalized, yet no one has been arrested.

Midday, May 9, 2023, 11:30 a.m., 00:40, Local: A man is under arrest after he was caught on camera lighting a sidewalk and tree on fire in southeast Fresno. In the video, you can see the man lighting a rag on fire. The flames spread to a nearby tree.

Great Day, May 9, 2023, 6:01 a.m., 00:25, Local: Police search for a shooter after a man was hit in the leg. It happened around 7 in southeast Fresno. when officers arrived, they found the man in an alley and rushed him to a nearby hospital. he is expected to make a full recovery.

Midday, May 10, 2023, 11:30 a.m., 00:55, Local: A man is behind bars after a chase through Fresno county. A Firebaugh police officer tried to pull over an SUV driven by George Rojas. When the officer walked up, that is when they say Rojas took off. Investigators say the chase reached speeds up to 120 MPH, passing cars on both sides of the road. Rojas led police through Mendota and headed east on highway 180. Officials say the man slowed down on the way to Kerman where he stopped at a home before driving off again. He eventually lost control around a corner and crashed into a parked big rig. Kerman police say Rojas tried to run but didn't get far.

Great Day, May 11, 2023, 7:01 a.m., 00:29, Local: Investigators are now looking for an accused drive-by shooter in Southeast Fresno. Police say they were called to Chestnut and Huntington around 5:30 this morning for reports of a shooting. Officers say someone shot several times at a home and cars. People were inside the home at the time, but no one is hurt. Officers say they believe this is gang-related. Anyone with information is asked to call the Fresno Police Department.

Ten O'clock News, May 12, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 01:01, Local: A man accused of being involved in four shootings is now in custody after a multi-hour long standoff with law enforcement. Officers tell us they served a warrant to the suspect's home. When he saw police, we're told the man ran and hid in another home for several hours. Eventually the man was arrested and taken to jail. This story is important for our market because police say the man was armed and had been involved in multiple shootings. The accused gunman's arrest means fewer violent people are on the streets.

Great Day, May 15, 2023, 6:02 a.m., 00:25, Local: The search is on for a shooter this morning, police say it happened in clovis at the Sierra vista mall over the weekend. One person was hurt but is now recovering in the hospital. There was a crash in the parking lot that they believe is connected to the shooting.

Great Day, May 15, 2023, 7:02 a.m., 00:34, Local: A man is now facing charges after a standoff with swat in North Fresno. Police were called to an apartment near Bulldog Lane and Ninth Street around 10 last night for reports of domestic violence. Investigators say a man took off and then came back around two this morning. We're told he barricaded himself, another person, and a child inside the apartment. Investigators say he had a weapon on him and refused to come out. That's when police say they brought in the SWAT team to take him into custody.

Ten O'clock News, May 16, 2023, 10:00 p.m., 03:25, Local: We reported a deputy involved shooting as breaking news. The sheriff's office tells us a man was trying to lure student athletes away from a playing field. When coaches confronted the man, we're told he drew a knife. After following him for several blocks, deputies asked the man to surrender. After a confrontation, we're told the suspect tried to attack deputies. That's when deputies say they shot and killed him. The shooting victim's identity has not been released. This happened in a busy part of the community of Caruthers. No one else was hurt, but several businesses were forced to close. Our coverage lets people know why many areas were shut down.

Great Day, May 17, 2023, 6:03 a.m., 00:19, Local: A homeowner in southeast Fresno is now asking for help identifying an accused porch pirate. It happened around five Monday afternoon. near Armstrong and kings canyon.

Great Day, May 18, 2023, 7:03 a.m., 00:38, Local: The search is now on for the person responsible for shooting and killing a man in his front yard in Madera. It happened near L and 7th around 3:30 yesterday afternoon, across from Madera High School. Police say they found a car on fire a few blocks away shortly after, but it is unclear if the car is connected to the shooting. Anyone with information is urged to call the Madera Police Department.

Great Day, May 19, 2023, 6:33 a.m., 00:24, Local: Visalia teacher is now facing child molestation charges. Investigators say the relationship lasted several months. He was arrested on three counts of child molestation.

Great Day, May 23, 2023, 7:01 a.m., 00:26, Local: A driver is now facing hit and run charges, accused of crashing into a cemetery in West Fresno. Viewer video shows the truck sitting in Holy Cross Cemetery near Belmont and Hughes on Sunday night. We're told the driver plowed through a fence, rolled over several gravestones, then backed out and took off. The driver was eventually arrested.

Great Day, May 24, 2023, 7:04 a.m., 00:31, Local: A bakery owner in Central Fresno is facing federal charges, accused of swindling the government out of millions of dollars. Court documents reveal he directed his staff to exchange SNAP benefits for money and accepting SNAP benefits at the request of customers. If convicted, he faces a maximum of 20 years in prison and a \$250k dollar fine.

Great Day, May 26, 2023, 7:01 a.m., 00:32, Local: A Clovis man is now facing attempted murder and domestic violence charges. Jagtar Singh was arrested in Los Banos after leaving town following a fight with his wife on Wednesday night. Investigators say he hit her several times, then cut her neck with a large kitchen knife before dropping her off near Clovis Community Hospital. She is recovering, while her husband was arrested.

Great Day, May 29, 2023, 8:01 a.m., 00:35, Local: A Fresno neighborhood is dealing with a series of car burglaries after four cars were hit. Someone jumped out of a car, pulling on every handle and they were caught on camera. Fresno police encourage everyone to always lock their cars and want anyone that recognizes the car to call police.

Ten O'clock News, May 31, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 00:43, Local: A man is in custody after the CHP says he hit and killed a man riding a bike. We're told after the crash instead of caring for the cyclist, the driver fled. Later, the driver was arrested for DUI and vehicular manslaughter. This crash continues an unsettling uptick in the number of crashes involving motor vehicles and pedestrians/bikers. Our coverage lets people know to use extra caution when driving around people and bikers.

Great Day, Jun 1, 2023, 8:02 a.m., 00:21, Local: Police are now trying to put together the pieces to a deadly stabbing in downtown Fresno. It happened near the Poverello house. one person was detained but cannot confirm any involvement in the stabbing.

Great Day, Jun 5, 2023, 7:03 a.m., 00:23, Local: Police chief Paco Balderrama is now warning street racers and sideshow drivers that they are not welcome in Fresno. He announced the creation of the police department's street racing team yesterday. It's part of an effort to crack down on street races and change the perception that the city is a hotspot for the activity. The city now has a hotline to gather information on sideshows.

Great Day, Jun 5, 2023, 8:03 a.m., 00:18, Local: A man is now recovering after getting stabbed in a fight in Merced County. Deputies say the fight happened on Hyde Street in the farming community of le grand.

Ten O'clock News, Jun 7, 2023, 10:04 p.m., 00:38, Local: A school in Madera was put on lock down today after a man was shot next to the campus. Police say it happened around 3:15p.m. Officers found the victim and had him taken to the hospital. His condition is unknown. We're told a man was arrested for the shooting. His identity has not been released. Fortunately, no one in the nearby school was hurt. In the U.S. school shootings are on the rise. Because this happened so close to a nearby school, it put many parents and community members on edge.

Ten O'clock News, Jun 8, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 00:35, Local: Fresno police and the county's swat team have been in a standoff with a man in central Fresno. Law enforcement says the man was involved in a domestic violence dispute and is now armed and dangerous. We're told surrounding homes were evacuated. Police tell us they have been negotiating with the man to leave the house for several hours. Our coverage lets people know to avoid the area in order to avoid getting hit by gunfire.

Ten O'clock News, Jun 11, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 01:05, Local: A street vendor was verbally attacked and physically threatened by a man who was annoyed at the sound of the vendor's horn. This is important to our viewers because this is a hate crime - and the valley is field with street vendors, and it causes a lot of outrage in the south valley. There's been previous stories of street vendors attacked here in Fresno, but that was the first time something like this happened in Hanford.

This story is important to our viewer because it shows people that a person accused of vicious crime was caught and is now being held responsible for their actions.

This is important to our viewers because it received a lot of attention since it happened in a small town, and deputies believe it a targeted attack, and need the help from the public to help track down the suspect. This is important to our viewers because this man is in a role of leadership at a high school that has students of all sorts of income and diversity. Experts warn flooding from the snowpack melt could cause long-term problems for pima cotton, tomatoes and dairy farms. Tulare County produces more than 20% of all milk consumed in the U.S.

Great Day, Apr 6, 2023, 7:12 a.m., 00:21, Local: Mariposa Grove in Yosemite National Park is now reopening to pedestrians. The grove closed back in February after its access road was damaged by snow. Park rangers are urging visitors to be cautious, as the trails could be icy. The road is still closed to bike and vehicular traffic.

Great Day, Apr 7, 2023, 6:04 a.m., 00:25, Local: Fresno County officials are now warning people about celebrating Easter at a park near rivers. Many County parks are still closed because of high water levels and potential flooding. Deputies say they're concerned about parks near the Kings and San Joaquin Rivers. Water levels are being monitored every day.

Great Day, Apr 11, 2023, 7:05 a.m., 01:10, Local: Cal Fire crews are beefing up a washed-out bridge in Three Rivers ahead of expected flooding from snowmelt. That means recreational activities like boating, kayaking, and swimming are not allowed. If anyone is caught, they face a minimum fine of up to \$225.

This is important to our viewers because it is causing flooding as well as impacting farming. This is important to our viewers because with summer coming up more people are wanting to camp and visit the national park, and with temperatures rising people are also wanting to go hiking and into the water, so this package is giving the latest information on the national park and what they need to know before they visit. It's also a follow up to our previous coverage of the park.

Law enforcement is urging people to stay out of the water because it is contaminated with chemicals from farms... so it's not a good idea to eat the crawdads.

Great Day, Jun 27, 2023, 6:02 a.m., 00:23, Local: Historic Sierra snowmelt is expected. It may help lakes hit full capacity. Temperatures in the valley will hit triple digits for several days this weekend. However, the Kings River is still closed to recreational use because the water is fast and cold.

Midday, Apr 13, 2023, 11:30 a.m., 01:00, Local: President Biden now says hundreds of thousands of immigrants brought to the U.S. illegally as children will now be able to apply for Medicaid and the affordable care act's health insurance. The DACA initiative shields immigrants from deportation after they were brought to the U.S. as young children. It also allows them to work legally. This group is known as "dreamers." This move is likely to generate pushback from conservative leaders of states that are reluctant to expand Medicaid and already critical of the Biden administration's response to migrants entering the country illegally.

Midday, Apr 25, 2023, 11:32 a.m., 00:20, Local: A new medical helicopter is now serving the south valley. Reach Air Medical Services announced its new base in Porterville. It will serve all of Tulare county. Pilots, flight nurses, and flight paramedics will staff the base.

Ten O'clock News, May 15, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 02:00, Local: The governor of California approved a program. that gives hospitals the opportunity to apply for grants. \$150 million is allocated for the program. This program. is designed to help health centers that are either struggling or have already gone under. this story applies to our market because a town in our viewing area went under last year. Officials with that hospital can apply to receive money that would potentially revive its services. If this hospital returns, many people will no longer have to travel great distances just to receive basic medical care.

Great Day, May 16, 2023, 7:08 a.m., 01:05, Local: A man is now voicing concerns about the Four Seasons Chinese restaurant in Clovis after spotting a rat on a chandelier. He reported the restaurant to the health department because he's concerned for other customers. A representative with Fresno County says the restaurant is up to date on its operating permit and fees. They add there are no plans to inspect the restaurant currently.

Ten O'clock News, Jun 26, 2023, 10:11 p.m., 00:24, Local: A rat was caught on camera scurrying around a local mall. The mall's ownership tells us the rat did not get into any of the restaurants and was confined to the seating area. This is follow-up to previous coverage on Trump. The former president has many followers here in the central valley. Our coverage lets viewers know about his latest legal troubles, and whether these recent issues will disqualify him from running for president in 2024.

Ten O'clock News, May 10, 2023, 10:12 p.m., 02:27, Local: Title 42 is set to expire tomorrow, and the Biden administration makes last minute border moves. This comes as the president faces criticism from both Republicans and Democrats with a potential massive surge of migrants trying to cross the southern border. This is important to our viewers as California is a state that is home to the southern border, and a state that has seen border changes since Former President Trump to office. This is relevant to our market because certain states allow abortion while others don't. California is one that does allow it but if they take the pill away what does that mean for the state, so the topic is still hot.

Ten O'clock News, Jun 23, 2023, 10:31 p.m., 00:28, Local: The United States Supreme Court declined to block the Biden Administration's policy to prioritize deportations of immigrants who are deemed to be public safety risks or were picked up at the border. This is important to our viewers being that immigrations are major thing in California as we hug the Mexico border, and a lot of immigrants are here in California. This is relevant to our market because it's a national story with a regional tie to it.

Ten O'clock News, Apr 5, 2023, 10:08 p.m., 02:13, Local: More people comment on Former President Donald Trump's indictment and what factors the hush money played within 2016 election and the role it could play in the upcoming election. This is continuing coverage story that follows along with Trump and his indictment as across the country people are waiting for his next court date and how that could affect him campaigning. It also talks about the legal case and who should be handling it as attorneys from both sides continue to go head-to-head. It's relevant to our viewers because it keeps them updated as we look at what's happening now and what we could be seeing in the future.

Ten O'clock News, May 3, 2023, 10:02 p.m., 03:30, Local: A family asking for help bringing their little boy home after he was swept away by floodwaters during a severe storm. They have been trying to get the attention of Governor Gavin Newsom, who replied saying he was in the area. Officers found the man lying on the road and rushed him to Kaweah Health Medical Center. His condition is unknown, the driver is cooperating with police.

Great Day, Apr 6, 2023, 6:01 a.m., 00:20, Local: Man under arrest after a raid at a home in Reedley. It happened around 9 a.m. Tuesday morning. He had a warrant out of Oregon. No other info has been released.

Great Day, Apr 7, 2023, 7:07 a.m., 00:50, Local: A Dos Palos mother is now doing all she can to reunite her daughter with her chihuahua after it was attacked by another dog. The dog is now in the hands of a rescue group for medical treatment. The family had to give up ownership because they couldn't afford the veterinarian bills, but support from people on social media is already pouring in. The Merced County Sheriff's office reports its animal services bureau is trying to reunite them.

Ten O'clock News, Apr 10, 2023, 10:05 p.m., 00:26, Local: A local sheriff's department captured video of a man in a truck driving past 'road closed' signs in order to travel on a flooded road. The video shows the truck getting suck in several feet of water. Deputies showed a picture of the man wearing wet clothes, and say the driver had to swim to dry land in order to avoid drowning. Our coverage reminds drivers to follow signs so that they do not put themselves, and law enforcement, at risk of drowning.

Ten O'clock News, Apr 13, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 00:40, Local: A woman is now in the hospital after hurt in a crash. The incident happened this afternoon on a busy highway south of Fresno. Law enforcement says the woman, for unknown reasons, stopped in the middle of the highway, and was hit by a truck. We're told the woman was airlifted to the hospital. It's unknown if she will recover. This story is important for our viewers because it congested traffic on the road for over an hour. Our coverage also lets people know to continue to use caution on this route.

Great Day, Apr 13, 2023, 6:02 a.m., 00:33, Local: A woman is now recovering after a bad crash in Fresno County. Happened near Nebraska and Highway 41. Northeast of Caruthers around 3:45 yesterday. Her condition is unknown this morning. The truck driver was not hurt, alcohol and drugs are now believed to be factors in this crash.

Great Day, Apr 14, 2023, 7:01 a.m., 00:20, Local: A child is now dead after a crash in Visalia. Police say they were called to the area of West Riggin and Denton just before 3 Sunday afternoon. We're told a child riding an all-terrain vehicle was hit by a truck and died. The driver of the truck is cooperating. Drugs and alcohol are not believed to be factors in this crash.

Ten O'clock News, Apr 18, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 00:41, Local: A driver is now dead, and his passenger is severely injured after the CHP says they were in a car that was hit by a train. Officers say the driver went around posted warning signs before being hit by the Amtrak. There's no word on why the driver failed to obey posted warning signs. The river has been closed for several weeks due to the influx of rainfall we have seen this year. After the boaters were rescued, they were cited for being on a closed body of water. Following the rescue and citation, law enforcement told us once again that they need everyone to obey closure signs to keep the public, and first responders, safe. Our coverage lets people know many bodies of water are still close to high water levels. This story could not also save someone money, but also their life.

This is important to our viewers because with the recent school shootings, and Clovis getting calls about shootings, school threats are taken very seriously, and students and staff want to know whether they are safe to go to school. This is relevant because it impacts several people's lives in the south valley.

Ten O'clock News, Apr 24, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 02:58, Local: A man died in a fire in central Fresno. The man was in a drainage ditch when the fire broke out. Firefighters say the man was killed by the heat and smoke before first responders could save him. Now, neighbors near the site are asking for the railroad to make changes to the area in order to prevent further safety problems. This story is not only sad but holds a big company accountable. Through our medium, residents can voice their frustration about surrounding safety problems. This is a platform they would not normally have.

Great Day, Apr 24, 2023, 7:08 a.m., 01:10, Local: Three new gun safety bills will be presented by state lawmakers today. Lawmakers and gun control advocates announced legislation yesterday aimed at curbing the use of guns and supporting people impacted by gun violence. It was announced in Monterey Park - where 11 people died in a mass shooting in January.

Midday, Apr 26, 2023, 11:33 a.m., 00:30, Local: PG&E is set to update the public on flood control efforts in the Tulare lakebed this afternoon. Representatives with the company are holding a meeting at the Corcoran substation at 1:00 p.m. PG&E reports it is still surveying flood risk and removing transformers from flooded areas. The utility company shut off power for 105 customers due to flooding.

Great Day, Apr 26, 2023, 5:06 a.m., :53, Local: Yosemite National Park is now taking measures ahead of expected flooding. The park is closing most of Yosemite Valley on Friday night. The Merced River runs along most of the valley floor and is expected to flood up to 12 feet. Park rangers demonstrated a water rescue to illustrate the dangers of navigating rushing water.

Midday, May 1, 2023, 11:35 a.m., 00:35, Local: Cal Trans reports it does not expect to open highway 180 between Grant Grove and Cedar Grove in Sequoia and Kings Canyon National Park. This means there will likely be no access to Cedar Grove until the fall. The highway was badly damaged by this year's storms and is not fully repaired. The Mineral King area in Sequoia National Park is not expected to open until mid-June.

Great Day, May 1, 2023, 7:01 a.m., 00:19, Local: Yosemite National Park is now open again after closing due to expected flooding from the Merced River. The park service reports the river did not rise as much as forecasted over the weekend, so the park fully reopened at 7 this morning - two days ahead of the original reopening date. The park service is urging people to stay away from the rivers because the water levels are still high.

Great Day, May 4, 2023, 8:06 a.m., 00:21, Local: CHP is reminding drivers that sideshows are illegal and dangerous. A new video is now out showing large crowds attending the street races. Those who are caught will be fined and could spend up to 90 days in jail.

Midday, May 5, 2023, 11:30 a.m., 00:30, Local: Lockdowns at Kastner Intermediate School and Lincoln Elementary School in Fresno are now lifted. The campuses were placed on lockdown due to a standoff at a nearby home. Fresno police say the man is still refusing to talk and won't come out. Investigators say the man is a felon and is armed.

Great Day, May 5, 2023, 7:07 a.m., 00:25, Local: Families in Madera County are now eligible for federal disaster assistance after severe storms and floods. Some could be eligible for grants to pay for temporary housing and home repairs, as well as expenses for childcare, moving and storage. It also allows governments to be reimbursed for emergency response, debris removal, and restoration of damaged public facilities and infrastructure.

The Governor's office announced the state will fund the project and add 290 million dollars' worth of flood-related proposals in the state budget.

Ten O'clock News, May 14, 2023, 10:03 p.m., 02:30, Local: A local law firm gathers community members together to beat a Guinness World Record to help raise awareness on bike safety. This is important to our viewers because temperatures are rising, and people will be out riding more. Ten O'clock News, May 21, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 03:00, Local: Two kids went missing in the Kings River after being swept away, one kid was found dead, other still missing. This is important to our viewers because multiple agencies and news outlets have said to stay clear of waterways and rivers are closed, and when people don't follow the rules, it can often lead to tragedy. This is relevant because it could happen to anyone, and it's another reminder as to way people need to stay clear of water ways as snow begins to melt away. It's a sad follow up to an ongoing issue.

Ten O'clock News, May 22, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 03:22, Local: This weekend, two children drowned in a river in our viewing area. One of the children was found yesterday, while the other was found around noon today. We covered the original drowning, so this is an update to our coverage. The coverage goes over why it's important to stay clear of riverways and alternatives places families can go to while cooling down but also remaining safe.

Ten O'clock News, May 26, 2023, 10:09 p.m., 01:56, Local: A little boy was riding a scooter with his service dog, when a hawk swooped down, snatched the dog, and flew away. The boy thought the dog was gone for good. Today, the dog was found a half mile from where it was taken. This is such a unique story that is sure to gain traction not just locally, but nationally. All of the unexpected twists make this story lighthearted and intriguing.

Ten O'clock News, May 29, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 00:40, Local: One person is dead and three are in the hospital after a crash in Fresno county, just north of Clovis. The CHP tells us one of the drivers involved blew through a stop sign before hitting another car. The driver in the car that was hit died. Two passengers in that car were hospitalized. We're told the offending driver is also in the hospital. It's unknown if alcohol and drugs played a role in the crash.

Great Day, May 30, 2023, 7:02 a.m., 00:39, Local: A woman is now dead and three people - including children - are in the hospital after a crash in Fresno County. It happened near Minnewawa and International around 4:30 yesterday afternoon. The CHP says a woman driving a Mercedes did not stop at a stop sign and hit a Honda going north on Minnewawa. The driver of the Honda died. Two children in the car were taken to CRMC, and the driver of the Mercedes is also at a hospital for treatment. She faces felony vehicular manslaughter charges once she is released.

Great Day, Jun 1, 2023, 7:01 a.m., 00:25, Local: A man is now dead following a crash in West Fresno County. The CHP says it happened around 10:20 last night near Bryan and Highway 180. Officers say a man walking north on Bryan tried to cross the dark highway and walked in front of a Honda heading east on the 180. The driver of the Honda is cooperating with the investigation.

Great Day, Jun 2, 2023, 7:02 a.m., 00:31, Local: A man is now dead after a crash in Fresno County near Kingsburg. The CHP says the car was heading south in the left lane and swerved, going off the right shoulder before hitting a fence and rolling over several times. The man was not wearing a seatbelt and thrown from the car. Officers say a truck driver who saw the crash tried to give the driver CPR. Investigators believe alcohol played a role in the crash.

Our coverage lets people know that police want to identify the body, and that it is dangerous to swim in Fresno County waters due to this winter's storms.

Great Day, Jun 13, 2023, 7:03 a.m., 00:33, Local: A man is now dead following a crash in South Fresno. The CHP says two young men ran across the street in front of a truck going north on Chestnut near Central Avenues early this morning. The driver tried to avoid them but hit one of the men. Firefighters say they found him trapped underneath the pickup. He was pulled out from under the truck, but he died. Drugs and alcohol are not believed to be factors in this crash.

Ten O'clock News, Jun 14, 2023, 10:01 p.m., 00:39, Local: Tulare county deputies are looking for a man who they say fell out of a raft in the Kern river. He was a member of a group of five who fell out of the boat. We're told four others were found. Deputies say they will continue their search in the morning. Police say a man in a pickup was going west on McKinley when he rear-ended a black sedan, veered off the road, and plowed into a tree. The pickup burst into flames. The people in the other car are not badly hurt and are cooperating.

Ten O'clock News, Jun 15, 2023, 10:01p.m., 03:03, Local: People in Clovis have been seeing sightings of coyotes, and coyotes' attacks with family pets are happening more and more, not only here but across the state. The story is important to viewers because it allows them to be aware of their surroundings and lets them know of the precautions, they should take to remain safe. It's relevant to our viewers as it's happening in our area.

Great Day, Jun 15, 2023, 7:01 a.m., 00:38, Local: The search continues for a man who fell into the Kern River while kayaking in the Sequoia National Forest. Tulare Co. sheriff's deputies say they were called to Ant River Canyon along the river around 5:30 last night. Five people were kayaking when river flows caused them to fall out of the raft. Four people were rescued. The sheriff says this should be a reminder that waterways are still dangerous due to historic snowmelt.

This is important to our viewers because it's their peers' lives that have been affected by the lack of safety at this intersection. This is relevant to our market because it's at an intersection that could be traveling through.

Great Day, Jun 22, 2023, 6:06 a.m., 00:28, Local: A man is now dead following a crash on highway 99 in Visalia. officers say a man was driving south in a Ford when he veered left, hit the center divider and crashed. he got out of the car and was hit by another car and killed.

Great Day, Jun 22, 2023, 7:06 a.m., 01:10, Local: A low-income housing project proposal is facing pushback from businesses in North Fresno. It would turn a motel on Thesta and Fresno into a low-income housing complex. Great Day, Jun 23, 2023, 8:01 a.m., 00:34, Local: Officials are investigating a deadly crash in Tulare County. CHP learned a car drifted into the wrong lane and caused another car to swerve off the road and crash into a tree and flip. He died on the scene and the other driver stayed on the scene. Alcohol is believed to have played a role.

This is important to our viewers as we are surrounded by agriculture and this petition impacts a large amount of the central valley. This is relevant to our market because this petition and push affects our people.

Midday, Apr 14, 2023, 11:30 a.m., 01:00, Local: The lockdown at Lemoore High School is now lifted after a gun was discovered on campus. Police say the student who had the gun was detained. The school released a notice to parents saying the lockdown was a precautionary measure.

Midday, Apr 19, 2023, 11:30 a.m., 00:35, Local: A woman is now dead after she was hit by a truck driven by an off-duty Clovis police department employee. It happened just before 8:00 a.m. at Bethel and Clinton avenues. CHP says the woman in her 50s was walking her dog on a one lane rural road at the time of the crash. Investigators say it still isn't clear what led to the crash, but they do say the driver remained on scene and performed CPR until first responders arrived.

Midday, Apr 20, 2023, 11:30 a.m., 01:15, Local: A vice principal at Sunnyside High School is now on paid administrative leave after he was caught on camera making racist comments to two teenagers on his day off. Fresno Unified says it has opened an investigation. It also says the labels used in the video don't meet the high standard expected of the district's leaders and staff.

Midday, Apr 28, 2023, 11:35 a.m., 00:30, Local: One person is in critical condition following a bad crash in northwest Fresno. Just before 11:00 a.m., Fresno police say emergency crews arrived on scene at Marks avenue and Bellaire street. That is where crews performed CPR on a driver involved in the crash. That driver was taken to a hospital. This story was breaking news and details are limited, but we were live at the scene of the crash.

Midday, May 4, 2023, 11:35 a.m., 00:40, Local: More than \$4 million worth of drugs is now off the street after a big bust in Merced county. Great Day, May 9, 2923, 7:05 a.m., 00:43, Local: A major project is now underway to improve an almost three-mile stretch of Highway 41 in Madera County. It impacts the section of highway between Avenue 15 and SR 145. The highway will be closed to one lane between 8 p.m. and 6 p.m. Caltrans is widening the shoulders on both sides of the highway by five feet to make more room. They are also leveling the roadways to improve visibility for drivers. The estimated total cost of the project is almost \$16 million dollars.
