TOWN HALL MEETINGS

In our continuing efforts to inform, protect and serve our community we produced three LIVE Town Halls: “Your Voice, Your Future” during the 2nd Quarter of 2018.

All were streamed LIVE on our website.

All were interactive taking questions from the audience or our viewers on LIVE stream or Social Media.

All topics covered were suggested by our viewers and confirmed by our audience research projects.

Event: Town Hall Meeting. Date: May 29, 2018. Aired from 6:00-7:00 p.m. on KMPH-Local
We explored the topic of the huge numbers of stray animals in our area, including the reasons why that happens. Our panel included four experts in the field, including the director of the San Francisco ASPCA. We urged people to spay and neuter their pets. This is an important issue to our area because it has one of the largest stray animal populations in the country.

Event: Town Hall Meeting. Date: May 8, 2018. Aired from 6:00-8:00 p.m. on KMPH-Local
With a panel of six leading law enforcement and schools officials we explored several topics about safety in schools. We took questions from viewers that the panel answered, which included tips for parents on how to teach their children how to react in the event of violence at schools, what the schools have in mind for planning, and local law enforcement planning. This is an incredibly important issue to our viewers and those throughout the country as everyone struggles with violence in schools and how to keep their children safe.

Event: Live gubernatorial debate. Date: April 25, 2018. Aired from 6:00-8:00 p.m. on KMPH-local
We had four of the top five candidates for governor who debated live on our air. Topics included water and agriculture, immigration reform, California’s high-speed rail project, crime, (especially proposition 47) and other issues. This was important to our viewers as it helped them make their choice in the June primary election, and got answers to questions they have about issues important to them.”

CONSUMER AWARENESS

Ten O'clock, Apr 5, 2018, 10:22 PM, 1:15, Local:

A Clovis resident received two voicemails from someone claiming to be from the IRS. The voicemails claim that they are being audited and need some personal information. Clovis Police says that these tax scams have been going around. Clovis Police also says that you should never give personal information over the phone. This is important because people need to know about these scam calls, and that the IRS would never request personal information over the phone.

Ten O'clock, Apr 8, 2018, 10:02 PM, :22, Local:

Yosemite Valley is back open to the public after heavy rain and flooding forced officials to close the park. Water is still moving very quickly but the flooding has receded and only a few roads still have water on them. This is important because Yosemite is a large tourist attraction and many people visit every day, also businesses are impacted by the closures.

Ten O'clock, Apr 10, 2018, 10:05 PM, :47, Local:

Residents in the town of Three Rivers got phone calls from someone claiming that they are going to hell if they are not a member of their church. The person on the phone then requests money to join the right church. Investigators say that you should never give your personal information out over the phone. This is important because this is an exploitation of faith and people could be pressured to give their information to these people.

Midday, Apr 10, 2018, 11:51 AM, 6:00, Local:

We went live to Washington, D.C. where Facebook CEO Mark Zuckerberg is testifying before Congress about a massive data breach affecting tens of millions of users. This is important for viewers because Zuckerberg is expected to explain how almost 87 million user's data ended up in the hands of a consulting firm known as Cambridge Analytica and it's possible local people were impacted.

Great Day, Apr 11, 2018, 5:04 AM, :45, Local:

Police are warning people about a new scam that is trying to exploit peoples' faith. Several people in Tulare County say they've received a call over the past few days, saying they'll go to hell if they aren't a member of a specific church. The caller then asks them to send \$100 to join the church, and another \$100 per month afterward. Investigators are warning people not to feel pressured. This is important for people to know because it can be easy to fall into a scammer's trap. People should know not to give away their personal information, or send donations in cash.

Great Day, Apr 13, 2018, 05:04 AM, :30, Local:

A valley tax preparer is accused of stealing more than \$63,000 from the IRS. Prosecutors say he prepared fake returns for several clients in Modesto. They say he would prepare a correct return for people before electronically filing a fake one, then direct some of the money into his account. This is important for people in our area because they may be held accountable by the government, and they should be made aware that it may not be their fault.

Ten O'clock, Apr 14, 2018, 10:07 PM, :15, Local:

The "Jackpot Roping" event took place at the Clovis Rodeo Grounds today in preparation for the annual Clovis Rodeo. Cowboys and cowgirls of all ages showed off their roping skills during the all-day event. This is important to the community because the Clovis Rodeo is a huge event for the city that brings in a lot of tourism and is good for businesses around the area.

Great Day, Apr 24, 2018, 05:06 AM, 1:00, Local:

A Fresno couple is claiming that a thief stole wedding gifts out of a storage unit, and they weren't told about it for months. Now they say there are probably more people affected by the theft that still don't know. Police say it's a good idea to inventory everything you have in storage in case this happens to you. You should keep a list with item descriptions, serial numbers, and cost. This is important for people in our area because it could help viewers get back their stuff if it is ever stolen.

Ten O'clock, Apr 25, 2018, 10:21 PM, :39, Local:

PG&E says that it has received multiple reports of scam calls asking for personal information and money from people who it claims are past due on their payment. PG&E says that it will never ask for an immediate payment over the phone or in person. This is important because people need to know that PG&E will never call them and request a payment like that so they can be aware of scams.

Great Day, Apr 26, 2018, 05:18 AM, :39, Local:

PG&E is warning people about a new scam that's going around. The company says it's received several reports of scammers calling people, threatening to cut off their power unless they make a payment over the phone. PG&E says you should not believe those callers. The utility company says it will never ask for immediate payment over the phone or in person. It also says it won't ask for your credit card or personal info over the phone. This is important for people in our area to know because scammers are constantly trying to find ways to gather their information so they can take their money. It's important for them to know not to give that information out freely.

Ten O'clock, May 4, 2018, 10:09 PM, :42, Local:

A team of forgers is scamming people in Clovis. Police say that the scammers are using fake copied credit cards to withdraw thousands of dollars from ATM's. This is important because people should be aware that there are scammers going around so they can be more aware of their information.

Midday, May 8, 2018, 11:46 AM, :33, Local:

Experts say you should pay attention to small details while booking a flight or you could end up spending more than you planned on. They say you should double check the name on your ticket to ensure it matches the information on your travel document. This is important for viewers because summer is on the way and many people are preparing for summer vacations. This information could help them save money.

Ten O'clock, May 9, 2018, 10:08 PM, 1:32, Local:

A mandate is being pushed by the California Energy Commission. The mandate would require that solar panels be put on all new homes in the state. This is important because many new homes are being built in the Central Valley and this could affect the cost of homes in the future.

Ten O'clock, May 12, 2018, 10:08 PM, :26, Local:

The second Saturday of every month is set aside for cruising down Fulton Street in downtown Fresno. Car enthusiasts are welcomed to show off their vehicles. Now that Fulton is open to traffic this is possible. This is important because there are many businesses on Fulton Street that will benefit from all the traffic around their businesses and the City of Fresno pushes hard for downtown redevelopment.

Midday, May 14, 2018, 11:45 AM, :27, Local:

If you ate at a Chili's restaurant in March or April, you may want to keep an eye on your credit and debit card statements. The restaurant chain announced it had a data breach. Chili's said malware was used to gather payment card information. This story is important for viewers because they need to know if their personal information is taken.

Midday, May 15, 2018, 11:47 AM, :30, Local:

Facebook is suspending about 200 apps it believes may have misused data. Users that may have been exposed will be notified. This story is important because thousands of people in the Central Valley use Facebook and may not realize how much of their private information is being mined.

Ten O'clock, May 16, 2018, 10:04 PM, 1:38, Local:

Grizzly Fest is coming up soon and heavy traffic is to be expected for the two-day event. There will be shuttles bringing people to and from Downtown Fresno to alleviate some of the traffic. This is important because this is a very large event for the city of Fresno, it will affect many businesses in the area, and drivers in certain parts of the city will be affected by heavy traffic.

Ten O'clock, May 19, 2018, 10:09 PM, :25, Local:

The Professional Latin American Association put on its fourth annual "Taco Truck Throwdown" in Hanford. Taco trucks and Taquerias battle to be named the best taco. All proceeds go to college scholarships. This is important because the valley has a large Latin American population and this money is going to help many students pay for college.

Ten O'clock, May 24, 2018, 10:06 PM, :47, Local:

There is another scam going around Fresno. A Fresno business received a phone call from someone claiming to be PG&E saying that power would be turned off due to a missed payment. PG&E warns that it will never make calls threatening to turn off electricity. This is important because if someone were to believe one of these calls their personal information could be at risk.

Great Day, May 25, 2018, 5:07 AM, 1:00, Local:

A state lawmaker says long lines seen at the DMV are unacceptable. Assemblyman Jim Patterson says the state legislature gave the DMV an extra \$23 million last year to hire more staff. The DMV is blaming the increased wait times on the new real-ID drivers' licenses, which require more documents. The DMV says the best way to avoid long wait times is to make an appointment. This is an important story for people in our area because a lot of them will need to go to the DMV at some time in the future, and they should know that something is being done to lower the wait times. In the meantime, the story also goes into how to avoid the wait.

Great Day, May 31, 2018, 05:03 AM, :45, Local:

Sheriff's deputies are warning people about a scam that is going around Tulare County. They say a caller claiming to work for the sheriff's office tells people they missed a court date, and must pay hundreds of dollars or they will be arrested. Deputies say the sheriff's department will never make calls like this. It is asking anyone who receives such a call to report it immediately. This is important for people in our area because it could keep them from losing hundreds or thousands of dollars for nothing.

Great Day, Jun 1, 2018, 5:06 AM, :45, Local:

Saturday service is making a comeback at some DMV offices across the state, including the Fresno and Clovis offices. The change comes after Fresno assemblyman Jim Patterson criticized the DMV for not doing enough to reduce long lines. This is an important story for people in our area to know about because they should know about the department's extended hours. Visiting the offices during those hours could save people a lot of time and heartache.

Midday, Jun 4, 2018, 11:44 AM, :18, Local:

Event ticketing company, "Ticketfly", is working to get back online after hackers took over the site. The company announced that data was stolen from more than 26 million customers' names, addresses, email addresses and phone numbers may have been exposed. The company says passwords and credit card numbers were not affected. This story is important for viewers because their personal information may have been compromised.

Great Day, Jun 20, 2018, 5:09 AM, :25, Local:

Deputies in Madera County are warning everyone about a new scam. They say a man is calling people, claiming to work with the sheriff's department. The scammer tells his targets they have outstanding warrants, and asks them to pay up. The sheriff's office says it will never do that. This is important for people in our area to know about because it can protect them from being separated from their money.

CRIME

Ten O'clock, Apr 1, 2018, 10:01 PM, :41, Local:

The Tulare County Sheriff's Department says a man accused of a string of burglaries is behind bars. He's accused of stealing cars, check fraud, and drug-related crimes. This is important to our community because, since the passage of Proposition 47, there's been an increase in property crimes.

Ten O'clock, Apr 6, 2018, 10:07 PM, 1:33, Local:

A man driving a silver Chrysler car followed a woman into an IRS parking lot in a fit of rage. He plowed through a fence and almost hit someone walking on a sidewalk. He also hit an employee's car. The driver is facing several felony vandalism charges. This is important because people should be cautious of others driving on the road.

Ten O'clock, Apr 6, 2018, 10:08 PM, :30, Local:

Two masked men broke into a Parlier woman's kitchen while she was still home. The intruders took off before deputies arrived. This is important to the community because people should be aware of security measures in their home and to always leave doors and windows locked.

Ten O'clock, Apr 8, 2018, 10:02 PM, :30, Local:

An officer walking through an apartment complex found a man holding a rifle loaded with armor-piercing rounds. The officer was called to the area because of a disturbance at a home. The officer arrested the man and confiscated the weapon. This is important because the man could have seriously harmed someone in the area, including his wife and children who were at home and viewers need to know when someone is arrested for this type of crime.

Ten O'clock, Apr 9, 2018, 10:03 PM, 1:02, Local:

Surveillance video caught two men breaking into a West Fresno home and stealing electronics and other belongings. The homeowners were on vacation at the time of the burglary. This is important to our viewers because anyone could be a target for thieves looking to break into homes and people need to always remember to take as many security precautions as possible.

Great Day, Apr 9, 2018, 5:04 AM, 1:00, Local:

Police are searching for two men who robbed a Clovis bank over the weekend. The robbery happened around 11 o'clock at the Citibank near Shaw and Minnewawa. According to police, two men dressed in all black walked into the bank with guns, demanding money. Officers say the men got away in a van, which they ditched about a block from the bank. This is important for people in our area to know about because information a viewer has could help police get these men off the streets before they strike again, and potentially hurt someone.

Great Day, Apr 10, 2018, 5:02 AM, 1:00, Local:

Police are looking for two men who broke into a West Fresno home over the weekend. The break in was caught on a surveillance system set up inside and outside the home. Police say having a surveillance system is one of the best things you can do to help officers catch thieves. This is an important story for people in our area to know about because they can help police catch wanted thieves and in the future.

Great Day, Apr 12, 2018, 5:04 AM, 1:00, Local:

A Fresno woman is asking a parole board to keep her mother, Susan Russo, in prison. Russo is convicted of killing her husband back in 1994. She was sentenced to life without parole, but Governor Jerry Brown decided to cut her sentence short. This is important for people in our area to know about because the parole board could decide to let the convicted killer out of prison at any time.

Ten O'clock, Apr 13, 2018, 10:11 AM, 1:30, Local:

A man in Exeter said someone crept on his property and stole his work truck. The truck contained valuable tools that cost thousands of dollars. The man said he also left his keys in the ignition. This is important to viewers because it's a good reminder to never leave anything visible in cars.

Ten O'clock, Apr 24, 2018, 10:01 PM, 1:01, Local: A Tulare County food bank was broken into and tools were stolen out of a shed. The shed was also ruined. The food bank used those tools to maintain a garden that grows fresh vegetables for families. This is important because this foodbank being broken into will affect many people who depend on it to provide their families with food.

Ten O'clock, Apr 26, 2018, 10:03 PM, :24, Local:

Four people in Visalia were pulled over for suspected drunk driving. They are facing multiple charges. Undercover officers saw them get behind the wheel and were ready to pull them over. This is important because driving intoxicated in any way can be very dangerous.

Ten O'clock, Apr 27, 2018, 10:07 PM, 1:30, Local:

Three women are in jail after attempting to rob a Family Dollar in Fresno. One woman is charged with felony assault on an officer, evading police, hit and run, and theft. Another was booked on theft charges, and the third was arrested for resisting arrest. This is important because theft happens too often in Fresno and it's important to always be on guard in public areas.

Ten O'clock, Apr 28, 2018, 10:00 PM, :26, Local:

Fire crews in Tulare found a home and a car on fire and uncovered a man's body in the debris. Detectives are trying to figure out how he died and they believe it's a suspicious death. This is important because a possible killer is still on the loose and could do the same thing to other people.

Ten O'clock, Apr 30, 2018, 10:02 PM, 1:05, Local:

A man stole a donation jar full of money out of a store in Merced that was intended for a family in need. The money was to help pay for funeral expenses for two little boys who died in a house fire. The man was not caught. This is important to viewers because the man is still out there and a family is without money to cover the boys' funeral expenses.

Ten O'clock, Apr 30, 2018, 10:05 PM, :37, Local:

Three men are facing charges for a series of robberies in Fresno. All three robberies occurred within a week at 5 different locations. This is important because viewers should know when criminals get caught by law enforcement.

Great Day, Apr 30, 2018, 6:04 AM, :33, Local:

Another gun is off the streets after police officer busted a man who tried to get away from them on a bicycle. It happened in Southwest Fresno Sunday night. This story is important for the community, especially to the people in Southwest Fresno who are potentially safer because a felon is no longer in possession of a gun.

Great Day, Apr 30, 2018, 5:02 AM, 1:00, Local:

Fresno police are looking for a shooter or shooters who killed a man overnight. The investigation is causing California Avenue to be closed at Fresno Street. This is important for people in our area to know about because this shooting happened near a school. That means the street closure will cause problems for commuters in the area, and parents should be aware of what's going on in and around their children's campus.

Ten O'clock, May 1, 2018, 10:05 PM, 1:57, Local:

A family is seeking justice after a man was killed in a hit and run. Police released video of the vehicle they think was involved and are looking for the public's help in identifying the owner of the vehicle. This is important to viewers because the man is still on the run and may harm others.

Ten O'clock, May 1, 2018, 10:07 PM, :33, Local:

Fresno Police conducted a big gang operation and dozens of gang members and firearms are off the streets in Fresno. More than 80 probation and parole searches were completed and five CrimeStoppers tips were followed up on. This is important to viewers because it's nice to know that something is being done to make the city safer.

Great Day, May 2, 2018, 5:04 AM, :28, Local:

Dozens of gang members and guns are off the streets of Fresno thanks to a big gang operation that just ended. Fresno police say they worked with local, state, and federal partners to seize more than 30 guns, and put more than 70 people behind bars. The operation lasted more than three weeks. More than half of the people arrested during the operation are gang members. This is important for people in our area to know about because they should know how the local police force is keeping them safe.

Great Day, May 4, 2018, 5:01 AM, 1:00, Local:

Police are trying to figure out who killed a man at a Southeast Fresno gas station overnight. Eastbound Belmont is closed for the investigation. This is important for people in our area to know about because a killer is on the loose. They also need to be aware of the road closure because it could affect their commute.

Great Day, May 7, 2018, 5:03 AM, :30, Local:

A Visalia teacher is in Tulare County Jail right, facing molestation charges. 22-year-old Andrew Ontiveros is a teacher at Sycamore Valley Academy. Deputies say he made inappropriate contact with a student both in person and over social media. His bail is set at \$275,000. This is an important story for people in our area because parents need to know what is going on in valley schools so they can make sure their children are safe.

Midday, May 7, 2018, 11:33 AM, :20, Local:

A man is under arrest after a road rage fight near Highway 168 and Ashlan in Fresno. Police say the man pointed a gun at another person during the dispute. The other person backed off and called police. Officers say they arrested a man at Wolters Elementary School. He is facing charges for pulling a gun on someone in a fit of road rage. This story is important for viewers not only because of the danger, but because the original dispute between the men blocked traffic while police investigated.

Ten O'clock, May 8, 2018, 10:10 PM, :31, Local:

The Central California SPCA was broken into around four in the morning and the burglar stole a donation box. They say that the damages are going to cost them \$1,900 but they do not know how much was stolen from the box. This is important because animal shelters like this depend a lot on donations to be able to properly take care of their animals.

Ten O'clock, May 13, 2018, 10:02 PM, :22, Local:

A Fresno teen was arrested for making a criminal threat targeting his former high school, Central High. He threatened to blow up a prom event but claimed that it was only a joke. This is important because people need to realize how serious these threats are taken, even if they are just a "joke", they will get in trouble for it.

Great Day, May 14, 2018, 5:03 AM, :45, Local:

Police are looking for the people responsible for shootings in Southeast Fresno. People in two cars shot at a home near Madison and Chestnut, hitting one man in the back. That man is recovering after surgery. The other shooting happened hours later near Willow and Kings Canyon. Police say someone in that area told them people were driving around shooting guns into the air. The shootings are not believed to be related. This is important for people in our area to know about because information that they may be able to provide could get the shooters off the streets before someone else gets hurt or killed.

Ten O'clock, May 15, 2018, 10:07 PM, :50, Local:

A man in Clovis was caught on-camera, stealing cameras from people's front porches. Police say that crooks will steal the cameras and try to resell them. They are hoping that some of the footage will help catch him. This is important because the cameras will help the police catch this person and hopefully stop him from stealing more.

Great Day, May 16, 2018, 5:04 AM, 01:00, Local:

Police are looking for a burglar who stole Ring doorbell cameras from five homes in Southeast Clovis. Officers say the thief used a crowbar to pry the doorbells off the walls. He was caught on camera during the theft. This is important for people in our area to know about because a lot of them have these security cameras, and it's important for them to know that someone is going around stealing them.

Ten O'clock, May 21, 2018, 10:18 PM, :21, Local:

The Merced County Sheriff's Office busted an illegal pot grow in Merced. They confiscated more than 150 pounds of dried and processed marijuana and nearly 3,500 plants. This is important because marijuana has been legalized in California but this size of growing operation is illegal.

Ten O'clock, May 26, 2018, 10:01 PM, :35, Local:

Two accused burglars are behind bars. They broke into a construction company but were caught on live surveillance. Police saw them running from the scene and apprehended them. This is important because the business owner's surveillance footage helped police catch the burglars. Surveillance cameras can help businesses stay safe.

Ten O'clock, May 29, 2018, 10:02 PM, 1:45, Local:

After a series of gang arrests, Fresno Police released the names of those who were arrested. Three of those named in the report claim that they had nothing to do with it and were not arrested. Fresno Police later sent a statement saying that those who were included in the group photo at the press conference were related to the "Fresneck" gang and some of them were not necessarily arrested. This is important because the public needs to know when gang members are arrested.

Ten O'clock, May 29, 2018, 10:05 PM, 1:20, Local:

A woman had her motorcycle helmet stolen off her motorcycle outside Table Mountain Casino. The helmet was a tribute to the woman's daughter who was killed in a bicycle race in 2011. Surveillance footage caught the person who stole the helmet and the helmet was returned to her. This is important because surveillance footage helped authorities track down the thief and it is also important for people to learn to not leave their belongings out in the open in or on their vehicles.

Great Day, May 29, 2018, 8:00 AM, :26, Local:

Fresno police are looking for people involved in a hit and run crash in central Fresno. The crash happened around 2:30 this morning near Belmont and First. Police say that's where a car hit two other parked cars before slamming into a transmission shop. Investigators say a man who was driving the car ran from the scene. They say a woman who was a passenger also ran after grabbing a child from the car. This story is important for viewers, especially those in the area who are asked to be on the lookout for the people involved in this crash.

Ten O'clock, May 31, 2018, 10:01 PM, 1:36, Local:

Surveillance video caught someone in a truck stealing a Fresno couple's dog from their car in a Walmart parking lot. The dog was scheduled to undergo surgery on his jaw on Monday. The owner of the dog just wants the dog back, no questions asked. This is important to viewers because nothing should be left in plain sight in their cars, even pets. Anything can and will be stolen.

Ten O'clock, Jun 1, 2018, 10:03 PM, :29, Local:

A man accused of murder is wanted by the Tulare County Sheriff's Office. Investigators say two men got into a fight and the victim was shot to death. The Sheriff's office obtained a description of the suspect's van. This is important because the suspect is still at large and a lot of people may be in danger while he is still on the run.

Ten O'clock, Jun 5, 2018, 10:09 PM, 1:26, Local:

A family is seeking justice after a hit-and-run driver critically injured its loved one. The man was hit as he was crossing the street trying to help someone stuck on the side of the road. This is important to viewers because the hit-and-run driver is still on the loose and the public's help could lead to an arrest and bring closure to the family.

Midday, Jun 11, 2018, 11:35 AM, :40, Local:

One man is under arrest, but another is still on the loose after an early morning robbery in southeast Fresno. Police say an officer pulled into the 7-11 parking lot at Clovis and Belmont just after 1:00 a.m. That's when police say a man ran out of the store wearing a mask and carrying a gun. They say he hopped into a waiting car and took off. Officers say the thieves crashed into a tree near Peach and Belmont. Joseph Archuleta is under arrest, but the other person in the car ran away. Officers are still looking for him. Police say he took money and a purse at gunpoint. No one is hurt and the purse was later found. This story is important for viewers who may live in the area where an armed man running from police, because they could be in danger.

Great Day, Jun 12, 2018, 5:03 AM, :34, Local:

One person is still on the loose this morning in connection to an armed robbery that happened early Monday morning. Police say an officer pulled into a parking lot just as a man was exiting a convenience store while wearing a mask and carrying a gun. That man then got into a waiting car, and sped off. The resulting chase ended when that car hit a tree. One person is under arrest, but police are still looking for the other. This is important to people in our area because there is a potentially dangerous person on the loose right, and they should know to be aware of their surroundings and call police if they know anything about this armed robbery.

Great Day, Jun 18, 2018, 5:04 AM, :50, Local:

The hunt is on for a killer, after a young man was shot and killed near Shaw and Sixth Street in Fresno. Officers say the man was shot several times near that intersection, in the parking lot of a nearby business. Anyone with information about the deadly shooting is asked to call Crime Stoppers. This is an important story for people in our area because the information they have could help police find a killer and bring him in before someone else is hurt.

Great Day, Jun 28, 2018, 5:06 AM, :26, Local:

Crime stoppers is offering an increased reward to figure out who shot a Fresno teenager. The 17-year-old was shot late Sunday night in the old Fig Garden neighborhood. Another \$2,000 is added to the reward for information that leads to an arrest. That brings the total up to \$3,000. This is important to people in our area because the reward could encourage someone to come forward with information that leads to the shooter's capture. Getting the shooter off the street is a big priority for police because they want to catch him before he hurts someone else.

Highway 41 southbound to 180 is back open after it was shut down for more than five hours, including through the morning commute. The CHP blocked off the section after finding a body in a car parked on the shoulder around 5:30 this morning. Officers also blocked off a parking lot below the during the investigation. This story is important to share because it informs people why there was a major and unexpected road closure during one of the busiest times of the day.

Great Day, Apr 6, 2018, 9:00 AM, :19, Local:

Yosemite Valley will close to visitors starting today at 5:00 p.m. due to the incoming storm. Park officials say they expect a lot of rain and possibly flooding. That is what happened last year when the Merced River overflowed. All reservations for this evening are canceled along with reservations for tomorrow evening as well. This is important information for everyone planning to visit Yosemite National Park.

Ten O'clock, Apr 12, 2018, 10:02 PM, 1:48, Local:

A local family was displaced due to a fire that started in the attic of their home. The fire is believed to have been started by the heating system in the home. Five kids and two adults are displaced due to this fire. This is important because people should know what to do and how to keep themselves safe in this kind of situation.

Ten O'clock, Apr 16, 2018, 10:09 PM, :25, Local:

A driver lost control of their vehicle and crashed into a Fresno canal. Wet roads and speed were the reported cause of the crash. After the driver landed in the canal, people that witnessed the crash jumped in to save the driver. This is important because people need to know how dangerous it can be to drive too fast while the roads are wet from rain.

Golden Valley High School went on lockdown today after reports of an active shooter on the campus. The reports turned out to be fake but school officials and police treated the situation very seriously. An unauthorized person may have gotten ahold of a school administration portable radio. Two big rigs crashed on the northbound 99 in Tulare County. One truck ripped a hole in the other spilling "Halo" tangerines all over the freeway. This is important because the 99 has been rated one of the most dangerous freeways so people need to be aware of their surroundings to keep everyone safe.

A Fresno man was sentenced to 18 months in prison today for shining a laser at a Fresno Police helicopter. Ten O'clock, May 14, 2018, 10:08 PM, 2:07, Local:

A massive search is underway for an 18-year-old who was swept away by the San Joaquin River. Water was released from a dam up the river from where his group was. When the water began to rise he jumped in to save a member of his group. He was swept away and has not been seen since. This is important because as the temperatures begin to rise more people will be in the rivers and they need to be aware of the dangers and how to keep themselves safe during the summer.

More than 8,500 people still don't have power right. The impact of the crash brought down live power lines and sparked a small grass fire. It also lets people know what area to avoid as crews worked to repair the power lines and snuff out the grass fire.

Great Day, May 18, 2018, 5:04 AM, :33, Local:

The CHP is reminding everyone to be careful while driving on rural roads. This comes after a couple died in a crash in Fresno County. Investigators say the couple pulled in front of a big rig at an intersection. The CHP says drivers should always double check who has a stop sign and who doesn't to keep crashes like this from happening. This is important for people to hear because it reminds them about an important driving safety tip.

Great Day, May 21, 2018, 5:08 AM, :25, Local:

Part of Freeway 99 will be closed overnight for the next week, for high speed rail construction. The closure will happen on the Northbound side of the 99 at Cedar tonight from 11:00 p.m. to 4:00 a.m. The Southbound side will close for the next several nights at the same time. The closures can be avoided by using North Avenue and Parkway Drive. This is important for people to know about because it could cause problems for their commute. That means Shaw avenue between Highway 168 and Woodrow will be bumper – to – bumper. This story is important for people who commute down Shaw avenue, especially close to rush hour, as Shaw is a heavily traveled street.

Great Day, May 23, 2018, 5:05 AM, 1:10, Local:

Starting today, the Fresno Police Department says extra officers will be patrolling Fresno with the goal of boosting safety for people walking or riding bikes. The increased effort is part of the bike and pedestrian safety enforcement operation. This is important for people in our area to know about because they should be aware of the increased police presence. The story also acts as a reminder to stay safe on the roads.

Two women are recovering after they were rescued from a tree in the middle of the Kings River. Rescue crews say they got to the women quickly because those women told them exactly where they were. Crews are using this as an opportunity to remind people to be aware of their surroundings, to prevent this from happening again. They also say everyone should make sure to wear a life jacket anytime they're near our valley water ways.

Fresno police are surrounding a home in Southeast Fresno. Traffic is shut down near Fordham and Dayton.
