ISU Scan Tech	October 4, 2011	9pm, 10pm	:02:30	A research company known as Scan Tech will now be housed on the campus of Idaho State University. They will be producing the technology to see what is inside large shipping containers. We take a look at why they're using ISU's facilities.
Idaho Redistricting	October 5, 2011	5:30pm, 9pm, 10pm	:00:30	The second group responsible for redistricting the legislative boundaries for the state, have started to get to work. We take a look at how this effects each community.
Storm Power	October 6, 2011	5:30pm, 9pm, 10pm	:01:30	Idaho Falls Power crews were working hard to get power restored to the city after an early snow storm brought tree branches down onto power lines. We talked with those who were without power.

District 91 Changes	October 26, 2011	9pm, 10pm	:00:45	The first public meeting held in Idaho Falls School District 91, discussed several major changes that could be coming to its secondary schools. Many students may be attending a new school if proposal goes through.
Post Office Changes	October 27, 2011	5:30pm, 9pm, 10pm	:02:30	With the United States Postal Service trying to cut back, this could mean changes to the ways all eastern Idahoans get their mail. We took a look at what local people thought of the changes.

Aberdeen Simplot Closure	November 9, 2011	5:30pm, 9pm, 10pm	:02:00	Simplot has announced the closure of multiple plants across Idaho, including the one in Aberdeen. This means 800 people will be out of a job.

D91 Changes Approved	November 15, 2011	5:30pm, 9pm, 10pm	:02:00	Next September, Idaho Falls will be home to one of just 85 "new tech" schools. The district board unanimously voted in favor of creating the magnet high school, which brings changes to all students in the district.
