	PRIMER IMPACTO	12/9/2016	4:00	3:29	Breast thermography is the use of digital infrared imaging based on the principle that metabolic activity and vascular circulation in both pre-cancerous tissue and the area surrounding a developing breast cancer is almost always higher than in normal breast tissue. This process frequently results in an increase in regional surface temperatures of the breast. Dii uses ultra-sensitive medical infrared cameras and sophisticated computers to detect analyze, and produce high-resolution images of these temperature variations, the benefit of breast thermography is that it offers the opportunity of earlier detection of breast disease than has been possible through breast self-examination, doctor examination or mammography alone. Thermography can detect the subtle physiologic changes that accompany breast pathology, whether it is cancer, fibrocystic disease, an infection or a vascular disease. Doctors can then plan accordingly and lay out a careful program to further diagnose and /or monitor you during and after any treatment.

Although NALEO had already predicted that 13.1 million Hispanics will go to the polls -of a universe of 27.3 million ELIGIBLE people, NALEO executive director Arturo Vargas said at a news conference that, to date, 16.2 million have been enumerated. It is a historical figure, compared to the 11.2 million Latinos voted in 2012, and that year was an increase of 15% over 2008.

On Thursday, Reps. Zoe Lofgren (D-Calif.), Lucille Roybal-Allard (D-Calif.) and Luis Gutiérrez (D-Ill.) asked Obama to issue pardons to Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals recipients, many of whom fear they could soon be under threat of deportation from President-elect Donald Trump. The request is a long shot. Obama created the program for so-called Dreamers using executive authority, and there's nothing to stop Trump from taking it away using the same powers. DACA recipients who obtained a work permit under the program fear they would be under increased threat from the incoming administration, especially since it would have access to their personal information — though Trump has said he would focus on deporting convicted criminals.

The final rule also establishes a new fee for the Form I-924A EB-5 Annual Certification of Regional Center, creates a three-level fee structure for naturalization applications (Form N-400), and revises regulatory provisions addressing dishonored payments and unpaid biometric services fees

National Steak and Poultry has recalled 1,976,089 pounds of poultry because the product is labeled "ready-to-eat" but may have been under-cooked, and thus is at risk of containing dangerous bacteria.

The Lightning Slides were sold by independent distributors over the last 16 years. They are made of stainless steel and the welds on the slides can crack and separate. A child's finger can get caught in the space. He company said it is aware of 13 incidents of broken welds and two children who have suffered finger amputations. Consumers were advised to stop using the recalled slides. They were sold to parks, schools and municipalities for between \$1,500 through \$4,000.
	DESPIERTA AMERICA	12/13/2016	6:00	:25	Cuisinart and the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission are recalling about 8 million food processor blades in America after receiving reports from consumers of broken blade pieces in their processed food. Conair, the maker of the Cuisinart food processors, received 69 reports of consumers finding broken pieces of a "riveted blade" in their processed food, including 30 reports of mouth lacerations or tooth injuries, a CPSC press release explained Tuesday. The blades in question have four rivets, are silver-colored stainless steel and have a beige plastic center hub. Both the CPSC and Cuisinart note, however, that only food processors with four rivets in the blades are included in this recall. The recall affects 22 models made in China that were sold between July 1996 and December 2015, at a price point between \$100 and \$350 when purchased.
