NOTICE CONCERNING COMMUNITY SERVICE PROGRAMMING

The Federal Communications Commission requires non commercial radio stations to report, on a quarterly basis, the programming it has aired to address the needs and issues confronting the community it is licensed to serve.

The attached document lists and describes the programming aired during the second quarter of 2019. WFNP-FM may transmit it's programming, in compliance with its time share contract with WRHV Poughkeepsie, only during the months of February, March, April, September, October and November. WFNP Nightly News: April 2019

Monday April 1st 2019

MIDHUDSON- WESTTOWN – A man who shot his neighbor's three boxer dogs to death last week was justified as they were attacking him after they killed several of his chickens, the humane law enforcement officer of the Hudson Valley SPCA said Sunday.

MIDHUDSON- POUGHKEEPSIE – Four residents of a City of Poughkeepsie apartment building were displaced by fire Sunday night. Firefighters responded to the scene at 465 Maple Street to find the fire started in one of four units and was spreading. The fire was quickly brought under control by the firefighters.

Tuesday 4/2/19

MIDHUDSON- NEWBURGH – Some two dozen residents of the greater New Paltz area hand-delivered a petition signed by about 1,000 people urging Immigration and Customs Enforcement to release Luis Martinez.

CARMEL – A 17-year-old Ohio boy has been arrested on 73 counts of delinquency filed in Mahoning County for allegedly making fake emergency calls to several locations around the nation including in Putnam County.

Wednesday 4/3/19

MIDHUDSON MONTICELLO – The Sullivan County Welfare Fraud Task Force has nabbed a woman wanted in the states of Pennsylvania and South Carolina.

MIDHUDSON GOSHEN – The number of confirmed measles cases in Orange County has risen to 15, up from the previously recorded 12 cases in 2018-19.

Thursday 4/4/19

MIDHUDSON KINGSTON – The Ulster County Legislature is set to vote April 16 on the county takeover of the City of Kingston's Citibus service.

MIDHUDSON- ORANGE- DA Hoovler said his office decided to review the complaints against the district because the State Education Department, which had been apprised of the situation, took no action. There are already behind the scenes rumblings that some school board members may call for Padilla's resignation because of the improper activities documented in the report.

Friday 4/5/19

MIDHUDSON- NEWBURGH – State Senator James Skoufis (D, Woodbury) plans to talk to officials of the Newburgh Enlarged City School District to learn what they are going to do about the grand jury report that outlines fudging student athletes' attendance records so they can continue to play.

CATSKILL – A Town of Catskill man was sentenced in Greene County Court on Thursday to 35 years to life in prison for killing a former Woodstock man and burying him in the crawlspace under his bedroom.

Monday 4/8/19

MIDHUDSON-STUYVESANT – The Columbia County Sheriff's Office is investigating the discovery of skeletal remains. At about 1p.m. on Sunday, the sheriff's office received a call from an individual who was doing excavation work on private property in the Town of Stuyvesant.

MIDHUDSON MIDDLETOWN – Attending the senior prom is a rite of passage for many high school students, but for many, prom clothes are just too expensive. Temple Sinai in Middletown is donating gently used dresses.

Tuesday 4/9/19

MIDHUDSON NEWBURGH – The City of Newburgh has joined the ranks of local municipalities including Middletown, Poughkeepsie and Kingston to adopt legislation to offer municipal IDs to undocumented, as well as all other residents.

MIDHUDSON MIDDLETOWN – Following the revelation that former Middletown Fire Lt. Paul Smith was conducting drug dealings with motorcycle gang members inside the Central Firehouse, the city has begun to impose security measures.

Wednesday 4/10/19

MIDHUDSON GOSHEN – A Montgomery Town Police officer, who headed up a large scale shoplifting operation, pled guilty in Orange County Court on Thursday.

MIDHUDSON MIDDLETOWN – Middletown Alderman James Kitson Friday made it official – he is running for mayor of the city on the Republican ticket. City Republican committee has endorsed him.

Thursday 4/11/19

MIDHUDSON KINGSTON – Retired Marine Sgt. Eddie Ryan, wounded and disabled during an enemy sniper attack in 2005 while serving in Iraq, visited the Ulster County law Enforcement Center in Kingston Thursday, to be honored by county officials, and deputized by Sheriff Juan Figueroa.

MIDHUDSON, HUDSON VALLEY – At a time when Rockland County is attempting to get a grip on the measles epidemic and efforts to convince unvaccinated residents to get the MMR shots, new cases of the virus have been confirmed in adjacent counties.

Friday 4/12/19

MIDHUDSON NEWBURGH – City Police in Newburgh are investigating two cases of shots fired overnight. No one was injured in either incident and police do not believe they were related. 17 y/o charged with criminal possession of a weapon

MIDHUDSON KINGSTON: More detail on Eddie Ryan, marine honoree.

Monday 4/15/19

MIDHUDSON NEWBURGH – Due to an equipment malfunction at a hangar at New York Stewart International Airport on Saturday, firefighting foam was released from a hangar into the environment. Newburgh city officials were notified of the leakage on Sunday by airport representatives who said the foam has made its way into surface water including Silver Stream.

MIDHUDSON POUGHKEEPSIE - Poughkeepsie City Councilman Christopher Petsas held a neighborhood meeting on Sunday to provide residents with information about an HBO production filming this week in the Mt. Carmel area of the city. "I Know This Much Is True" starring Mark Ruffalo will be filming in the neighborhood beginning on Tuesday.

Tuesday 4/16/19

MIDHUDSON POUGHKEEPSIE – Dutchess County Executive Marcus Molinaro has vetoed the county legislature's resolution to expand business hours of liquor stores. Had he signed it, the measure would have given the operators the option to remain open later.

MIDHUDSON SWAN LAKE – Weiss Dairy Farm, near Swan Lake, is the largest of its kind in previously dairy-rich Sullivan County. The county once had 200 dairy farms. That was 50 years ago. The number is down to 16. Owner Dave Weiss said the dwindling competition isn't improving the economics for him.

"Last year I lost. I had a loss on the farm here, after doing my taxes this year of \$53,000."

Wednesday 4/17/19

MIDHUDSON YONKERS – The 12-year-old boy, who accidentally shot himself in the head while in his family's Yonkers home just before midnight on Saturday, April 13, has died. Yonkers Police identified the youth as Nyran Plummer, a resident of Nepperhan Avenue and a student in the Yonkers public schools.

MIDHUDSON GOSHEN – The State Department of Environmental Conservation fined Legoland New York in the Town of Goshen \$238,000 for repeated violations of state environmental law through the unpermitted discharge of turbid water from its site to the Otter Kill. Attorney Michael Sussman conveyed the news of the fine.

Thursday 4/18/19

MIDHUDSON, GOSHEN – Orange County Executive Steven Neuhaus broke new ground on Wednesday evening when he delivered his annual State of the County address live from the Middle East. Neuhaus is a lieutenant commander in the Naval Reserve.

MIDHUDSON, NEW CITY – Judith Clark, who was sentenced to 75 years to life in state prison for her role in the Brinks armored car holdup in Rockland County in 1981 that left two police officers and a security guard dead, has been granted parole by the state parole board.

Friday 4/19/19

MIDHUDSON OSSINING/HUDSON RIVER – Environmental group American Rivers named the Hudson River among America's Most Endangered Rivers® of 2019. The Hudson received the No. 2 spot on the list of 10.

The report cites what it calls "the grave threat that potential construction of storm surge barriers could pose to this rich tidal estuary."

MIDHUDSON, WHITE PLAINS - As the nation marks National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week, County Executive George Latimer is recognizing the dispatchers who work for the county's Departments of Public Safety and Emergency Services for the professionalism and skill they bring to their jobs every day.

Monday 4/22/19

MIDHUDSON STATE NEWS Governor Cuomo is signing the single-use plastic bag ban into law today. In a late morning event in Suffolk County, he signed the measure that takes effect next year and requires shoppers to bring reusable bags for their groceries or other purchases.

Tuesday 4/23/19

MIDHUDSON- GARDINER – First responders rescued a Long Land man on Sunday afternoon after he slipped and fell some 45 feet into a crevasse near Gertrude's Nose in Minnewaska State Park Preserve.

EMS personnel responded around 3 p.m. and extricated the 55-year-old man.

GOSHEN – MIDHUDSON A New Windsor woman was arrested by an Orange County District Attorney's investigator and charged with two counts of grand larceny and eight counts of falsifying business records.

Felony complaints filed in Newburgh Town Justice Court allege Kelley Zamenick, 43, was committee chairwoman for both a Boy Scout Troup and a Cub Scout Pack that were sponsored by the Gardnertown United Methodist Church and that between 2016 and 2018 she embezzled over \$10,465 from the Boy Scout Troop and over \$3,040 from the Cub Scout Pack.

Thursday 4/25/19

NEW WINDSOR – An Empire Award, the State Senate's highest honor, was presented on Wednesday to Nina Baldassare for her work in honoring the memory of her son and offering a place of comfort to active duty and veterans of the armed forces.

MIDHUDSON ENVIRONMENTAL NEWS- WOODSTOCK – Residents and visitors to the Town of Woodstock are being asked to "rethink disposables."

The town board has become the first municipality in the Hudson Valley to reduce multiple single-use plastic items along with single-use chopsticks and paper coffee cups.

Friday 4/26/19

NYC/MTA NEWS- The Metropolitan Transportation Authority is launching a new initiative that will generate clean, emission free, solar electricity with the installation of rooftop solar panels. A request for proposals was issued on Earth Day for development of seven MTA

properties including two on the Metro-North Railroad system with an estimated 6.5 megawatts of emissions-free electricity to be produced.

MIDHUDSON POUGHKEEPSIE- City cops are back walking the beat in Poughkeepsie. Mayor Robert Rolison and Police Chief Thomas Pape said the officers will address quality of life concerns in and around the Main Street corridor.

Monday 4/29/19

MIDHUDSON WASHINGTON (ANTONIO DELGADO STATEMENT) – This past weekend’s attack on a San Diego area synagogue that resulted in the murder of a female parishioner and the wounding of three others including a rabbi is further proof that the nation needs to “ramp back the language”... Antonio Delgado

Mid-Hudson POUGHKEEPSIE - Despite overcast skies and sporadic rain, several hundred people turned out on the Walkway Over the Hudson Sunday to raise awareness for Parkinson’s disease and the need for a cure. The ninth annual walk was organized by the Parkinson’s Disease Support Group of the Mid-Hudson Valley.

Tuesday 4/30/19

MIDHUDSON PORT JERVIS – Work has begun in earnest to construction a new bridge over the Neversink River in the City of Port Jervis with the demolition of the existing 1922-vintage structure dropped into the water below on Monday.

MIDHUDSON WATKINS GLEN/WOODSTOCK – The Woodstock 50 music festival planned for Watkins Glen International in Watkins Glen may be cancelled, but then again, it may not be. Officials of Schuyler County and investors said the event is off, but the promoters said that is not the case, that it is still on as planned. Michael Lang, the promoter of the original Woodstock Music Festival in Bethel, had planned the Watkins Glen event, while officials of Bethel Woods were planning their own version of the weekend from August 16 through August 18.
