NOTICE CONCERNING COMMUNITY SERVICE PROGRAMMING

The Federal Communications Commission requires non commercial radio stations to report, on a quarterly basis, the programming it has aired to address the needs and issues confronting the community it is licensed to serve.

The attached document lists and describes the programming aired during the third quarter of 2023. WFNP-FM may transmit its programming, in compliance with its time share contract with WRHV, only during the months of February, March, April, September, October and November.
