Agriculture Challenges	Montana Ag Live – “Montana Weed Control Association”	3/21 3/28	6pm 11am	56 mins	Currently, Montana has well over 7 million acres infested with state-listed noxious weeds, and there’s several new and potentially devastating invaders encroaching our borders. Certainly, noxious weeds compete with production ag crops, but that’s just the beginning. Noxious weeds can live on land and in water; they can be vines, woody shrubs or trees. No matter their size or growing habitat, noxious weeds can increase soil erosion, adversely affecting water quality, and all fish, birds and wildlife. Noxious weeds can be a nuisance, but they can also poison pets and livestock, impede growth of all kinds of desirable plants, as well as decreasing property values and agriculture profits, and they have a detrimental effect on land and stream access. Weed seeds are transported by wind and water, but also by unwitting humans, their vehicles and pets, and by transporting contaminated animal feed and manure. Becky Kington, Executive Director of the Montana Weed Control Association joins the panel to take a look at the Association’s role in helping to control Montana's ever increasing noxious weed issues.

Steve Lehenbauer, First Vice-President of the Montana Nursery & Landscape Association, is the guest on this week's show. Some of the questions to be addressed: What are the recommended best practices for selecting the best trees and shrubs for your property? Is it OK to order plants and seeds on-line? What should you consider in a new or redesigned landscape plan? Sprinklers, fencing, pest control, safety and security, making sustainable and eco-friendly choices are also discussed, in addition to this thriving industry and the ever-increasing job opportunities it's providing for Montanans.

They honor their ancestors by fighting to preserve what has been left behind. So much has already been taken from this country's native people. We cannot let looters take what little remains. The Pomo are descended from some of the earliest inhabitants of North America. Preserving their past is preserving our future.
