Most of these products have been produced in Montana for years. There's well-known production practices and established markets for lots of these commodities. But what happens when a grower wants to try a new specialty crop that they haven't produced before? Or perhaps a grower wants to integrate vertically, not only growing the raw commodity, but also producing consumer products made from the commodity. Christy Clark, Interim Director, Montana Department of Ag, will join us to discuss their role in helping develop new commodities, products and markets, and their subsequent economic utilization. Through their efforts, Montana has developed one of the most diverse agricultural economies in the mountain west.

Native American /Education	Stories from Montana’s Future #104	10/7 10/10 10/11	7pm 10am 2am	26 mins	"The Way Our Voices Sound" features music videos from Fort Peck Indian Reservation students, and a film from Fort Belknap Indian Reservation students. They are the result of a partnership between the CHANTE Project, public schools, and MAPS Media Institute to bring professional media arts instruction to students across the state of Montana. The three music videos - "I Am" (Frazer High School), "Why" (Wolf Point High School featuring Supaman's song "Why?"), and Brockton High School's "I Am a Warrior", weave culturally significant music with spoken voice to create dialogue around identity, the importance of community, overcoming challenges, and the impact the acknowledgment of heritage and history have in all aspects of life. In the film "Waking the Generations", Harlem High School students shine a light on the painful and hidden details of their ancestral past as a way to help others understand why their heritage should never be allowed to fade away. Filmed during Native American Week in 2019, this socially relevant film connects how cultural identification today not only honors the past but also has the ability to save and preserve an entire way of life for future generations.
