



The issues listed below were address by WBAL-AM programming during the first quarter of 2016:

1. **Business** – Discussions about the battles between online shopping websites and brick-and-mortar companies. Also discussion on Chiptole's E-Coli scare and recovery from their reputation damage
2. **Commitment 2016** – Extensive discussion and interviews centered on the candidates running in the 2016 Presidential Race and the local candidates for Mayoral and Senate races. Discussion about the Republican and Democratic Debates that took place and feedback on the candidate's performance. Primaries were also heavily talked about.
3. **Community** – Discussion about how various communities in Baltimore City are doing nine months after the city riots occurred. Features and coverage of Maryland Special Olympics Polar Bear Plunge, Snowstorm Jonas and Light City Baltimore Festival.
4. **Crime** – Discussion about crimes around Baltimore such as domestic violence, drunk driving, bullying and the in murder rates in Baltimore City. Also discussion of two Harford County Sherriffs and community mourning. Also discussion about crimes that occurred around the country like: Uber driver shooting in Kalamazoo, the assault on a high school student in Baltimore City by a school police officer, the militia occupancy/stand-off in Oregon.
5. **Economics** – Discussions about the job numbers, fluctuation of stocks, the largest Powerball jackpot in history and Under Armour's proposal to Baltimore City for hundreds of millions of dollars in tax credits for its future headquarters
6. **Education** – Discussion about the plans for air-conditioning to be installed in many Baltimore County schools and the President of Mount St. Mary's University stepping down amid comments of students. Also discussion about standardized testing and funding for Baltimore City Public Schools and Universities.
7. **Environment** – Discussion about the Flint, Michigan water crisis and climate change
8. **Ethics** – Extensive coverage and discussion about race and gender relations such as hate speeches on campuses, transgender rights, sexualization and diversity within Hollywood.
9. **Foreign Relations** – Extensive discussion about the global refugee crisis, foreign policy in the Middle East and President Obama's visit to Cuba
10. **Government** – Extensive discussion about the legislative session within Maryland, national topics such as assisted suicide and immigration. Also discussion on the President's focus on gun control.
11. **Health** – Discussion about the Zika Virus and the legalization of marijuana
12. **Judicial** – Extensive coverage and discussion about the first trial of the officers in the Freddie Gray Case. Maryland's highest court ordered Officer William Porter to testify at the trials of the other five officers accused in the death of Freddie Gray. Also extensive coverage of the death of Justice Anotnin Scalia and the political tension between the President and Republican Senators on choosing his replacement in an election year.
13. **Law Enforcement** – Extensive discussion about the ongoing concerns of police brutality and misconduct in Baltimore City. Discussion about how the Baltimore City Police Commissioner is dealing with the backlash from the public on misconduct by police officers.
14. **Politics** – Discussion about various national and local political topics centered on the candidates running for President and Senate and the local candidates running for the Mayoral seat. Also, discussions of political tension during Maryland's legislation period.
15. **Pop Culture** – Discussion about various topics in the media such as: the death of David Bowie, Alan Rickman, Glenn Frye
16. **Safety & Security** – Discussion about gun control, panic buttons in schools, bike helmets, and lead poison control.

17. **Sports** – Discussion about the beginning of the Ravens season and following them through the difficult year of many injuries and game losses. Discussion about the Super Bowl, extending Ravens quarterback Joe Flacco's contract and signing new players. Also, discussion on resigning Orioles First Baseman Chris Davis.
18. **Technology** – Discussion about Apple's resistance to the FBI to unlock an iPhone for that belonged to the San Bernardino terrorists.
19. **Terrorism** – Extensive discussion and coverage of the terrorist attacks in Brussels, the Middle East and Africa. U.S. foreign policies towards the fight against ISIS were also heavily discussed.
20. **Transportation** – Discussion about gas prices and also transportation and infrastructure legislation in Maryland.
