Section I. Issues

The station has identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. COVID 19 Pandemic:** The United States continues to navigate the world during the COVID Era, and Wyoming is no different. We interviewed officials ranging from local doctors to the state public health officer. As the return to classes loomed for Wyoming's schools and the state's only 4-year university, education officials came on programming. Also had business leaders and experts join our programming to talk about the impacts of COVID-19 on business.
- B. Statewide Political Climate:** While Wyoming is one of the most consistently red states in the country, the August primaries saw several established Republican lawmakers lose their elections. Those losses included state legislators who held leadership positions in the state capitol in Cheyenne. We interviewed party officials and others who are in Wyoming's political trenches to get an idea of why that is happening.
- C. Major Wyoming Land Sale:** One of the more controversial topics in Wyoming — Governor Mark Gordon proposed that the state purchase 1 million acres of land along with the mineral rights to another 4 million. As Wyoming wrestles with declining revenue from the extraction industry (see below), this was a contentious issue in the Cowboy State this summer. Guests on our programs included experts on both sides of the issue to explain a complicated deal to Wyomingites.
- D. Wyoming Wrestles with Budget Cuts/Wyoming Energy:** Wyoming has already cut its budget by 10% — and more are coming. This is due to the state's reliance on the extraction industries, which took severe hits as demand for electricity and gasoline plummeted amid the pandemic. Programming included airing Governor Mark Gordon's addresses to the state's citizens. We also had guests on our shows to distill the situation to listeners.
- E. National Issues/Local Perspective:** Although it happened on the last week of the quarter, Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg's passing became a huge issue with Wyoming's representatives in Washington, D.C. That included US Senator John Barrasso taking a stance on appointing a new justice before the 2020 presidential election. Additional programming included soundbites from Wyoming's delegation taking the floor of their respective chambers in Washington to discuss the day's issues.
