WMAG-WMKS-WPTI-WTQR-WVBZ provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- American Cancer Society: Tracey Smith of American Cancer Society talked about the upcoming events to raise money for the American Cancer society in North Carolina.
- Danger of the Zika Virus: Mosquitoes & the Zika Virus. How to prevent infection. What are the consequences if you contract the virus. What to do of you are traveling overseas into a Zika virus area.
- EFNAP program for teaching nutrition: EFNAP Food Program. How to buy store and prepare healthy and nutritious food for your family.
- Fall Gardening: Fall vegetables can be grown by direct seed into the garden, by transplants (broccoli, brussel sprouts), or by starts (onions). Vegetables that are easy to grow from seed include beets, carrots, collards, kale, kohlrabi, lettuce, mustard, radish, spinach and turnips. Seeds should be planted deeper in the fall, when moisture level is lower in the soil. Planting depth may be one-and-a-half or two times as deep as for spring planting the same crop. Make sure the seeds you purchase were produced for the current gardening year; the seed packet is stamped with the year it was packaged. Old seeds bought at bargain prices or left over from previous years can be problematic. In many cases, only a few of the seeds will germinate and emerge through the soil and the seedlings may be weak and grow slowly.

- Statistics on Preventing Teen Pregnancy: Guilford County has celebrated a gradual decline in the number of teen pregnancies since 1989. In 2007, Guilford County (tm)s teen pregnancy rate for ages 10-19 years of age was 31.7 per 1,000 females, down from 66.6 per 1,000 in 1989. A total of 1,036 teens between the ages of 10-19 became pregnant in 2007.
- Tattoos and your health: The Guilford County Environmental Health Division enforces the North Carolina State Rules Governing Tattooing. The regulations require that all practicing tattoo artists, this includes permanent make-up artists, in Guilford County complete an application, pay an annual fee of \$500.00 and pass an inspection prior to a permit issuance. Anyone interested in receiving a tattoo should verify that the artist has a current permit posted in their place of business. Artists are encouraged to have a current Blood Borne Pathogen Certificate. Body piercers in Guilford County are required to complete an application with the Environmental Health Department, adhere to The Guilford County Board of Health Body Piercing Regulations, and post required signage.
- Trips for Cancer Patients: Devon Hodges Memory Bound Foundation provides life changing and memorable trips and events for cancer patients and their families. The trips and events help the cancer patients and families forget their problems for just a little while. It also helps the cancer patients to be able to be inspired which can help them in their treatment.
