- Leadership training for young people: FirstGen 4-H Leaders-in-Training is an exciting leadership opportunity for teens from families that are new to 4-H who would like to make a difference in the 4-H program and their communities. The role of this training is to be a bridge between being a 4-H member and being a 4-H leader in a club and the community. - Local Extension Programs for NC: Karen Neill the director of extension programs in Guilford county talked about the importance of extension programs to the county citizens. How the extension programs came about and how they have changed with the times.
